Arthur Chiel was born in Taylor, Pennsylvania on Dec. 16, 1920. He graduated from Yeshiva University in 1943 and received ordination at the Jewish Institute of Religion in 1946. In 1949, Rabbi Chiel moved to Winnipeg to become the director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation at the University of Manitoba. In 1951 he founded the Department of Judaic Studies at the university. In 1952 he became the first spiritual leader of the Rosh Pina Synagogue a Conservative Congregation which he had helped to found that year. Rabbi Chiel was the first historian of Manitoba Jewry. His books Jewish Experiences in Early Manitoba (1955) and a social history, The Jews in Manitoba (1961) are still the major source works for study of the Jewish community. For the latter work he received his D.H.L. from the Jewish Theological Seminary. In 1957 he left Winnipeg for the Genesis Hebrew Center, Tuckahoe, New In 1962 he become rabbi of Congregation B'nai Jacob, Woodbridge, Connecticut where he served until his death on August 26, 1983.

		Note: The Rosh Pina Synagogue was founded in 1892 as the center of the North Winnipeg Jewish community. It was destroyed by fire and the site left vacant. In 1942 the heirs of the traditions and assets of the old congregation combined forces with a group seeking to establish a new congregation. The result was the new Rosh Pina Synagogue which was dedicated in 1952 with Rabbi Chiel as the spiritual leader. The Rosh Pina agreement (1903) in the collection is a copy of a seat sale contract from the original synagogue.
