INTRODUCTION

The series Marine B¹: Décisions (1686-1789) is divided into two parts:

- I. Délibérations du Conseil de Marine (1715 à 1721)
- II. Feuilles au Roi, Feuilles au Ministre (1686 à 1789).

The first part contains the minutes of the "Conseil de Marine", signed by one or more members and by the secretary of that body which replaced, under the Regency (1715-1723), the Minister, or the "Secrétaire d'Etat" of the Navy. The title pages and the pages on which the signatures appear have been microfilmed each time they exist; they are lacking in a few instances. The volumes are generally numbered by folio; some have received page numbers. In one case (B¹ 53), two years were bound together, resulting in two series of paginations in one volume. The minutes are recorded in two columns: on the right appears the extract of a report or a request; on the left, the decision or recommendation of the "Conseil de Marine".

Many reports deal with several subjects. The following selections of material relating to American history include the beginning of each report, even though it may be on another topic, so that the scholar may know from whom and where the report originated.

Part II has sometimes been called "Travail du Roi, Travail du Ministre". The volumes themselves bear the simple title: "Décisions". Decisions were not always made on each note submitted, however; and the work ("travail") involved was not so much that of the minister or of the King as that of departmental offices. "Feuilles au Roi, Feuilles au Ministre" is more exact than the other two titles.

The following report covers 73 of the 192 volumes comprising Marine B¹, 14 of which are microfilmed in their entirety and 59 partially. Volumes devoted exclusively to the "Marine de Levant" were not examined unless inventories indicated the presence of material related to American history. All volumes of "Marine de Ponant" records were examined; those from which no selections were made are:
