HISTORICAL NOTE

Canadian Templarism dates from 1782, when an encampment (later, preceptory) is known to have existed in Halifax, Nova Scotia. In 1800, a second Templar warrant was issued under the authority of Craft Lodge No. 6 at Kingston, Upper Canada. Neither of these lodges flourished, however, and the continuous history of the movement should actually be dated from 7 October 1855, when Captain William James Bury McLeod Moore (fl. 1831-d. 1890) of the 69th Regiment, an ardent freemason, exchanged the dormant Craft Lodge warrant for a new warrant to establish the Provincial Grand Conclave at Kingston, Canada West, under the name of Hugh de Payens. On 11 May 1868, the Provincial Grand Conclave's name was formally changed to the Grand Priory of Canada. At the Annual Meeting of the Grand Priory on 7 July 1884, the organization became a Supreme and Independent body under the title of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada, Knights Templar.

The object of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada is to promote Christian ideals. Membership is restricted to Royal Arch Masons (York Rite) who declare themselves to be Christians and who are willing to submit to and obey the usages, customs and statutes of the Order.

PROVENANCE

Acquired in 1987 from the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada, through the courtesy of its Grand Historian, Mr. Rolf Latté of Ottawa, Ontario, and subsequently added to in 1988-1990. In 1989, material relating to Gondemar Preceptory No. 16/ Raymond Dupuis Priory Brockville, Ontario, was acquired together with other Brockville masonic material. In 1993, the Brockville Templar records were separated from the rest of the Brockville masonic material (which is catalogued in MG 28, I 483) and added to this fonds as volumes 5-9.

TRANSFERS

A number of Templar and other masonic medals, insignia, etc., were transferred in 1987 to the Visual and Sound Archives Division. Various annual proceedings, statutes, by-laws, rituals, and histories were transferred in 1988 and 1994 to the Library of the National Archives of Canada. These printed items were transferred again to the National Library of Canada in 1998. Several photographs (including a number of large group photographs of annual assemblies of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada) were transferred to the Visual and Sound Archives Division in 1994. Information on the transferred items is available in Finding Aid No. 1725.

The Sovereign Great Priory deposited artifacts and uniforms with the Museum of Civilization, Hull, Quebec.

FINDING AID

Finding Aid No. 1725 provides a brief historical introduction to the collection; a categorically arranged descriptive list of the whole fonds (which provides the file and box numbers for material in the Manuscript Division); and separate lists of the medals and insignia transferred to the Visual and Sound Archives Division in 1987, the printed material transferred to the National Library of Canada in 1998, and the photographs and audio-visual material transferred to the Visual and Sound Archives Division in 1994.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The records of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada are a miscellaneous collection of material pertaining to the Sovereign Great Priory itself, its Districts and Preceptories, together with a few items of more general masonic miscellanea. They include records of the Sovereign Great Priory itself, consisting mainly of rituals, 1852-1921; histories of Templarism in Canada, *ca.* 1905-1966; and some proclamations, reports, copies of photographs, etc., relating to its annual assemblies, [n.d.], 1932-1987. Also, a few district records consisting of minutes, 1908-1969, for the Kingston-Ottawa District, and a history, 1984, of the London District. The greater part of the fonds consists of preceptory records, which include substantial records for preceptories in Brockville, Ont., 1872-1972, and Ottawa, Ont., 1893-1971, as well as a number of preceptory histories and a few other items - such as a ritual, 1867-

1868, and by-laws, 1922 and 1969 - pertaining to various preceptories in British Columbia, Manitoba, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Ontario (the majority), Quebec, and Saskatchewan.

