Newton Wesley Rowell was born in Middlesex County, Ontario on 1 November 1867. Educated at public schools and the Ontario Law Society, he was admitted to the Bar of Ontario, in 1891, became a K.C. in 1902, and a Bencher of the Law Society of Upper Canada in 1911.

Rowell was first elected in 1911 as the member in the Ontario Legislative Assembly for North Oxford. From 1911 to 1917 he was the Liberal House Leader. In 1917 he was elected M.P. for Durham County, resigning his seat in 1921. As a member of the Union Government, he was President of the Privy Council, 1917-1920, Minister of Health, 1919-1920, and a member of the Imperial War Cabinet, 1918. In addition, he represented Canada at the International Labour Conference, 1919, and the League of Nations, 1920. He retired from the Government in 1920. Rowell served as Chief Justice of Ontario, 1936-38, and Chairman of the Royal Commission on Dominion-Provincial Relations, 1937-38, resigning because of ill health.

Most of the Rowell papers were presented by his widow in 1951. The bulk of the personal and family papers (Volume 89) were presented by his daughter, Mrs. H.R. Jackman, in 1977. Volumes 1 to 34 are also available on microfilm, reels C-930 to C-946.

The finding aid no. 131 is a list of file titles and the microfilm conversion list.

Sirois and John Dafoe. 1938-1942 Letters of condolence (31) -Letters written to Rowell and Mrs. Rowell after his stroke and resignation in 1938; letters and resolutions of condolence sent to Mrs. Rowell after Rowell's death in November 1941.
