INTRODUCTION

Finding aid no. 409 provides a descriptive list of the papers of Sir Frederick Philipse Robinson available on reel M-204 (at the end of the reel). The list also appears on the microfilm before the papers they describe. A detailed biographical sketch is included with the papers.

Major-General Sir Frederick Philipse Robinson(1763-1852) served in Canada 1814-1816. He acted as Provisional Lieutenant-Governor of Upper Canada from 1 July to 21 September 1815.

Copied in 1957 from originals in the possession of Mr. Christopher Robinson, Q.C.; Ottawa.

Finding Aid No.409 provides a descriptive list of the papers. Material of Canadian interest in the papers consists of a copy of Thomas Ridout's report on public lands, 8 March 1815; and address from Kingston on Robinson's departure from Upper Canada, 6 October 1815; and an advertisement by Peter Robinson regarding the sale of Crown Lands, 27 May 1833. Other material relates primarily to personal commissions, appointments, and rewards for service.