Miscellaneous records relating to the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada, which consist of rituals, 1852, 1863-1866, 1879, 1921 (files 24-26 and 54), as well as two musical rituals, 1938 and 1955, and a *Canadian Templar Drill and Tactics* (Montreal: 1906), all three of which were transferred to the National Library of Canada; two histories, *ca.* 1905 and 1966, of Knight Templary in Canada (files 52-53); one letter, 1934, appointing the V.E. Kt. N.B. MacPhie as Grand Almoner (file 51); proclamations, reports, etc., relating to the Annual Assemblies of 1961 and 1987 (files 47-48); and photocopies of photographs (which were transferred in 1994 to the Visual and Sound Archives Division) relating to the Annual Assemblies of [n.d.], 1932, 1934, 1936, 1939, 1955, and 1987 (files 46 and 49).

The Sovereign Great Priory of Canada's *Annual Proceedings*, 1884-1996, and *Statutes*, 1920, 1942, 1945, 1964 and 1969, were transferred in 1998 to the National Library of Canada, and a number of its medals, insignia, etc., 1913-1914, were transferred in 1987 to the Visual and Sound Archives Division, in addition to the photographs mentioned above, which were transferred to the same Division in 1994.

District Records. Original, 1908-1969, 1984, 0.034 m. (Vol. 1)

Minutes of the **Kingston-Ottawa District**, **Ont.**, 1908-1969 (files 1-2); and a report on the history of the **London District**, **Ont.**, entitled, "Templary Masonry - The First Hundred Years", made to the Rt. Em. Kt. Reg. Forest-Jones, Grand Historian, 25 January 1984, by Provincial Grand Prior Allan A. Leal, K.C.T. (file 3).

Two jewels, 1950 and 1956, which belonged to J.E.R. Ross and C.R. Flatters (Past Provincial Grand Priors of the **Kingston-Ottawa District** in 1949-1950 and 1955-1956 respectively), were transferred in 1987 to the Visual and Sound Archives Division. "Freemasonry in the Province of Quebec," by William Henry Whyte of the **Montreal District**, *ca.* 1917, was transferred in 1998 to the National Library of Canada.

<u>Preceptory Records.</u> Original, 1867-1989, 0.928 m. Photocopies, 1896, 1926-1988, 0.006 m. Print, 1908-1988, 0.040 m. (Vols. 1-10)

Included in the fonds are substantial records for Gondemar Preceptory No. 16/Raymond Dupuis Priory, **Brockville, Ont.** These comprise minutes, 1884-1972 (files 31-37); membership records, 1872-1941 (files 38-41 and 44); financial records, 1877-1941 (42-43 and 45); and a history of the preceptory, *ca.* 1987 (file 21). Another history, 1972, was transferred to the National Library of Canada in 1998, and an enamel-gilt badge, n.d., was transferred to the Visual and Sound Archives Division in 1987.

Also substantial are the records for **Ottawa** Preceptory No. 32, which comprise minutes, 1894-1971 (files 4-16); membership records, 1893-1915, 1922 (files 4, 19); by-laws, 1893-1965 (files 4, 17); a photocopy of a mounted photograph (which was transferred in 1994 to the Visual and Sound Archives Division) of the warrant of constitution issued to the preceptory in 1896 to replace the warrant of 1893 that had been destroyed by fire; and three miscellaneous items, 1916-1936, which include one relating to a Special Assembly on 3 May 1916 (file 20). An undated enamel-gilt cross pendant relating to this preceptory was transferred in 1987 to the Visual and Sound Archives Division, together with a blank and undated badge and two past preceptor's collars and jewels pertaining to the Em. Kt. R.G. Madill, 1942, and to the V.E. Kt. Rev. Canon L.F. Crothers, 1956.

