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## INTRODUCTION

R525 Fraser, Alistair Graeme (1923-1997). Clerk of the House of Commons.

Alistair Fraser fonds  
Original, 1953-1979, 4.1 m. Finding Aid 2144.

Born in Toronto on January 5th, 1923, Alistair Fraser was the eldest son of Jane Ross and Hon. Alistair Fraser, Lieutenant-Governor of Nova Scotia from 1952 to 1958. In 1942, he interrupted his university education (McGill University, Montreal) to serve in the Royal Canadian Artillery until the end of the War. After finishing his studies at McGill University in Montreal in 1947, he studied law at the University of British-Columbia (Vancouver) and was called to the bar in 1951.

After practising law in Vancouver and Prince Rupert, Fraser first entered public life in 1949 when he became a special assistant to the Minister of National Defence for a short period. In 1952 he was named Executive Assistant to James Sinclair, the Minister of Fisheries, remaining with the Department of Fisheries until 1957. In 1957, Alistair Fraser ran unsuccessfully for parliament against Major-General George Pearkes, V.C (British Columbia). In 1958, Fraser became Executive Assistant to Ross MacDonald, the Leader of the Opposition in the Senate, and Fraser was part of Lester Pearson's team when the Liberal Party was in opposition.

With the return of the Pearson Government in 1963, Alistair Fraser became Executive Assistant to the Senior Minister for the Atlantic Provinces and Minister of Transport, Hon. J. W. Pickersgill. Fraser ran again unsuccessfully for parliament in 1965 in Pictou County (Nova Scotia).

Alistair Fraser was appointed Clerk Assistant of the House of Commons in January 1966 and Clerk in August 1967, when Leon-J. Raymond retired. During his career as Clerk of the House of Commons from 1967 to 1979, Alistair Fraser was prominent in the creation and administration of the Parliamentary Internships Programme following contacts between the Canadian Political Science Association (CPSA) and the House of Commons in 1968. During his career, he supervised the successful installation of television covering of the proceedings in the House of Commons, modernized the page system and directed improvements in interpretation and translation systems of the House of Commons. After his retirement, Fraser was consultant for various committees.

The Alistair Fraser fonds documents Fraser's political activities with the Liberal Party and his subsequent career as Assistant Clerk and Clerk of the House of Commons. These records are Fraser's personal "political" papers, generated and stored by Fraser in his office. They document day to day life on Parliament Hill, the political process, legislative procedure, and Fraser's private interests, family and social life.

Fraser kept and interfiled three basic types of correspondence with his papers: personal, political and party oriented. Personal correspondence to family and friends provides comments and descriptions of daily activities both on and off Parliament Hill. It also includes thank you notes and invitations to numerous Ottawa social events. Political correspondence provides information on parliamentary business, administration and lobbying efforts. Party correspondence documents the organization and policy decisions of the Liberal Party. As a whole, the correspondence offers valuable insights into the workings of power politics in Canada.

Fraser's original filing system of correspondence and subject files has been maintained in the arrangement of the fonds. As a result of this arrangement, letters to or from the same correspondent and on the same topic may be found in several different files. Fraser continued to add more recent documents to his older files, significantly extending their date range.

Records relating to Alistair Fraser's involvement with the Liberal Party of Canada. Original, 1953-1979, 1.32 m (Vol. 1-6).

This series documents Fraser's active involvement with the Liberal Party of Canada between 1953 and 1965, including his two attempts to be elected to the House of Commons. Although there are few records relating to Fraser's first campaign in Esquimalt-Saanich, B.C., the series does contain extensive documentation about his second electoral campaign in Pictou, N.S. The series also includes records created and kept by Fraser during his political appointments to various Liberal ministers. These records include correspondence with such well known political figures as Judy LaMarsh, Paul Hellyer, Jack Pickersgill, Arthur Laing, James Sinclair and Allan MacEachen. They cover a broad range of topics including Liberal Party policy, the CBC, divorce, immigration, adoption, taxation and the passage of bills through the House of Commons and the Senate.

Records kept by Fraser while Executive Assistant to James Sinclair, Minister of Fisheries. Original, 1953-1979, 0.07 m (Vol.1).

This subseries contains a wide variety of documentation, very little of it relating to Fraser's career as Executive Assistant to the Minister of Fisheries. The subseries includes a scrapbook of press clippings about Sinclair's trip to the Soviet Union in 1955 and a second scrapbook documenting Fraser's candidacy in 1957 federal election. There are subject files on the St. Lawrence Seaway, an oyster farm owned by Fraser's aunt, as well as material relating Liberal Party activities in British Columbia, Nova Scotia and Ontario. The correspondence files include family correspondence and memorabilia, a few letters pertaining to his 1957 election campaign and other political matters. Fraser continued to add letters to these correspondence files throughout his career.

