Biographical Sketch

Richard J. Joy was born in Montreal in 1924. Joy received his early education at Lower Canada College. Following his graduation from the College in 1940, Joy continued his education at McGill University where he studied chemical engineering, receiving a Bachelor of Engineering degree in 1945. Further studies at Harvard University resulted in a Masters of Business Administration degree in 1947. Joy worked for the Dominion Linseed Oil company as a plant engineer from 1948 to 1951 and then for the Dominion Rubber Company as a chemical engineer from 1952 to 1960. He worked for the federal government with the Industrial Development Bank and the Department of Regional and Industrial Expansion between the 1960s and the 1980s.

During the 1960s Joy became interested in minority languages and bilingualism in Canada and the study of demographics. He presented papers at academic conferences, including ACFAS (Association canadienne-française pour l'avancement de la science), and self-published his first book, *Languages in Conflict* in 1967. Primarily a demographic study, the book outlined the decline of the English language in Quebec and the decline of French in the rest of Canada since Confederation. Joy gradually earned the attention of the scholarly community and the media. A commercial press, McClelland and Stewart, reprinted *Languages in Conflict* in 1972 with an introduction by a leading sociologist. Joy's next book, *Canada's Official-Language Minorities*, was commissioned by the C.D. Howe Institute in 1978. His last book, *Canada's Official Languages: the Progress of Bilingualism*, was published by the University of Toronto Press in 1992. Joy's research provided fodder for both sides of the language debates in Quebec and Canada in the 1970s and 1980s. Although he participated actively in these discussions, he did not take a stand on one side or the other, preferring instead to argue from factual grounds and correct the misperceptions of others. Richard J. Joy died June 26, 1998 of Parkinson's disease.

Scope and Content

The fonds consists of textual records and photographs relating to the life, career, research and publications of Richard J. Joy. The fonds consists of four series: a Personal Material series, which contains information regarding Joy's education, early work as an engineer and personal life; a Correspondence series; a small series of Research Files; and

a Publications series containing information about the publication of Joy's three books in addition to his work on submissions to various Federal and Provincial Commissions and a collection of his academic papers.

General Note

The records were donated to the National Archives of Canada by Colette Joy of Ottawa, Ontario between October 1999 and June 2000.

Language Note

Approximately 65 percent of the fonds material is in English. The remaining 35 percent is in French. The French documents consist primarily of correspondence and newspaper clippings.

Series:

Personal Material (34 cm of textual records; 30 photographs; Containers 1-2)

The files of this series consist of textual records and photographs relating to the education, early career and personal life of Richard J. Joy. The material is organized into four blocks: education, early engineering projects, clubs and general; the education files constituting the largest of the four blocks. The files of this block consist primarily of information about Joy's education at McGill University and at the Harvard Business School. Of interest are the drafts, correspondence and final reports relating to third and fourth year engineering projects of 1943 and 1944. In the summer of 1943, Richard Joy was hired by Canadian National Railways to survey the Gaspé region of Quebec. The survey resulted in a detailed project paper entitled "Gaspésie: land of promise" - an appraisal of the economic potential of the region. Joy spent the following summer studying the Shawinigan Water and Power Company. The Harvard Business School files consist in the main of correspondence regarding Joy's application to the school, letters of reference and Joy's work as business manager of the *Harbus News*. Study material for university courses taken after Joy's retirement from the Civil Service are also included in this first block of files.

The second block of files document the early engineering career of Richard Joy, in particular his development of and applications for patent inventions under the auspices of his own company called "Better Mouse Traps UNC." Joy was awarded US patents for an indexing table (1954) and a mono-rail conveyor with disengageable drive (1956). Following a trip to Switzerland in the early 1950s, Joy became fascinated by the potential and feasibility of using a European developed *Gondolbahn* system in the Canadian Rockies. The Wallmannsberger system in which Joy took particular interest was later adopted for use at Sulphur Mountain, Banff. During the contract tender period for the Sulphur Mountain project, Joy offered his services as a Canadian liaison to the Swiss firm involved in the process. The third block of files relate to Joy's membership in and work for various social clubs including the Royal St. Lawrence Yacht Club, the Federated Newman Clubs of Canada, the McGill Liberal Club and the Tea and Conversation Club (McGill). The general block of files includes documents which relate to Joy's career in the Federal Public Service, medical information and cottage lots owned by the Joy family. The files in each block are arranged in chronological order.