Also included are a number of miscellaneous items: historical notes (including excerpts from the minutes), 1926-1987, pertaining to Bethlehem Preceptory No. 69, **Nanaimo, B.C.** (file 55); a centennial banquet programme, 1980, pertaining to King Edward Preceptory and Priory No. 24, **Winnipeg, Man.** (file 56); a bill for regalia, 1907, pertaining to Offanto Preceptory No. 40, **Owen Sound, Ont.**, with the grand historian's comment, 1989, upon it (file 61); a ritual, 1867, with annotations and a covering letter, 1868, from William James Bury McLeod Moore (d. 1890) (file 62), and by-laws, 1922 (file 63), both pertaining to Plantagenet Preceptory No. 8, **St. Catharines, Ont.**; and by-laws, 1969, pertaining to William de la More the Martyr Preceptory No. 25, **Quebec, Que.** (file 66).

In addition, there are several preceptory histories, for preceptories in **Bridgetown**, **N.S.**, 1930 (file 23); **Halifax**, **N.S.**, *ca.* 1982 (file 57); **Belleville, Ont.**, 1961 (file 58); **Guelph, Ont.**, *ca.* 1969 (file 59); **Hamilton, Ont.**, 1964 (file 60); **Toronto, Ont.**, *ca.* 1954 and *ca.* 1979 (file 64); and **Regina, Sask.**, 1988 (file 67). Other preceptory histories that were transferred in 1998 to the National Library of Canada pertain to preceptories in **Moncton, N.B.**, *ca.* 1979; **Belleville, Ont.**, *ca.* 1956; **Oshawa, Ont.**, 1972; **St. Catharines, Ont.**, 1966; and **Montreal, Que.** (for both Richard Coeur de Lion No. 7, 1963, and Melita No. 63, 1970).

Medals and insignia transferred in 1987 to the Visual and Sound Archives Division include items pertaining to preceptories in Calgary, Alta., n.d.; Cornwall, Ont., n.d.; Picton, Ont., n.d.; and Sherbrooke, Que., n.d. In 1994, a number of photographs, n.d. and 1988, that relate to Melita Preceptory No. 63, Montreal, Que., were also transferred to the Visual and Sound Archives Division.

Miscellaneous Records. Photocopies, 1926, 1989, 0.005 m. Print, 1903-1925, 0.010 m. (Vols. 4, 10)

Among the miscellaneous material in the fonds are two items of Templar miscellanea: a photocopy of *An Essay on the Knights of St. John of Jerusalem, Rhodes and Malta*, by the Very Eminent Knight John H. Chalmers of Malta (Toronto: Macoomb Press, 1926) (file 30); and a photocopy of a photograph, 1989, of the presentation of a 50 years pin to Rt. Em. Kt. H.W. Clarke of Melita Preceptory No. 63 in Des Moines, Washington State, U.S.A. (file 68). In addition, there are three items of general masonic miscellanea: by-laws, 1903, of Eddy Lodge No. 41 (file 27); by-laws, 1915, of Carleton Chapter No. 16 of Royal Arch Masons, Grand Registry of Canada in the Province of Ontario (file 28); and an invitation, 1925, from the Montreal Unit of the Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children (file 29).

Miscellaneous medals and insignia transferred in 1987 to the Visual and Sound Archives Division included three undated miniature Knight Templar jewels mounted together and an enamel-gilt item, 1907, pertaining to the Damascus Commandery K.T. 5, in Newark, New Jersey, U.S.A. Also included were 10 other items, n.d., 1949, *ca.* 1962, and *ca.* 1966, of general masonic miscellanea, including three pertaining to the Grand Lodge and chapters of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons in Ontario; six pertaining to freemasons of the Scottish Rite; and one to a Royal Arch chapter in East Syracuse, New York, U.S.A.

INTRODUCTION

Historical Background

The Order of Templars (in full, the Poor Knights of Christ and of the Temple of Solomon) was instituted by Hugh de Payens and Geoffrey St. Aldemar, in 1119 at the time of the Crusades, to protect pilgrims to the Holy Places from marauding Muslim bands. The Order took its name from the quarters originally assigned to it in the palace of King Baldwin II of Jerusalem, built on the site of the former Jewish Temple of Solomon. From its inception, the Order used a secret formulary of initiation for its members.

