The file includes notes on the McGillivray and Metcalfe Papers and on several other units. In France, Fee visited the Paris Office of the P.A.C. In Italy he attended the Third International Congress on Archives, which was held in Florence. The file also contains a pamphlet, "The Selection of Archives for Permanent Preservation" by J.H. Collingridge (published by the Third International Congress on Archives, Florence, 1956.)
