Joel Stone (1749-1823), a Connecticut Loyalist, served with the Wentworth Volunteers and was subsequently evacuated to England. He emigrated to Canada, and, in 1786, settled at Gananoque, where he was active in the Leeds County militia. He also served on the Commission on Forfeited Estates from 1816 to 1821.

Joel's daughter, Mary, married Charles, the son of John McDonald (fl.1770-1790), a Scot who had settled in Athol County, New York. Their descendants, William Stone and Herbert Stone McDonald, were prominent in the affairs of Leeds County.

The Baker branch of the family, Sarah and her sons William and Francis, emigrated from Batavia, New York around 1830. Mrs. Sarah Baker married William Bush in 1846 and the Reverend William Smart in 1862.

With the exception of the shipping manifest (1797), which was acquired in 1981, the collection was presented between 1888 and 1966 by various individuals related to the McDonald and Stone families.

Finding Aid No. 98 is an alphabetically arranged list of correspondence, accounts, receipts, reports and various other types of documents which make up the collection.

The papers accumulated by the McDonald Stone and Baker families of Gananoque, Ontario are arranged in series by family name. Within the series, the various types of documentation are interfiled and arranged chronologically.

Stone Family, 1778-1840. 27.5 cm (volumes 1-3, pp. 1-1836).

Correspondence, legal papers, financial papers and land petitions provide information about Joel Stone and his family. The records of the Leeds Militia, 1802-1833, and the Commission on Forfeited Estates, 1816-1821, which include draft reports and lists of forfeitures, contain information regarding both groups and Stone's participation in them.
