MURPHY, Hon. Charles. 1863-1935. Cabinet Minister and Senator.

Originals, 1863-1936, 9 feet, 1 inch. Photocopy, 1869, 4 pages. Transcripts, 1856-1919, 4 inches. Finding Aid No. 116.

Hon. Charles Murphy (1863-1935), lawyer, was a Liberal Member of Parliament, 1908-25, Irish Catholic representative in the Cabinet, Secretary of State, 1908-11, first Secretary of State for External Affairs, 1909-11, and Postmaster General, 1921-26. He was a Member of the Senate from 1925 to 1935.

Volumes 1-41 of the papers were presented in 1936 by Mr. J.J. Murphy, a brother of Charles Murphy. Volumes 42-49 were transferred to the Archives in 1973 by St. Patrick's College Library, Ottawa.

The finding aid consists of a nominal list of the correspondence in Vols. 1-31, 42-43, and of a list of the subject files in Vols. 32-41, 44-49.

Correspondence, 1900-1935. Originals, 5 feet, 9 inches. (Volumes 1-31, 42-43).

The correspondence is arranged in alphabetical order by names of correspondents. Prominent subjects include D'Arcy McGee, the constitutional crisis of 1926, appointments for Irish Canadians; the Rt. Hon. W.L. Mackenzie King, and the Irish Free State. Most of the correspondence dates after 1921.

Subject files. Originals, 2 feet, 10 inches. Photocopy, (Volumes 32-41, 44-49).

Memoranda, notes and reports in more than fifty subject files. Among the more prominent subjects are federal elections, Liberal Party organization, Ottawa affairs, the Post Office Department and the McGee Centenary.

D'Arcy McGee. Originals, 1863-68, 31 pages. Photocopy, 1869, 4 pages. Transcripts, 1856-1919. 4 inches. (Volume 35, folder 161 and Volume 48).

Papers relating to the Hon. T. D'Arcy McGee, acquired by Murphy from various sources. They include twelve original letters written by McGee, eight of them to Sir John A. Macdonald (pages 14212-14242), typewritten copies of approximately 55 letters, including 23 to John O'Donohoe, 11 to his brother, J.J. McGee; and 5 to J.G. Moylan (pages 14251-14317); also typewritten copies of articles about McGee and of speeches by Murphy (pages 14318-14551). There are also four inches of transcripts of McGee letters to J.G. Moylan and Sir John A. Macdonald, located in Volume 48.

Speeches, tributes. Originals, 1889-1936, 4 inches. (Volume 49). These pertain primarily to Charles Murphy, with some references to T. D'Arcy McGee.
