

FRENCH, CAPTAIN CECIL, 1916-1919. 1932-1933. 1 foot.

Captain Cecil French, who graduated from McGill University in 1894, served in the Great War with the Canadian Army Veterinary Corps. He was chiefly responsible for preparing the typescript of a history of the Canadian Army Veterinary Corps in the Great War.

The French Papers comprise material used in the compilation of The Canadian Army Veterinary Corps in the Great War and an earlier short narrative relating to the organization and administration of the Canadian Army Veterinary Services and Remounts plus two copies of typescripts of the Canadian Army Veterinary Corps' history.