The Order of Hospitallers (the Sovereign and Military Order of the Knights Hospitallers of St. John of Jerusalem) was a similar but distinct religio-military order of crusading times, founded in 1118 by Raymond du Puis to succour sick pilgrims in Jerusalem. As the Muslims gradually ousted the Christians from the Middle East, the headquarters of this Order were moved successively to Cyprus, Rhodes and eventually, in 1530, to the Island of Malta.

Although the Knights Templar and the Knights Hospitaller were never united, modern masonic templarism traces its traditions to both orders and the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada includes both the Orders of Malta and of the Temple in its official title. Further information on the subject may be found both in this collection and in the masonic papers of A.J.B. Milbourne (MG 24, L 15).

Masonic Templarism in Canada

The early history of masonic Templarism in Canada is obscure, because of the paucity of historical records. An encampment (later, preceptory) is known to have existed at Halifax in 1782, and a Templar warrant was issued in 1800 under the authority of Craft Lodge No. 6 at Kingston, Upper Canada, but neither of these lodges flourished. It is only with the establishment of a Provincial Grand Conclave at Kingston, Canada West, 7 October 1855, that records which have survived began to be kept.

The resurrection of the Canadian Templarist movement was the work of Captain William James Bury McLeod Moore (*fl.* 1831-d. 1890) of the 69th Regiment, an ardent freemason who exchanged the dormant Craft Lodge warrant for a new warrant that created a provincial conclave under the name of Hugh de Payens. On 11 May 1868, the name was formally changed to the Grand Priory of Canada. Then, at the Annual Meeting of the Grand Priory on 7 July 1884, the organization became a Supreme and Independent body under the title of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada, Knights Templar.

The object of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada is to promote Christian ideals. Membership is restricted to Royal Arch Masons (York Rite) who declare that they are Christians and will submit to and obey the usages, customs and statutes of the Order. All meetings and initiation rites are considered secret.

Further information on the history of the Sovereign Great Priory is found in J. Ross Robertson's *History of the Knights Templars of Canada* (Toronto: Hunter, Rose and Company, 1890) in the National Library of Canada.

Organization

The Sovereign Great Priory is subdivided into Districts and Preceptories. Each preceptory would send a representative to the yearly meetings of the District. From the minutes of the Kingston-Ottawa District, 1908 to 1969, that are available in this collection (in Volume 1, files 1 and 2), it would appear that the Districts played a vital role in ensuring the nomination of members to the Council of the Grand Priory.

The Records

The records in the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada fonds derive mainly from the Kingston-Ottawa District, which consisted of seven local preceptories: Hugh de Payens No. 1 of Kingston; King Baldwin No. 6 of Belleville; Moore No. 13 of Peterborough; Gondemar No. 16 of (Maitland at first, then later) Brockville; Ottawa No.32; Cornwall No. 47; and St. George No. 52 of Picton. The Moore No. 13 Preceptory was transferred to the Toronto District in 1922.

The bulk of the material in the fonds is from Gondemar Preceptory No. 16/Raymond Dupuis Priory, Brockville, 1871-1972, *ca.* 1987 (Volume 5, File 31 to Volume 9, file 45). Gondemar Preceptory No. 16/Raymond Dupuis Priory was instituted and organized at the village of Maitland, Grenville County, on 6 March 1872, by Captain William James Bury McLeod Moore (*fl.* 1831-d.1890), who at that time was Grand Prior of the Order for the Dominion of Canada and the Island of Newfoundland under the Banner of the Sovereign Grand Conclave of England and Wales, and the dependencies of the British Crown. The preceptory was officially moved to Brockville in April 1885. A manuscript copy of the brief history of the preceptory by H.F. Warren (1987) is provided in Volume 4, file 21 of the fonds, while a printed copy of *Gondemar Preceptory No.* 16 K.T. (1872 - 1972) is held by the National Library of Canada. An undated badge pertaining to the preceptory is available in the Visual and Sound Archives Division.

