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Mary Agnes Craig McGeachy **Biographical sketch**

Of Scottish origin, Mary Craig McGeachy's great-grandfather, grandfather and father, Donald McGeachy, were all preachers. Her maternal grandfather came from Islay in Scotland and founded the village of Ailsa Craig in Ontario where her mother, Anna Jeanette Craig was born. Mary Agnes McGeachy added her mother's surname to her own. Mary Craig McGeachy was born in Sarnia, Ontario on 7 November 1901. She had a brother, Robert, a lieutenant with the Royal Canadian Engineers, and two sisters, Dr. Jessie McGeachy and Donalda McGeachy, a nurse.

She graduated from the University of Toronto in 1924 and studied at the Ontario College of Education for a year after which she served on the teaching staff of one of the high schools in Hamilton, Ontario from 1926 to 1928. In June 1928, she travelled to Europe to study European Student Relief, a plan for the maintenance of hostels for students and teachers to keep learning alive during the years of inflation, revolution and other problems. From June 1928 to May 1929, she was a representative of European Student Relief organizations at universities in France, Austria, Hungary, Czechoslovakia and Germany.

After postgraduate studies at the Sorbonne and the Graduate School of Higher International Studies, University of Geneva, she became a member of the Permanent Secretariat of the League of Nations in Geneva as a Canadian officer from 1929 to 1940. She was most concerned with the League's work in technical fields: economic and financial studies, public health, social welfare and the legal status of women and worked with the international committees on nutrition, child welfare and the legal status of women. In particular, she worked with the Liaison Committee of Women's International Organizations. In addition, she was in charge of contacts with Canada travelling three months every year across Canada. Her first speaking tour of Canada took place in 1930 and she addressed organized groups across Canada such as the Institute of International Affairs, various women's groups, Canadian Press, and education officials. During this time, she wrote in-depth articles about the activities of the Assembly of the League of Nations for *Interdependence*, the publication of the League of Nations Society in Canada as a means of informing Canadians about the work of the League and in the hope that Canadians would encourage the Canadian Government to support the League. Her first article appeared in September 1931.

In August 1940, she joined the British Ministry of Economic Warfare which had been established on 3 September 1939 for the purpose of restricting the enemy's capacity to conduct war. It established a blockade of Germany, restricting the flow of goods from and to it. In 1941, it secured an agreement with the United States of America on joint pre-emptive measures against both Japan and Germany. The Ministry was ultimately organized into two branches: the General Branch and the Enemy Branch and the Enemy Branch developed into a purely intelligence organization in 1942 obtaining information from enemy or neutral countries. The Ministry of Economic Warfare was represented in a number of foreign countries to accumulate information about suspect firms and individuals in those countries

but its representation in the United States of America by the War Trade Department in the British Embassy in Washington was by far the most important part of its overseas work before and after American entry into the war.

McGeachy was sent to Washington in December 1940 as a representative of the Ministry of Economic Warfare in the United States and Canada where she worked from the British Embassy as a Relations Officer for questions of economic warfare. In the course of her work she addressed a variety of organizations on topics associated with the dislocations caused by war as well as issues associated with German propaganda. She countered a pro-German campaign organized in the United States against the Allies, accused of starving women and children. In 1942, she took over questions of postwar relief preparations.

In October 1942, she was appointed first secretary of the British embassy in Washington becoming the first woman to attain British diplomatic status. Her work continued in economic warfare and public relations and she participated in meetings of the Inter-Allied Committee on Post-War Requirements as an expert on the status of women as well as on German policy in occupied countries. (The Inter-Allied Committee on Post-War Requirements came into existence in September 1941 to study essential requirements for postwar relief in terms of the medical supplies, foodstuffs, livestock and see grain needed by Occupied countries once liberated. For two years, the committee monitored the effects of the enemy's policy on the supply of essential medicines, food and materials in Europe. The results of its work were provided to UNRRA.)

In 1943, she was seconded to join the early planning group for the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA) and was appointed Director of the Welfare Division of UNRRA on 1 Feb. 1944. One of five divisions of UNRRA, the Welfare Division was responsible for the planning, supervision and organization of essential relief for distressed persons and dependent groups such as children, pregnant women and the aged in the liberated areas. Her work required her to travel to France, Belgium, Holland, Austria and Czechoslovakia setting up small UNRRA missions, along with Directors of the other Divisions, to administer supplies in each of the liberated countries.

Once the emergency period had ended, McGeachy wrote a report to the United Nations Temporary Social Commission and acted as the UNRRA representative at meetings of the Commission. She proposed that the long-term aspects of relief be transferred to the United Nations. After its creation in 1947, UNRRA transferred the long-term problems of social welfare to the UN Social Affairs Department since the purely "relief" period was judged as having been completed. McGeachy went to New York in December 1947 to do this.

