1	10	John Wainwright III: correspondence. Includes letters to his mother while on board the <i>Blossom</i> about the search for Sir John Franklin, 1826, 7 folios or 28 pages. The objective of the voyage was to meet Sir John Franklin during his second expedition but the letters focus on encounters with natives and their clothing as well as surveying, etc. He describes the voyage pas Easter Island, Elizabeth Island and on to the Bering Strait "where we are most likely to pick up Franklin", May to October 1826. There are also letters, ca. 1829 to 1864 including letters to his wife from Dartmouth, N.S., Queenstown, Portland, Quebec and Land' End, Nfld.	ca. 1826-1864
