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Alexander Hamilton (1790-1839) was the son of Robert Hamilton (1750-1809), one of the first merchants in the Niagara area. Robert Hamilton had first settled at Carleton Island during the American Revolutionary War, but moved his business to Queenston (which town he founded). He was one of the first members of the Legislative Council of Upper Canada, 1792-1809. His eight sons included George Hamilton (1787-1835), founder of the city of Hamilton, Ontario, and John Hamilton (1802-1882), the pioneer of steam navigation on Lake Ontario and the upper St. Lawrence River.

Alexander Hamilton and his brothers Robert F. and George carried on their father's business at Queenston through several partnerships; Alexander also attempted to establish a milling and lumbering industry at Canboro with his cousin Alexander Askin, but met failure in 1817. By 1828 other business ventures had also failed and Alexander Hamilton was forced to surrender most of his property to William McGillivray in payment for debt, although the debts were not all settled until 1837. Alexander Hamilton held several public offices, including Postmaster of the Niagara District, 1821-1829, Sheriff of the Niagara District, 1833-1839, and Judge of the Surrogate Court, 1824-1833. In 1816 he married Hannah Owen, daughter of William Jarvis.

The main body of Hamilton papers was acquired between 1953 and 1957. The 1837 Rebellion correspondence (vol. 65) was presented in 1910 by the Misses Durand of Queenston, copies of letters (vol. 67) were presented in 1927 by Augusta Hamilton, land grants in Blenheim Township were presented in 1963 by the Liberation Society of London, and a letter from Robert Gourlay was presented in 1988 by Harold Usher of St. Davids.

No Restriction on Access.

Finding Aid No. 211 provides a summary of the arrangement and contents of the whole collection through a shelf list, and a detailed description of portions of the correspondence.

The report by Robert Laidlaw on the Hamilton papers, published in the REPORT of the Public Archives for 1910 (pages 91-94) no longer serves as a description for reference purposes.

The papers of Alexander Hamilton and members of his family include both business and family correspondence, accounts, estate records and other documents of family interest. Records accumulated by Alexander Hamilton in the performance of public duties form part of the fonds. The papers are arranged in series by type of record, and then either chronologically or alphabetically by correspondent; many of the business papers are only roughly organized within the series. A distinction between family and business correspondence is difficult to make and some overlap occurs between series.

Family correspondence and estate records. 1792-1844, (Vol. 1-2, 4-7, 16, 38, 67-69).

Correspondence and accounts of the executors and trustees for the estate of Robert Hamilton (held in trust until 1821), of Alexander Hamilton, of Mary Hamilton, and of Thomas Dickson (for whom Alexander Hamilton was attorney), and correspondence of the Jarvis family.

Business correspondence and records of Alexander Hamilton, his brothers and partners. 1804-1839, (Vol. 3-5, 7-15, 17-35, 37, 39-43, 66).

Correspondence, statements of account, account books and related records of the Queenston business operated by Robert Hamilton and his sons, of the forwarding business operated by Alexander Hamilton and his brothers, and of the partnerships established by Alexander Hamilton and his brothers or cousins.

Records of the Deputy Collector of Customs. 1825-1826, (Vol. 36, 44).

Notes on the structure of the finding aid and levels of description

The arrangement of the Hamilton papers into series and the sequence of documents within the series appears to have been carried out according to varying guidelines and standards. The levels of description provided for portions of the collection are equally varied. Most of the lists provide no indication of the number of items relating to the correspondent named, nor the subject, nor the length of an item. For a substantial proportion of the collection, the only level of description is that provided in the shelf list above (pages v-ix), essentially at the volume title level.

When this introduction was prepared, time constraints did not permit a detailed review of the collection and verification of details. The researcher is therefore advised to PROCEED WITH CAUTION. There is evidence of overlap between series, as where correspondence of the forwarding business is found in volumes 5 and 10-13, while accounts are found in volumes 10-13 and 29-34. Similarly, accounts relating to the construction, maintenance and enlargement of Alexander Hamilton's house are chiefly found in volume 16 but may also be found in volume 38.

Further arrangement of the collection in detail and revision or expansion of the description may be carried out when circumstances permit. Such work is likely to result in some alterations of structure, with consequent alteration of citations for certain documents. Researchers should therefore take particular care to provide a description of a document (in the style recommended in the booklet ARCHIVAL CITATIONS) as well as a volume reference when making citations to the Alexander Hamilton papers.

Conservation work is also to be scheduled and may result in some alterations to the manner in which the documents are stored. At present, only a few items from volume 47 are stored separately (in the vertical file cabinets.)
