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MICROFILM

Lande with his Notes and Observations* (1977) and the documents in numerical order of collections preceded by the description prepared by the Manuscript Division. The Lande catalogue is available on reels H-1110, H-1460 and H-2281.

Please note that the inventory **title** is not always the same as that appearing in the printed catalogue, since in some cases it has been modified to conform to the Manuscript Division's title rules. The **number** assigned to each collection, however, remains the same as that given in the Lande catalogue.

Jose de Ortega (1700-1768) est né à Traxcala au Mexique. Il entra chez les pères Jésuites en 1717 et fut expulsé avec son ordre du Mexique en 1767 après environ trente années d'activités missionnaires chez les Indiens du Nord-Ouest. Il a laissé une oeuvre écrite considérable autant sur des sujets de civilisation que de géographie.

The text consists of 16 engraved plates showing various styles of writing, for example, Saxon Character, Hebrew Alphabet, Roman Character, Old English, etc. Among the other vignettes are three inscriptions to Canadians. Report in form of a letter by Robert Seaborn Miles discussing the conditions at York Factory, the beaver trade, the servants accounts, and the outdoor work. R.S. Miles is also requesting a leave of absence for health reason. (Vol. 34)

CHARLES, John (fl. 1794-1843). Administrator.

Original, 1833. 4 pages.

John Charles (fl. 1794-1843) entered the service of the Hudson's Bay Company in 1799 as an apprentice. On the coalition of the Hudson's Bay and the North West Companies in 1821, he was appointed chief factor. He served in various posts and in 1830-1831, he was transferred to the charge of the Athabaska district at Fort Chipewyan where he remained in control until 1834. He retired in 1843.

Acquired in 1979 from Lawrence M. Lande.

Letter from William MacIntosh relating to fur trade, communications between the forts, contact with Indians, and various trading expeditions, 8 May 1833. (Vol. 34)

Original, 1841. 1 page.

James Hargrave (1798-1865) was born in Scotland. He taught school for a year before taking a position with the North West Company at Sault Ste. Marie in 1820. After the coalition of the Hudson's Bay and the North West Companies, he served as a clerk at Fort Garry and at York Factory from 1826 to 1850, being appointed in charge of the district in 1835. In 1851, he was placed in charge of the district of the Sault Ste. Marie. He retired in 1859.

Letter from Robert Harding relating to the fur trade with the Indians and the Inuit, 23 January 1841. (Vol. 34)

MARTIN, Robert Montgomery (1803?-1868). Historian and Statistician.

Robert Montgomery Martin (1803?-1868) travelled in Asia and African before publishing his *History of the British Colonies* in 1843. In 1840, he founded and edited for two years *The Colonial Magazine*. Many of his works shows an interest for the colonial questions.

Letter to Robert Montgomery Martin from George Renny Young sending to Montgomery his first volume of a book entitled *On Colonial Literature, Science and Education, written with a view of Improving the Literary, Educational and Public Institutions of British North America* (Halifax, 1842, volume 1). MACKENZIE, Roderick (ca. 1772-1859). Fur Trader.

Originals, 1847. 4 pages.

Born in Scotland around 1772, Roderick MacKenzie (ca.1772-1859) entered the service of the Hudson's Bay Company. He was a clerk at Fort Weederburn on Lake Athabaska during the Selkirk troubles of 1816-1817. Chief trader in 1821, he was made Chief Factor in 1830. From 1830 to 1848, he was in charge of the English River Department at Isle à la Crosse. He retired soon after 1848.

Acquired in 1979 from Lawrence M. Lande.

Letter of Roderick MacKenzie to the "Governor, Chief Factors and Chief Traders, Northern Department", reporting on his activities and events such as an epidemic of measles and influenza that had broken among the Indians, together with an account of the dead and the renewal of contracts of some servants, 12 January 1847. (Vol. 34)

James McKenzie (fl. 1794-1849) entered the service of the North West Company as a clerk in 1794. In 1802, he became a partner of the North West Company. He retired prior to the coalition of the Hudson's Bay and the North West companies although it seems he remained active in some undetermined capacity. He died in 1849.

Letter of introduction signed by James McKenzie to Captain Bradford, Lord Alexander Russell and Major Easton for safe passage during a fishing expedition in the Hudson's Bay Co. territory, 10 June 1847. (Vol. 34)

He is the author of several books concerning Canada among which five pamphlets published under the pen name of "Britannicus" on the Pacific Railway.

Several newspaper clippings of the *Ottawa Times'* editorial columns concerning the Pacific Railway and signed by "Britannicus", 1869, together with two letters on the same subject to the Editor of the *Montreal Gazette*, ca.1873, and notes under the heading "Important Indian Treaty", n.d., presumably by Malcolm McLeod.
