Written mainly from barracks at Quebec, they also include a journal of a tour by canoe as far as Red River with Sir George Simpson, Governor of the Hudson's Bay Company and then on to join the great Buffalo hunt on the plains, ending at St. Peter, Minnesota. The letters are numbered, first page, upper right hand corner; some sketches. <i>Note to user: Poor filming with some overexposed letters and bleed through of ink from front to back of page.</i></p>
A-2164	<p>D2433/B/8/1-32. Letters from son to the Earl and Countess of Caledon (mother and father), nos. 1 to 32. Caledon journal during a tour as far as the Red River with Sir George Simpson.</p>

The former consists of shares in the Marmora Mining Company, the latter of an apparently fraudulent demand of one James Motz of Quebec against the late 3rd Earl. Also correspondence regarding the Marmora Works: circular, finances, managing director's reports. Includes: D2433/B/20/10. The Marmora Foundry Company - printed document. D2433/B/20/15. Printed document in form of letter, Beleville, C.W., dated 28 Oct. 1854 to J.B. Forsyth from T.F. Vernon Smith, regarding the Marmora Iron Works, 2 pages. Correspondence re Marmora Works, Circular, finances, managing director's report. <i>Note to user: Some letters are overexposed.</i></p>
A-2165	<p>D2433/B/23/1A <i>Journal of the 4th Earl of Caledon, 1879.</i> Journals are circa 200 pages in extent describing in detail the expeditions, game, native life, etc., in a light humorous vein. They are accompanied by numerous topographical sketches and cartoons in pen & ink or watercolours.</p>

All letters were written in Scotland or England and in the main are concerned with literary matters but also contain information on Galt's business interests and his dismissal from office in Canada. Internal evidence indicates that Galt's letters from Upper Canada which originally accompanied this group were deposited in the Archives of Ontario. <i>Poor filming of many of these letters. Bleed through between pages; cross-hatching of written text impedes legibility.</i>