She married Erwin Schuller on 21 December 1944 in St. Peter in the East Church, County Borough of Oxford. In 1946, the Schullers moved to Austria where Mary Schuller-McGeachy was a member of the Austrian UNRRA Mission. Subsequently, in 1948, the Schullers moved to Johannesburg, South Africa in connection with Erwin's work. There, she became a patron of the Child Welfare Society in Johannesburg between the years 1951 and

1954. While living in South Africa, Mr. and Mrs. Schuller adopted two children, a brother and sister whom they named Janet and John Erwin Schuller. The family left South Africa in 1954 returning to Canada. The Schullers lived variously in Toronto, Princeton and New York.

In May 1955, she was appointed a voluntary observer at the United Nations for the National Council of Women of Canada while living in Toronto. She worked closely with the International Council of Women voluntary group of UN observers. Subsequently, she was elected president of the International Council of Women, 26 June 1963, serving three terms of office. The title of Honorary President was conferred upon her at her retirement as president, 1973. Following her presidency, she served as the council's liaison officer at the United Nations in charge of the ICW's representation as a non-governmental organization in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council of the UN.

On 8 Nov. 1985, the Sovereign Military and Hospitaller Order of Saint John of Jerusalem, Knights of Malta, conferred the honour of "Dame of Honour and Merit" upon Mary Craig Schuller-McGeachy.

During her lifetime, Mary McGeachy held many organizational memberships including, for example: the South African National Council of Women, 1948-1954; chairman, Child Welfare Society, Johannesburg, South Africa, 1950-1954; Canadian National Council of Women, from 1955; the Royal Institute of International Affairs, London, from 1932; the South African Institute of International Affairs, 1948-1954; the Canadian Institute of International Affairs, from 1955; the Canadian Federation of University Women, from 1955, etc.

Throughout her life she was known by various names. Although her birth certificate identifies her as Mary Agnes McGeachy, born 7 November 1901, she dropped her second name replacing it with her mother's surname, Craig. Known variously as M.C. McGeachy, Mary Craig McGeachy and also as Craig McGeachy, she hyphenated her last name after her marriage, becoming Mary Craig Schuller-McGeachy or Mrs. Erwin Schuller. Various documents and published articles report her birth date as 1904 or later. She died on 2 November 1991 at Keene, New York.

Great Britain: Ministry of Economic Warfare

Established in September 1939 to perform functions similar to those of the Ministry of Blockade in World War I. Its aim was to disorganize the enemy's economy so as to prevent it from carrying on the war. Its activities included control of contraband, restriction of enemy supplies and making recommendations for aerial attack on targets most likely to affect the enemy's economy.

The Ministry of Economic Warfare was divided into two branches: General Branch and Enemy Branch. The Enemy Branch developed in 1942 into a purely intelligence organization, and in April 1944 it was transferred to the Foreign Office where it became the Economic Advisory Branch. The General Branch dealt with operational aspects of the Ministry's work.

The Ministry of Economic Warfare was wound up in 1945, its residual functions passing to the new Economic Warfare Department of the Foreign Office. Records of the Ministry including those of the major committees, are in FO 837. These records are subject only to the thirty year access rule.

Mary Craig McGeachy joined the Ministry in August 1940 and was sent to Washington in December 1940 to represent the Ministry of Economic Warfare in the United States and Canada.

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United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration

UNRAA was founded in 1943 during World War II to give aid to areas liberated from the Axis powers. There were, finally, 52 participating countries, each of which contributed funds amounting to 2% of its national income in 1943. A sum of nearly \$4 billion was expended on various types of emergency aid, including distribution of food and medicine and restoration of public services and of agriculture and industry. China, Czechoslovakia, Greece, Italy, Poland, the Ukrainian SSR, and Yugoslavia were the chief beneficiaries. UNRAA returned some 7 million displaced persons to their countries of origin and provided camps for about 1 million refugees unwilling to be repatriated. More than half the funds were provided by the United States, and the three directors general - Herbert H. Lehman, Fiorello La Guardia and Gen. Lowell Rooks - were American. UNRAA discontinued its operations in Europe on 30 June 1947. Its remaining work, chiefly in China, ended on 31 March 1949. The functions of UNRAA were transferred to other UN agencies.

The **Welfare Division** was set up to enable UNRRA to carry out Resolutions directing UNRRA to assist governments: to meet the special needs of vulnerable groups of the population, i.e., children, pregnant women and nursing mothers, aged persons, the physically handicapped, the homeless and those without resources; and, to restore and assist the functioning of social welfare institutions which have been destroyed during the war.

Mary Craig McGeachy was seconded to join its early planning group. She was appointed Director of the Welfare Division, one of five divisions of UNRRA.
