Letters to Sir Henry Acland, Microfilm, 1860-1894 (predominant 1860-1872). Correspondence consisting of letters from various individuals to Acland regarding the studies of Oronhyatekha at Oxford University, Kenyon College and the University of Toronto. **Oronhyatekha (Burning Cloud), Chief of the Mohawks**

1. 25 Feb. 1861	James Heywood to Acland	The possibility of sending Burning Cloud to England to complete his education; the possibility of the New England Company, London, assisting in funding. The New England Company desires to improve Indians in and near Canada.
2. 25 Feb. 1862	Heywood to Acland	Oronhyatekha mentions that Acland advised him to remain at Oxford; Heywood took him to University College and the British Museum.
3. 30 Apr. 1862	Heywood to Acland	Oronhyatekha
4. 7 May 1862	Heywood to Acland	Regarding funds from several people for Oronhyatekha; forthcoming discussion at meeting of New England Company of this case.

5. 7 Nov. 1862	Heywood to Acland	Meeting of New England Company which is disposed to grant £50 per annum for the medical education of Peter Martin (Oronhyatekha) but need to know the proposed plan of education and to whom to entrust the funds. The Bishop of Huron recommended that Peter Martin be educated at Kenyon College and the New England Company voted him \$15.00 per annum for three years. At the end of two years, Mr. Nellis stopped this grant, without consulting the company, on the alleged grounds of wrong conduct on the part of Peter martin, in the seduction of several young Indian women. The majority of New England Company thought that Nellis erred.
6. 6 Dec. 1862	Heywood to Acland	Money has been sent to the care of John Langton.
7. 24 Dec. 1862		£50 per annum to be entrusted to John Langton. Waiting for Oronhyatekha to decide what line to take.
8. 3 Jan. 1863	Heywood to Acland	Regarding a doctor to act on behalf of the New England Society and the “young Mohawk”.
9. 10 Jan. 1863	Oronhyatekha to James Heywood, Hamilton, C.W.	Is looking for a government position in the Geological Survey under Dr. Logan to bring him influence and into contact with other tribes. His desire to pursue a medical course is mentioned. He has asked Dr. Ferguson to write to the authorities of the Toronto School of Medicine, for information as to the time when he could begin.
10. 20 Jan. 1863	Heywood to Acland	John Langton is willing to be the treasurer of a fund for assisting Oronhyatekha in a medical education in Canada. Heywood proposes that £50 per annum should be granted for three years, contingent upon the Mohawk’s good behaviour.
11. 3 Feb. 1863	Heywood to Acland	Heywood has received a letter from Oronhyatekha in which “he erroneously fancies that a medical education is fixed (by the New England Company) upon for him...” Believes he would be better to study minerology and geology.

No. and Date	Author	Subject Matter
12. 17 July 1862	Heywood to Acland	Oronhyatekha will have to send in his resignation to the Trustees of the school where he is to avoid missing the commencement of studies: medical lectures in Toronto. Includes comments from Oronhyatekha.
13. 24 July 1863	Heywood to Acland	Mentions problems associated with the New England Company. Mentions Peter Martin.
14. 30 Dec. 1867	Heywood to Acland	He is now Dr. Oronhyatekha. He received £50 per annum for several years from the New England Company. The remittances were placed in a Canadian bank by Prof. Croft. The bank failed when £20 were still on Oronhyatekha's account. The New England Company made good on it. Heywood, as the treasurer of the New England Company, paid it completing the allowances paid by the company for his education. Miss Nightingale takes great interest in the health of aborigines. Dr. Oronhyatekha is now settled at Frankford near Kingston in Canada.

16. 26 Feb. 1862	Beresford Hope to Acland	Regarding Peter Martin.
17. 4 Mar. 1862	Beresford Hope to Acland	
18.	Kenyon College	Printed circular on student fees, location, Kenyon College, Gambier, Ohio.
19. 20 June 1872	Eli T. Tappan to Dr. Oronhyatekha	Letter to Dr. Oronhyatekha at Kenyon College from Tappan, president. Tappan certifies that Oronhyatekha was a student in good standing, completing courses to the end of his sophomore year and leaving the college in 1860.
20. 21 Apr. 1863	B.L. Lang	Letter to Oronhyatekha regarding the latter's concern over allegations against himself. Lang gives him advice on his conduct and offers to help him settle his bills.

31. 24 Mar. 1862	Oronhyatekha	Extensive note regarding his studies, Oxford. <i>Very poorly filmed, contrast poor.</i>
31. Refilmed	Oronhyatekha	Notes: born at Grand River, C.W., Aug. 1841, attended a common school until about 10 years of age. At 10, went to Mohawk Institution: clothed, lodged and boarded. Suspended while in attendance at Kenyon College. The class rebelled against the college authorities and 30 of the 33 students were suspended including himself.
