VOORHIS, Ernest (1859-1933). Clergyman, Public Servant.

Rev. Ernest Voorhis, Ph. D., was born in New York. He was ordained an Anglican priest in 1886 and in 1890 married Isabelle Lampman, sister of the poet Archibald Lampman. In 1912 Voorhis moved to Canada, where from 1919 to 1931 he worked for the Department of the Interior in Ottawa. He also did extensive research on the genealogy of the Lampman family.

Presented between 1975 and 1983 by Margot Johnston of Kingsmere, Québec.
