A-1942	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference: 6/8/4: <u>The Agricultural Resources of Canada: Report of Colonel Francis Fane, Fulbeck Hall, Grantham, a member of the Tenant-Farmer Delegation on his visit to the Dominion in 1890</u> (Published by authority of the Government of Canada (Department of Agriculture) 1891, 68 pages. With map of part of the Dominion of Canada, showing distances. <i>Colonel Francis Fane, of Fulbeck Hall, Grantham, a British farmer, visited Canada to examine and report on its merits as a place to which to emigrate.</i>	1890
A-1942	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference: 6/8/1/4: Diary of Captain F.A. Fane, 54th Regiment, in Canada and the United States, 1851. Includes draft letters, e.g., from Antigua, giving his reasons for exceeding his six weeks' period of leave of absence in January; recipes for arsenic soap and powder for animals.	1851
A-1942	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference: 6/8/1/5: Diary of F.A. Fane, January to October 1852, relating to Fane's recreation in Montreal and Quebec: skating, sleighing, hunting moose, etc. Includes verses sung by Fane to the Sleigh Club; state of accounts, 1 Dec. 1852. At the end of the diary are: state of accounts, Feb. and March, draft letters concerning horse races, foot races, etc.	1852
A-1942	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference: 6/8/1/6: Diary of F.A. Fane, 1 January-8 October 1853 concerning his life at Montreal and Quebec. Includes draft letters, a list of Kingston tradesmen, ginger beer recipe.	1853

A-1943	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference: 6/8/1/17: Diary of F.A. Fane, 1864. On 8 June, he embarked for Canada staying in Quebec until August. Approximately 35 pages relate to Canada. Includes draft letters and accounts.	1864
A-1944	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference: 6/8/1/17: Diary of F.A. Fane, 1864. On 8 June, he embarked for Canada staying in Quebec until August. <i>Continued from previous reel.</i>	1864
A-1944	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference: 6/8/1/18: Diary of F.A. Fane, 1865. He was mainly in Montreal, 6 July to 31 Dec., but travelled with a “flying column and 2 batteries of artillery” on a march to Chambly, St-Jean and La Prairie, Quebec.	1865
A-1944	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference: 6/8/1/19: Diary of F.A. Fane, 1866. He was in Montreal, 1 January to 13 November, also visiting Cornwall and St. Johns (St-Jean). In addition to accounts of social life, there is an entry, 8 March concerning “2 companies ordered to sleep with clothes on, on account of the Fenians.” Includes addresses, note of dividends, copy of receipt for £1428.11.5 from the trustees of the will of the Hon. Anne Fane, being a one seventh share appointed to him by the will of the Rev. E. Fane, 1865; inventory of household furniture.	1866
A-1945	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference 6/12/2: Journal of Millicent Mary Chaplin (Mrs. Thomas Chaplin), a noted amateur painter. The journal covers the period 14 May 1838 to 6 September 1839, 84 pages. Voyaging from Liverpool to New York, Mrs. Chaplin travelled to St. Johns (St-Jean), Quebec, then by rail to La Prairie, Quebec., where she took a steamer to Montreal. Her record of places visited and the people she met are more detailed than Fane’s. She visited Chief Justice John Beverley Robinson in Toronto, she visited the Kingston Penitentiary, and also the American prisoners held at Fort Henry. There are discussions of the rebellions, observations on plants and accounts of Indian customs.	1838-1839

A-1945	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference 6/12/3: Journal of Millicent Mary Chaplin (Mrs. Thomas Chaplin), a noted amateur painter. Journal, 4 August 1840 to 20 September 1840, 74 pages. Chaplin travelled to Boston, Fredericton, Halifax, Prince Edward Island and back to Quebec.	1840
A-1945	Fane of Fulbeck	Reference 3 Fane 2/6: Diary of Colonel Fane during his Canadian visit in 1890. Fane's tour of Canada as a "Commissioner from the Canadian government to enquire into that country as a field for emigrants". He visited Ottawa in September, meeting with Sir John A. Macdonald and the Minister of Agriculture. He journeyed to Toronto, Winnipeg, Regina, Calgary, Banff and Vancouver.	1890
A-1945	Monson Family Papers	Reference MON28/B/23/16/35. One letter, 9 June 1844, dated at Kingston, 4 pages, from Baron Metcalfe (1785-1846) to his sister Emily. He is ill and wishes that he "could see a prospect of quitting a people with many of whom I have so much reason to be disgusted."	1844
A-1945	Christopher Hatton Turner papers	Reference 4 TUR. 4/3, pages 1-72. Journal which includes notes of a May-June 1919 visit to Canada. <i>The Canadian content only was filmed.</i>	1919
A-1945		Reference MARSHALL 14 (Agency Agreements), 1919-1931. Includes Agreement of Clayton and Shuttleworth Limited, Engineers, with W.M. Rooke & Company of Vancouver, and agreement with West Kootenay Equipment and Construction Company, Nelson, B.C. The agreements covered the sale of engines, boilers, etc. Clayton and Shuttleworth Ltd, a firm of engineers, boilermakers and manufacturers of agricultural machinery. Defunct in 1932.
