The following explanation of the arrangement of the pre-1867 records (Adm. 128/1-61) appears as a prefatory note to Adm. 128/62.

Old
Series

The Records of this Station, of which a few go back to 1810, were by their first collector separated into "General Standing Orders", and "Records" of the respective Divisions of the Station, the Volumes in each Division being numbered consecutively with an Index in each Volume.

Alphabetical
Series

Those for the period of Sir Alexander Milne's command were arranged similarly, the Divisional Series being followed out, with the addition of "United States" (before included in "Bermuda and Halifax") which comprised the correspondence arising out of the Civil War in America, The volumes were distinguished by Letters in addition to their numbers in the Divisional Series, and were included in a General Index.

New
Series

This system, however, also becomes inconvenient as the number of volumes in each series increases; and a collection of the correspondence on all subjects, selected at the end of the year for the Records, arranged chronologically as far as possible, has been found much simpler, and it is hoped will be found easier of future reference.

Appendices

When a correspondence is sufficiently bulky for binding separately, it becomes an Appendix to the Volume to which its dates belong; and when a subject is re-opened after the correspondence in regard to it has been bound, a reference is made at its re-appearance to the previous Volume and page.

Hydrographical
Notices

As the originals of all Hydrographical Notices are lodged in Hydrographer's office, and the Charts and Pilot-books of the Squadron corrected by directions from that Department, nothing has been inserted in this Series related to Surveys, except in special cases.

Naval
Reserves

The Naval Storekeeper at Halifax being the officer appointed to collect the Rents of the various Admiralty Reserves in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, and the principal correspondence and deeds of occupation being deposited in this office, it is thought desirable to furnish him from time to time with the papers connected with them -- accumulated in the Commander-in-Chief's office (Letters from

the Admiralty, Reports of officers ordered to inspect the Reserves, &c) -- and to exclude them from these Records.

The Storekeeper has been directed to keep all documents relative to the Naval Reserves -- arranged in proper order, so that any references required by the Commander-in-Chief, or by persons interested, may be readily obtained.

Foreign
disturbances

The political difficulties of Foreign Countries are of course not our Province, except where the Naval Service is implicated by the presence of a Ship at the scene of disturbance, and when the acts of a Commanding officer may be subject to future question; so that the Records must not be depended on in all cases for a history of passing events, for instance in Hayti, Mexico, and the South American Republics. Letters of interest on these and similar subjects, received from the different Legations, and Consulates, have been inserted.

Index

In indexing Admiralty Circulars, &c, it may be remarked, -- in the Alphabetical Series the date of the Admiralty Letter forwarding the Circular was used. In this Series, the Circular and Memoranda are indexed by their own dates.
