LAMB, HENRY JOHN, 1915-1918. 1 foot.

Lieutenant-Colonel H. J. Lamb (1871-?) served in the Great War, 1914-1917, on the general staff of the 1st Canadian Division and later on the general staff of the 3rd Canadian Division and in the War Office. In 1916 he was awarded the D.S.O. Following the war, in 1919, he assumed the position of Supervising Engineer, Harbours and Rivers, Department of Public Works.

The Lamb Papers were received by the Army Historical Section in 1950 and later transferred to the Public Archives of Canada. They comprise a series of subject files, war diaries, maps, photographs, and miscellaneous material. A tabular finding aid is appended.
