BIOGRAPHY

Major General Sir Edward W.B. Morrison, born in London, Ont., was educated in Public Schools and the Tassie Institute, Galt, Ontario. He began his newspaper career with the Hamilton Spectator, and subsequently edited the Ottawa Citizen from 1898 to 1913. He advanced through the Militia ranks until he assumed command of the 8th Artillery Brigade in 1909. During the South African War he was awarded the D.S.O. for his service in three engagements. In 1913 he became Director of Artillery. During World War I, Morrison commanded the 1st Artillery Brigade, 1914-1915, the 2nd Division Artillery, 1915-1916, and the Canadian Corps Artillery, 1916-1919. He was made a K.C.M.G. in 1919. From 1919 to 1923 he was Inspector General of Artillery and Master of Ordnance. He is author of With the Guns in South Africa (Hamilton, 1901), and With the Canadians from Valcartier to the Rhine (Ottawa, 1928.

PROVENANCE

Presented to the Army Historical Section in 1956 by General Morrison's stepson, H.H. Fripp and later transferred to the Public Archives. Additional material (in volume 11) presented by Mrs. Elizabeth Fripp in 1978. Photographs have been transferred to National Photography Collection.

Finding Aid No. 114 is a subject file list. The papers are arranged in 5 groupings:

DESCRIPTION OF PAPERS

Artillery Corps, 1915-1923 (Vols. 1-4)
Concerns matters affecting the general interest of the Artillery Corps, arranged alphabetically.

Military Material, 1916-1918 (Vol. 4) Contains returns, reports, instructions and graphs relating to the disposition and quantity of arms and equipment.

Personnel Files divided into two groups: a) officials and b) other ranks. 1915-1921 (Vols. 5-10) Consists of files on individuals, regulations, reports and correspondence pertaining to the management of personnel. Morrison, 1916, 1918, 1920-21. (Vol. 10)
Contains assorted material of an unofficial or semi-official nature, comprising the creations of Morrison and his close friends and correspondence referring other matters to his personal attention.

Also included is a diary, 1914, describing Morrison's first six days in England and the disembarkation of the 1st Artillery Brigade.

Miscellaneous items include a statistical table showing ammunition alloted to the Canadian Corps for the Passchendaele operations n.d., a playlet, n.d. and a poem, n.d.
