April- September 1838	Diary	A/1/3	Return to Canada; lands in New York and stays at the Astor Hotel; proceeds by coach to Montreal, where Sir John Colborne and Colonel Wetherall are in command; sent to Nicolet to report on state of popular opinion..... visit to the battlefield of St.Eustache.
October 1838- January 1840	Diary	A/1/4	In command of 1st Kent Militia at Chatham, Canada; tension between British and Americans and rumours of imminent war; comments on Anglo-American politics.
