About 1780 Josias Wurtele (fl. 1790-1830) settled at Quebec, where he acted as general merchant and acquired the seigniories of Bourg Marie de l'Est and De Guir, commonly known as River David. The brothers Frederick (1777-1836), George, Carl, Johann and Jacob also emigrated from Strumpfelbach, in Wurtemberg, Germany, about 1790 and engaged in business at Quebec. Josias Wurtele's lands and business interests were inherited by his son Jonathan (1792-1853), who married Louise Sophia Campbell. Among their children were Jonathan Saxton Campbell Wurtele (1827-1904), who pursued a distinguished career in law, as an MLA, and on the bench, and Arthur Sheppard Campbell Wurtele (fl. 1850-1860), who spent some time in the Australian gold fields before taking up a career as a land surveyor in Canada East.

Except where otherwise noted, the collection was donated in 1980 by the Estate of Louisa M. Fair through the courtesy of R.J. Wrightson, Acquisitions Department, Concordia University Library.

Printed materials were transferred to the Public Archives Library; photographs were transferred to the National Photography Collection.

Finding aid No. 336 is a descriptive file list which contains an author/recipient/subject list for the German correspondence of Frederick Wurtele as Appendix "A".

Correspondence, 1766-1921. 3 cm, 9 pages (volume 1).

The letters to Frederick Wurtele from his father and brothers concern family and business matters and include accounts, powers of attorney and a list of emigrants from Wurtemberg, 1817. Acquired in 1961.

The correspondence of Jonathan and Arthur S.C. Wurtele, 1824-1852, pertains to business, land, education and family matters. Six letters from Arthur S.C. Wurtele also describe his travels in, and impressions of, England and Australia. Acquired between 1945 and 1972.

Estate Papers, 1833-1868. 4 cm (volume 1).

Accounts, memoranda and legal documents describe the court cases which ensued after the death of Josias Wurtele regarding the disposition of his estate.

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Journals, 1815-1907. 8 cm, 80 pages (volume 1).

The transcription of Jonathan Wurtele's journal, done by L.C. Wurtele, records his travels in England and Germany in 1815 and provides information regarding travel conditions, inns, factories and expenses in the two countries. The journals of L.C. Wurtele, 1855, Isabel Sylvia Rankin, 1901, and those apparently kept by Louisa M. Fair, 1895–1907, describe the social environment in which the Wurtele and related families lived.

Account Book, 1946-1967. 3 cm (volume 1).

The account book records the various expenses and charges incurred by and in a law office as well as income received from stock dividends.

Birthday Books, n.d. .5 cm (volume 1).

Records of important birthdays which include some family members.

Scrapbooks, n.d., 1857-1942. 15 cm (volume 2).

The scrapbooks contain poetry and engravings of varying types as well as numerous newspaper clippings, which are, for the most part, obituaries for members of the extended Wurtele family.

Autograph Album, 1921-1930. 1 cm (volume 2).

Autographs, sketches and poetry accumulated by the Fair family during their travels in Canada and Europe.

Short Story, n.d. 9 pages (volume 2).

Short story entitled "My Aunt Nancy's Engagement Ring".
