Records accumulated by the Clerk of the Executive Council and by the Provincial Secretary in the period 1784-1867 were for a time in the safekeeping of the Public Archives of Canada. The records were arranged in series, chiefly in subject categories, and paginated before being microfilmed. On completion of the filming, in 1968-1969, the originals were transferred to the custody of the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick at Fredericton. There they have been integrated with other records and **their arrangement no longer follows this subject categorization.**

Finding Aid No. 121 provides a microfilm shelf list summarizing the whole collection and detailed lists describing certain parts.

The records accumulated by the Clerk of the Executive Council and the Provincial Secretary were arranged in series by category. Within each series, the arrangement may be chronological, alphabetic or numeric within sub-divisions of the basic subjects. The series are listed below.

INTRODUCTION

Notes on the arrangement of the collection.

The arrangement of the records is in twenty-six series, based more on the subject of the records than their nature or the office in which they were created or accumulated. Although identified as records of the Executive Council, many of the records should more properly be identified with other government offices and officials. Researchers should note that the organization of the records as they appear on the microfilm is not necessarily a reflection of the order in which the originals may now be found in the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick.

Citations

Researchers should note that the page numbering sequences sometimes are coterminous with a volume and at other times with a series of volumes. Citations should therefore include both the volume and page references as well as the microfilm reel number.

Requests for photocopies should provide the fullest citation possible. The Public Archives of Canada can supply reader-printer copies for general reference purposes, based on a full citation for the items of interest. Questions of copies for exhibition or publication purposes should be addressed to the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick (P.O. Box 6000, Fredericton, N.B., E3B 5H1).

Arrangement

Within the main series, the records may be separated by type (such as correspondence, petitions, reports, applications, etc.) or arranged in a single sequence, chronologically or sub-divided by some aspect of the topic and then in chronological order. Some series are arranged in alphabetic order by geographic designations (towns or counties), then chronologically. Thus, for example, the series BOUNDARIES is sub-divided into New Brunswick-Maine, New Brunswick-Canada and New Brunswick-Nova Scotia; the order within each sub-series is then chronological. Within the CUSTOMS

series, the Port records sub-series is arranged alphabetically by name of port. Within the Finance series, the Fish bounty records are arranged by date while the Grain bounty records are arranged by country.

Levels of Description

The SHELF LIST (which forms pages 1-28) was based on the list of file and volume titles prepared at the time of filming. When the microfilm reel numbers were added in 1986, some discrepancies were noted in the dates given for the files. NO VERIFICATION WAS CARRIED OUT to ensure the correction of all errors; whether the shelf list or the targets and running heads which appear on the microfilm are accurate or not has not been investigated to any extent. Some glaring errors were amended when noted.

The dates given in the file titles and indeed the titles for the files may be found to be somewhat inaccurate or inconsistent, in view of the subject classifications assigned to the records. Some of the errors noted in the targets and running heads may be typographical, others the result of hurried preparation of the collection for microfilming.

For some portions of the collection, the Shelf List provides a substantial break-down of the sub-series and files within a series; for other series the description is very general. Within the microfilm, the targets and running heads provide descriptive detail to assist researchers in locating documents of a particular date or relating to a particular area by identifying subdivisions within the series and sub-series (such as the specific ports in the Port records within the Customs records).

The Table of Contents identifies the lists which are available to provide more detailed listing of the contents for some series and sub-series. The level of detail provided in these lists varies quite considerably. ALL must be used in conjunction with the Shelf List to determine the reel on which the records will appear. More importantly, NO INDICATION OF VOLUME AND PAGE NUMBERS IS PROVIDED within these detailed lists -- only an outline of the arrangement for the records found within that series or sub-series.

Records accumulated by the Clerk of the Executive Council and by the Provincial Secretary in the period 1784-1867 were for a time in the safekeeping of the Public Archives of Canada. The records were arranged in series, chiefly in subject categories, and paginated before being microfilmed. On completion of the filming, in 1968-1969, the originals were transferred to the custody of the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick at Fredericton. There they have been integrated with other records and **their arrangement no longer follows this subject categorization.**

Finding Aid No. 121 provides a microfilm shelf list summarizing the whole collection and detailed lists describing certain parts.

The records accumulated by the Clerk of the Executive Council and the Provincial Secretary were arranged in series by category. Within each series, the arrangement may be chronological, alphabetic or numeric within sub-divisions of the basic subjects. The series are listed below.

INTRODUCTION

Notes on the arrangement of the collection.

The arrangement of the records is in twenty-six series, based more on the subject of the records than their nature or the office in which they were created or accumulated. Although identified as records of the Executive Council, many of the records should more properly be identified with other government offices and officials. Researchers should note that the organization of the records as they appear on the microfilm is not necessarily a reflection of the order in which the originals may now be found in the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick.

Citations

Researchers should note that the page numbering sequences sometimes are coterminous with a volume and at other times with a series of volumes. Citations should therefore include both the volume and page references as well as the microfilm reel number.

Requests for photocopies should provide the fullest citation possible. The Public Archives of Canada can supply reader-printer copies for general reference purposes, based on a full citation for the items of interest. Questions of copies for exhibition or publication purposes should be addressed to the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick (P.O. Box 6000, Fredericton, N.B., E3B 5H1).

Arrangement

Within the main series, the records may be separated by type (such as correspondence, petitions, reports, applications, etc.) or arranged in a single sequence, chronologically or sub-divided by some aspect of the topic and then in chronological order. Some series are arranged in alphabetic order by geographic designations (towns or counties), then chronologically. Thus, for example, the series BOUNDARIES is sub-divided into New Brunswick-Maine, New Brunswick-Canada and New Brunswick-Nova Scotia; the order within each sub-series is then chronological. Within the CUSTOMS

series, the Port records sub-series is arranged alphabetically by name of port. Within the Finance series, the Fish bounty records are arranged by date while the Grain bounty records are arranged by country.

Levels of Description

The SHELF LIST (which forms pages 1-28) was based on the list of file and volume titles prepared at the time of filming. When the microfilm reel numbers were added in 1986, some discrepancies were noted in the dates given for the files. NO VERIFICATION WAS CARRIED OUT to ensure the correction of all errors; whether the shelf list or the targets and running heads which appear on the microfilm are accurate or not has not been investigated to any extent. Some glaring errors were amended when noted.

The dates given in the file titles and indeed the titles for the files may be found to be somewhat inaccurate or inconsistent, in view of the subject classifications assigned to the records. Some of the errors noted in the targets and running heads may be typographical, others the result of hurried preparation of the collection for microfilming.

For some portions of the collection, the Shelf List provides a substantial break-down of the sub-series and files within a series; for other series the description is very general. Within the microfilm, the targets and running heads provide descriptive detail to assist researchers in locating documents of a particular date or relating to a particular area by identifying subdivisions within the series and sub-series (such as the specific ports in the Port records within the Customs records).

The Table of Contents identifies the lists which are available to provide more detailed listing of the contents for some series and sub-series. The level of detail provided in these lists varies quite considerably. ALL must be used in conjunction with the Shelf List to determine the reel on which the records will appear. More importantly, NO INDICATION OF VOLUME AND PAGE NUMBERS IS PROVIDED within these detailed lists -- only an outline of the arrangement for the records found within that series or sub-series.
