MG 24 BARING BROTHERS & COMPANY (est. 1770)

Originals, 1781-1891. 10 m. Microfilm, 1850-1899. 9 reels, A-833 to A-841. Finding Aid No. 214.

The banking firm of Baring Brothers was established in London, England in 1770 and by 1810, on the death of Francis Baring, was considered the premier merchant banking house in Europe. Diversification of interests brought the firm to promote canals and railroads in the Americas, as well as government debentures and other financial ventures.

The company records were presented in 1926. The selection of correspondence, maps, printed material and related items was made by Dr. Adam Shortt in light of their relevance to the development of Canada as well as the United States and countries in Latin America. Related ledgers, journals and other accounting records remain with the Company archives.

Finding Aid No. 214 is composed of 16 Guides, most of which were prepared by Dr. Adam Shortt. An extensive Introduction provides an explanation of their coverage for the various series within the Baring papers and the manner in which they should be used. The catalogue of the House Correspondence filmed in London (reels A-833 to A-841) has been annotated to form Guide 16. It also appears on reel A-833. As microfilmed on reel C-1445, Guides 1-15 lack both an Introduction to explain their use and a microfilm shelf list.

Volumes 1-193 (omitting the duplicates in volumes 194-200) were microfilmed in 1959. The complete collection has now been withdrawn from circulation for conservation purposes. RESEARCHERS MUST USE THE MICROFILM; reel numbers are identified in the Finding Aid.

Series A: Letters Received, 1818-1877 (volumes 1-111; 555 cm). Available on microfilm, reels C-1368 to C-1423.

The incoming correspondence is arranged in three series:

A. I Letters Received, British North America, 1833-1876;

A. 2 Letters Received, General, 1819–1877; and

A. 3 Letters Received from Agents and Correspondents, 1819–1871.

The two general series are arranged chronologically while the third series is arranged chronologically within 14 sub-series by agency.

Series B: Letterbooks, 1827-1871 (volumes 112-171; 3 m). Available on microfilm, reels C-1423 to C-1438.

The letterbooks form a general series, 1827-1871, and a series for the agents in Boston, 1837-1871, plus volumes for E.W. Watkin, 1861-1862.

Series C: Maps, 1827-1873 (volume 172; 5 cm). Available on microfilm, reel C-1439.

Although the maps have been separated from their covering correspondence, a record of the relationship has been kept in Finding Aid 214.

Series D: Printed Matter, 1781-1873, 1891 (volumes 173-192; 105 cm). Available on microfilm, reels C-1439 to C-1444.

Statutes, pamphlets, newspaper clippings and a variety of other printed material has been formed into a separate series, although much was originally enclosed with correspondence. Finding Aid 214 includes some notation of the inter-relationship between printed items and the correspondence series.

Series E: Sundries, 1824-1871 (volumes 193-200; 40 cm). Volume 193 available on microfim, reel C-1444.

Volume 193 contains an agreement of 1839 with V. Nolte and Major F. White's journal of 1852-1853. The remaining volumes contain duplicates for 1824-1871 (194-199) and extra duplicates for 1839-1870 (200).

House Correspondence, 1850-1898. (Microfim, reels A-833 to A-841). Headquarters correspondence dealing with the government of Canada, various railway companies and business firms was microfimed in 1971 from the originals in the Company archives, class HC 5.11. The company's catalogue of the files appears on reel A-833 and has been annotated with the reel numbers to form Guide 16 of Finding Aid 214.

January 1983 P. Kennedy 7-285 Pre-Confederation The Baring Brothers & Company, one of the foremost mercantile banking houses of Europe in the last century had a humble origin. It was started as a cloth manufacturing firm in Exeter, England, early in the eighteenth century by Johann Baring, a German immigrant from Bremen. In 1770 his two sons, Francis and John, established a bank in London, and by 1810, the year Francis died, the firm was regarded as the first merchant banking house in Europe.

Gradually the Barings diversified their business. They bought and sold such commodities as cotton, wheat, sugar, tobacco, coffee, tea, precious and base metals; they loaned money on consignments of goods, marketed securities, operated shiplines, managed plantations, and promoted mining and industrial ventures. They loaned money to governments, acted as their bankers and accepted their securities as collaterals. as promoters of canals, railways and banks they left an indellible mark on the economy of North America. They spanned the continent with a network of agents and correspondents, and they relied on their advice, notably on that of the Wards of Boston.

