Mario Bernardi was born in 1930 at Kirkland Lake, Ont., of Italian parentage. He spent his youth in Italy, where he studied piano, organ, and composition and graduated from the Conservatory in Venice. He returned to Canada in 1947 and continued his studies at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, while being organist at St. Vincent de Paul Church.

Bernardi pursued careers both as a conductor and coach with the Royal Conservatory Opera School and as a pianist and accompanist throughout the 1950's. He made his conducting debut with the Canadian Opera Company in 1957 and in 1963 was appointed coach and assistant conductor at Sadler's Wells in London, England, becoming co-musical director there in 1966. He returned regularly to Canada to work with the Vancouver Opera Association, Canadian Opera Company, and Stratford Music Festival. He made his U.S. debut in 1967 with the San Francisco Opera Association. Bernadi moved back to Canada after he was invited to form the new National Arts Centre Orchestra in Ottawa and become its first conductor in 1968. The Orchestra gave its inaugural concert in 1969, made its first U.S. appearance in 1972 at Lincoln Centre, N.Y., and toured Europe in both 1973 and 1978. In 1971, the National Arts Centre created a summer festival, Festival Canada (later Festival Ottawa). with Bernardi as its artistic director. In the same year he was named music director of the National Arts Centre. He was made a companion of the Order of Canada in 1972. He left Ottawa in 1982 and became the musical director of the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra effective 1984.

Mario Bernardi was born in Kirkland Lake, Ontario, of Italian parentage. He spent his youth in Italy, where he studied piano, organ, and composition and graduated from the Conservatory in Venice. He returned to Canada in 1947 and continued his studies at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, while being organist at St. Vincent de Paul Church.

Bernardi pursued careers both as a conductor and coach with the Royal Conservatory Opera School and as a pianist and accompanist throughout the 1950's. He made his conducting debut with the Canadian Opera Company in 1957 and in 1963 was appointed coach and assistant conductor at Sadler's Wells in London, England, becoming co-musical director there in 1966. He returned regularly to Canada to work with the Vancouver Opera Association, Canadian Opera Company, and Stratford Music Festival. He made his U.S. debut in 1967 with the San Francisco Opera Association.

In 1969, Bernardi moved back to Canada after he was invited to form the new National Arts Centre Orchestra in Ottawa and become its first conductor. The Orchestra gave its inaugural concert in 1969, made its first U.S. appearance in 1972 at Lincoln Centre, N.Y., and toured Europe in both 1973 and 1978. In 1971, the National Arts Centre created a summer festival, Festival Canada (later Festival Ottawa), with Bernardi as its artistic director. In the same year, he was named music director of the National Arts Centre. He resigned from the Centre in 1982.

Marion Bernardi married Canadian mezzo-soprano Mona Kelly in 1962. They have one daughter. He was made a Companion of the Order of Canada in 1972.