Also substantial are the records, 1894-1971, from Ottawa Preceptory No. 32 (Volume 1, file 4 to Volume 4, file 20 as well as the insignia, n.d., 1942, 1956, in the Visual and Sound Archives Division). Ottawa Preceptory No. 32 was formed on 18 July 1893. On 18 October 1893, by-laws for the new preceptory were instituted. Meetings were held monthly, except during the summer months of July and August. A list of the Charter members of the Ottawa Preceptory is provided in its first record book (Volume 1, file 4). A biographical sketch of each applicant for inception into Preceptory No. 32 is noted in the minutes of the organization. The sketches also give the names, ages, occupations, places of residence, lodge activities and names of the two nominators.

The other preceptories in the Kingston-Ottawa District are only minimally represented in the fonds. King Baldwin No. 6 of Belleville is represented by a history, *ca.* 1956, in the National Library of Canada, and by another, *ca.* 1961, in Volume 10, file 58; while both Cornwall No. 47 and St. George No. 52 of Picton are represented only by undated badges in the Visual and Sound Archives Division.

Although the records concentrate so heavily on the Kingston-Ottawa District of the organization, it should not be forgotten that the Sovereign Great Priory is in fact national in its scope and that its preceptories are spread across Canada. Some of these have made small contributions to the records:

Alberta

A badge pertaining to Cyprus Preceptory No. 33, Calgary (available in the Visual and Sound Archives Division)

British Columbia

Copies of historical notes (including photocopied excerpts from the minutes) pertaining to Bethlehem Preceptory No. 69, Nanaimo (Volume 10, file 55)

Manitoba

Historical notes on King Edward Preceptory and Priory No. 24, Winnipeg (Volume 10, file 56)

New Brunswick

A history of Ivanhoe Preceptory No. 36, Moncton (available in the National Library of Canada)

Nova Scotia

Histories of Champlain Preceptory No. 71, Bridgetown (Volume 4, file 23) and Antiquity Preceptory No. 5, Halifax (Volume 10, file 57)

Ontario

In addition to the material from the Ottawa-Kingston District and its preceptories mentioned above, there are historical accounts of Victoria Preceptory No. 10, Guelph (Volume 10, file 59), Godfrey de Bouillon Preceptory No. 3, Hamilton (Volume 10, file 60) and St. John the Almoner Preceptory No.15, Oshawa (in the National Library of Canada); a bill for regalia, 1907, for Offanto Preceptory No. 40, Owen Sound (Volume 10, file 61); a ritual, 1867, and by-laws, 1922, for Plantagenet Preceptory No. 8, St. Catharines (Volume 10, files 62-63), as well as a centennial history, 1966 (in the National Library of Canada); and histories, 1954 and ca. 1979, for Geoffrey de St. Aldemar Preceptory No. 2, Toronto (Volume 10, file 64).

Quebec

Historical accounts of both Richard Coeur de Lion Preceptory No. 7 and Melita Preceptory No. 63, Montreal, together with a history of "Freemasonry in the Province of Quebec", *ca.* 1917, by William Henry Whyte, who was one of the active knights of Melita Preceptory No. 63 (in the National Library of Canada); by-laws, 1969, of William de la More the Martyr Preceptory and Priory No. 25, Quebec (Volume 10, file 66); and a badge, 1967, of Sussex Preceptory No. 9, Sherbrooke (available in the Visual and Sound Archives).

Saskatchewan

A collection of addresses by Rt. Em Kt. Wilbur H. Randell for Wascana Preceptory No. 51, Regina (Volume 10, file 67).

Arrangement of the Records

Since additional material is periodically added to the records, their arrangement on the shelf is essentially miscellaneous. A categorically arranged list of the records has therefore been prepared to present the material in a logically intelligible order. This accounts for the erratic sequence of volume and file numbers in the list that follows.