Financial success brought with it political power and social prominence. Francis Baring, the original founder of the London house, was elected director of the East India Company. He sat in parliament as a Whig from 1784- to 1806, and was subsequently created a baronet. The eldest of his five sons, Sir Thomas, achieved a measure of fame as an art collector. The second son, Alexander, better known as Lord Ashburton, took over the control of the business. He is also remembered as the co-author of the Ashburton - Webster treaty. After his death the control of the house passed into the hands of Thomas Baring, the son of Sir Thomas. Thomas, together with Joshua Bates, piloted the firm through a period of rapid expansion. This was the age of canal and railroad building, and Barings poured millions of dollars into the Canadian and American transportation projects. Thomas Baring topped his financial career with a notable success in politics. He represented the riding of Huntington in parliament from 1844 until his death in 1873.

Edward Charles Baring, later Baron Revelstoke, continued to expand business as the next head of the House of Barings. Towards the end of the century he authorized heavy investments in the Argentine Republic including a guarantee of interest. The Argentinian Government defaulted on the loan, and Barings lost heavily. In 1890 it became widely rumoured that Barings were on the verge of bankruptcy. Their liabilities for that year alone amounted to £21,000,000. In the face of the impending crisis the Bank of England stepped in and, by taking over the liabilities, averted the disaster. With it came a reorganization of the House of Barings as a limited-liability, joint-stock company with a capital of £1,000,000.

The Baring Papers in the Public Archives cover the period from 1818-1872 only. They were selected by Dr. Adam Shortt largely because of their relevance to the economic development of Canada, the United States and Latin America. They consist almost entirely of correspondence to and from the various agents of Barings, as well as the letters from private persons. Business books such as ledgers, journals, account and bank books were left in Barings' archives together with the material after 1872. Material prior to 1818 is the possession of the New York Historical Society and is included in the Rufus King MSS.

Dr. Adam Shortt prepared several guides to the Baring Papers. They vary from comprehensive calendars to subject and nominal indexes. Since the papers are arranged in chronological order the guides refer to the material by date. Recently, however, the Baring Papers were numbered, and the first three guides revised and brought up to date. These guides are now provided with page references. There are however several groups, notably the letter books, which lack guides altogether.

With new acquisitions a measure of reorganization of the papers took place. All letters sent from Canada were grouped together into one unit called Letters Received, British North America. Other individual letters, formerly known as Miscellaneous Letters, are now grouped as Letters Received, General. As Barings maintained agents in major commercial centres who sent in regular reports and advices, a geographical arrangement of such material by agencies appeared appropriate. These now form separate units

under the names of the agents, and they are grouped together by cities e.g. Boston, New York, etc. The group itself is called: Letters Received, Agents and Correspondents. Printed enclosures and maps had previously been set up as separate groups called: Printed Matter, and Maps, respectively. This order is continued in the present organization. Likewise, copies of letters sent remain as the original group called: Letter Books.

Notes on the Structure and Use of this Finding Aid

Dr. Adam Shortt prepared a number of guides (now numbered 1-15) to the Baring Brothers records at the time he selected material to be brought to Ottawa from London. This descriptive material takes many forms: calendars, nominal indexes, subject indexes, and summary lists of authors and recipients. Within Finding Aid 214, Guides 4-15 remain virtually unchanged and require a degree of effort in tracing the date reference through the Consolidated Shelf List (see pages xiii-xxxi) to the relevant documents as they appear on the microfilm. Guides 1-3 were revised in the 1950s by Robert Gordon following reorganization of Series A.1 and A.2. These guides now include page numbers which simplify the identification of the documents on the microfilm.

The Introduction was begun about 1975 by Michèle Corbett and Peter Rider. The need for more explanation of the guides was recognized in 1982-1983 by the preparation of an annotated copy of the House Correspondence catalogue (now Guide 16) and the preparation of an improved Consolidated Shelf List as well as introductory notes by Diane Bridges and Patricia Kennedy of Pre-Confederation Archives.

The following Correlation of Series and Guides (pages ix-xii) is intended to identify the guides available for each series, working from the series. The Table of Contents (pages ii-iii above) identifies the nature of each guide, the series to which it refers, and the location of the guide within the Finding Aid. Title pages for each Guide provide further explanation as to the nature of the description provided, the extent of coverage (for example, Guide 5 covers only volumes 80-90 within Series A.3.b, leaving volumes 91-96 without detailed description). As indicated in the Correlation of Series and Guides, there is no detailed description for a number of series, including the letterbooks (volumes 112-171).

To protect the documents from deterioration, the complete collection has been withdrawn from circulation. RESEARCHERS MUST USE THE MICROFILM. The Consolidated Shelf List (see pages xiii-xxxi) correlates dates, pages and volumes with the microfilm reel number for each series. The style of citation recommended on page xxxiv should be used when requesting photocopies. Reader-printer copies can be made from the microfilm at the standard charge for such copies. Xerox copies cannot be made. Photographs from the originals can be made for exhibition or publication purposes, within the constraints established by copyright law.
