INTRODUCTION

The files in the George Price fonds are arranged in reverse chronological order starting in 1991 and finishing in 1968. Within each file, the documents follow the same pattern with the earliest at the back of the file and the latest in front of the file.

Before donating his documents to the National Archives in 1991, Mr. Price identified the date and the subject of many of his papers with red or black marker annotations. He also drew up a chronological list of the major events or issues covered by his radio reports within each file. This detailed list was used to create the finding aid and should be very useful to researchers. A copy of the original subject list can be found in volume 1, file 1, of the fonds.

A black-and-white photograph of George Price at his broadcast station was transferred to the Documentary Art and Photography Division.
