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INTRODUCTION

The Hayes Family papers form a collection of letters and business records relating to several members of the Hayes Family. The head of the family, James John Hayes, came to Canada from Cork, Ireland, in 1842 settled in Toronto, and began practicing medicine. He invested in real estate, formed a shipbuilding firm, and served on the Senate of the University of Toronto. He married Mary Coleman in 1822 and had five sons and one daughter. Their names are:

Martin Peter,	born in 1823 in Cork
Thomas,	born in 1825 in Cork
James Mark,	born in 1827 in Cork
Michael,	born in 1829 in Cork
Barry, (known as Fin Bar)	born in 1830 in Cork
Nanno,	born in 1832 in Cork

Two thirds of the material relates to Martin Peter. The remainder pertains chiefly to James John and Fin Bar (Barry); with only a few papers referring to the other members of the family.

About 1850 Martin Peter began to take over the control of the family business. He became the dominant figure in the shipbuilding firm of Hayes Brothers and Company in the years 1853-1855. By 1859 he became the agent of the Department of Crown Lands with an office at Madoc, and in 1861, he took on the agency of the Western Assurance Company. There is no evidence that he continued in this capacity beyond 1866.

Martin Peter was very versatile and his interests ranged over a wide area. He wrote articles for the "The Spirit of Times", a New York publication, wrote and lectured on physics and religion, and publicized the works of Louis Veuillot, a 19th century French religious writer and apologist for the Roman Catholic Church. In a modest way he himself produced several short literary pieces.

In 1883 he became interested in mining and mining promotion. In 1886, and again in 1891, he entered into option agreement with United States financial interests with the view to quarrying sandstone in the Thunder Bay District. About the same time he began to

promote a variety of inventions; he patented, publicized, and participated financially on several of these.

Fin Bar (Barry), the youngest male member of the Hayes family became a translator at the House of Commons in Ottawa. He joined the Irish Home Rule movement and rose to the vice-presidency of the Ottawa Branch of the Irish National League. As treasurer he contributed considerably to the financial success of the movement. His papers contain material relating to the collection and administration of the funds including the letters from Edward Blake to Fin Bar (Barry) from London on behalf of the Irish Parliamentary Committee.

The other sons of James John Hayes are only scantily represented in this collection. Thomas studied medicine in Toronto, and participated in the family business. Michael became a clerk in Stratford; and James Mark, after studying theology at St. Xavier College in Cincinnati, Ohio, was ordained a priest of the Society of Jesus in 1857.

The Hayes Papers were presented to the Public Archives July 30, 1913. The original arrangement was retained with some modifications.
