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


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MG 30 BEAUDRY, Laurent M.A. (1886-1966). Public Servant. E 151

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Laurent Beaudry was born on 6 November 1886 in the Province of Quebec. He received his education at Laval and Oxford Universities. A Rhodes Scholar, he received both an M.A. and L.L.D. at Oxford.

Beaudry joined the Department of External Affairs in 1927, and his first posting was as first secretary to the Canadian Legation at Washington. The next year he returned to Ottawa and in 1929 was promoted to the rank of Counsellor in the Assistant Under-Secretary's office. From 1935 to 1947, he was the Assistant Under-Secretary and, from 1947 to his retirement in 1948, Beaudry was the Associate Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs.