Records kept by Fraser while Executive Assistant to Ross MacDonald, Leader of the Opposition in the Senate. Original, 1959-1963, 0.59 m (Vol. 1-3).

This subseries consists primarily of correspondence files with copies of letters sent by Fraser in reply to queries received by the Leader of the Opposition to the Senate. Correspondence covers such topics as Liberal Party policy, Senate reform, divorce, taxation and other issues lobbied in the Senate. Letters were organized by Fraser into general, personal, author and subject classifications. This arrangement has been maintained. Some material filed here by Fraser pertains to his career as Executive Assistant to J.W. Pickersgill.

Records kept by Alistair Fraser while Executive Assistant to J.W. Pickersgill. Original, 1958-1965, 0.33 m (Vol. 4-5).

The subseries consists of correspondence, memoranda and subject files which document Fraser's role as coordinator of Pickersgill's activities as Secretary of State and Minister of Transportation. The correspondence was arranged by Fraser into three categories: personal, general and confidential. This system has been maintained. Memoranda consist largely of circumspect notes to Pickersgill on matters pertaining to ministerial concerns. Subject files pertain primarily to transportation issues of the day. The subseries also includes correspondence and files relating to Fraser's personal life.

Documents relating to Alistair Fraser's candidacy in the 1965 federal election, Pictou, N.S. Original, 1961-1966, 0.33 m (Vol. 5-6).

This subseries illustrates the many activities of a candidate during an election campaign. It contains Liberal Party documents with instructions on campaign organization, speech writing, fundraising, radio and TV advertising, and the Party program. Only material annotated by Alistair Fraser has been retained. Fraser also kept subject files about the political,

economic and demographic conditions in the Pictou area, as well as files on local election issues and newspaper clippings on the national and regional media coverage of the election. Finally, the sub-series includes thank you letters from Fraser to his supporters which document the election results and Fraser's defeat.

Records relating to the House of Commons. Original, 1956-1979, 2.78 m (Vol. 7-19).

This series pertains to Alistair Fraser's career in the House of Commons, first as Assistant-Clerk and then as Clerk of the House of Commons. It contains two subseries both of which contain correspondence files and subject files arranged alphabetically by Fraser. The correspondence files contain a mix of personal and parliamentary business matters, while the subject files reflect the duties and concerns of the Clerk and Assistant Clerk positions. A third subseries illustrates Fraser's activities through photographs and scrapbooks. Subjects addressed in the series include parliamentary reform and procedure, personnel matters, House of Commons administrative issues and Fraser's involvement with the International Parliamentary Committee.

Records of the Assistant Clerk of the House of Commons. Original, 1956-1968, 0.99 m (Vol. 7-11).

The subseries consists of correspondence, clipping and subject files about daily activities in the House of Commons. The subject files provided Fraser with the reference information he required to fulfill his duties as Assistant Clerk. These files document the work of various parliamentary committees, House of Commons procedure, questions and other administrative issues.

Records of the Clerk of the House of Commons. Original, 1967-1979, 1.79 m (Vol. 11-19).

This subseries documents Fraser's principal activities as Clerk of the House of Commons for the twelve years he held that office. The records include correspondence, photographs, speeches and subject files relating to various topics such as the Parliamentary Internship Program, and matters relating to House of Commons administration and social life. In general, this sub-series illustrates the different facets of Fraser's involvement with parliamentary life: his role as Canada's representative to Commonwealth Parliamentary Conferences; his management and mentoring of interns in the Parliamentary Internship Program, and his speeches about Parliament's function prepared for a variety of audiences. This sub-series also provides a "behind the scenes" view of the human side of parliamentary activities.

Photographs depicting Fraser's personal and professional activities. Original, c195 b&w and colour photographs, 4 postcards.

Most of the photographs in this subseries depict Fraser's formal duties as Assistant Clerk and Clerk of the House of Commons. The photographs show Fraser welcoming foreign delegations to Canada, attending Commonwealth Parliamentary conferences in Canada and abroad, and supervising the signing of the register as new MP's entered the House of Commons. There are some portraits of political figures, and two photographic scrapbooks documenting the unveiling the historical plaque to Joseph Desbarres and Sir John Bourinot in Nova Scotia, 1971. The subseries includes many personal photographs as well as photos sent to Fraser by friends and fellow politicians.