Correspondence (28 cm of textual records; Containers 2-3)

The files of this series consist of the personal and business correspondence of Richard J. Joy. The documents of this series are organized into three blocks of files: a chronological block, an alphabetical nominal block and a letters to editors block. The files contain correspondence with individuals such as Eugene Forsey, Charles Castonguay and William Johnson. Some of the nominal files contain biographical information about the correspondent in addition to research

notes, abstracts of telephone conversations and letter drafts. Of significance are the several files containing Joy's correspondence with the editors of periodicals such as *Le Devoir* (Claude Ryan), *The Globe and Mail*, *Macleans*, *The Ottawa Citizen* and *The Ottawa Journal*. A file of the printed versions of Joy's letters to the various editors is also found in this series. The content of the correspondence files document Joy's interest and knowledge of Canadian minority language issues and demographic trends, particularly in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec. Some correspondence can also be found in the Personal Material, Research Files and Publications series of this fonds.

Research Files (25 cm of textual records; Containers 3-4)

The files of this series constitute a selection of the research and general interest subject files maintained by Richard J. Joy throughout his life. Arranged alphabetically by title, the files contain a combination of correspondence, notes, abstracts, essays and clippings. The content of these files focuses mainly on minority language issues. The largest set of files in this series pertain to the Quebec election of 1960. The election files contain clippings, pamphlets, correspondence and other materials relating to the Liberal Party's campaign activities in the riding of Chambly, just south of Montreal. During the election, Joy worked for the Liberal campaign office of the Chambly riding. Other topics covered by the files in this series include the Deschênes trial, minority language trials (i.e. Allan Singer - Montreal), the Gendron Commission (Maheu reports), Franco-Americans, separate schools and Federal Investment Review Agency (FIRA).

Publications (55 cm of textual records; Containers 5-7)

The files in this series consist of documents relating to the publications, conference papers and Commission Brief submissions of Richard J. Joy. The files are organized into two blocks: a books block and a papers and briefs block. The drafts, correspondence and receipts relating to self-publication of Joy's book, *Languages in Conflict* constitute the largest percentage of the Books records. The book evolved from a paper given at the ACFAS (Association canadienne-française pour l'avancement de la science) conference of 1962 and a Brief submitted to the Commission on Bilingualism and Biculturalism of André Laurendeau and Davidson Dunton. Correspondence files from 1965-1967 document Joy's unsuccessful attempts to have the book published by Toronto University Press and Exposition Press Inc. of New York and to have the project sponsored by the Canadian Centennial Commission Publications Program. Undeterred Joy eventually published the book himself with the help of Ronalds-Federated Ltd. of Montreal. Several files of correspondence and receipts and a ledger book document how Joy marketed and disseminated the work to Canadian governmental agencies, politicians and individuals and academics across Canada, in the US and overseas. Information regarding the second printing of the book by McClelland and Stewart can also be found in this block of files. Joy's next book, *Canada's Official-Language Minorities* was commissioned by the C.D. Howe Institute in 1978. Two drafts and a file of correspondence document the development of this project. His last book, *Canada's Official Languages: the Progress of Bilingualism*, was published by the University of Toronto Press in 1992. Documents pertaining to Joy's last book include two drafts and a small file of reviews.

The papers and briefs block of files document Joy's continuing work in and active contribution to the study of language and bilingualism issues and linguistic demographics in Canada. Included in this block of files are drafts and papers which were presented at academic conferences, such as ACFAS (Association canadienne-française pour l'avancement de la science), or published in periodicals such as the *American Review of Canadian Studies*. Also included are drafts and final texts for briefs submitted to various governmental Commissions, such as the Royal Commission on Bilingualism and Biculturalism, La Commission sur l'enquête sur la situation de la langue française et sur les droits linguistiques au Québec (Gendron Commission) and the Ministerial Commission on French-Language Secondary Education (Symons Commission).
