WILLIAM LAWSON GRANT

William Lawson Grant (1872-1935), son of George Monro Grant, was born in Halifax, N.S. and educated at Queen's University (M.A., 1894) and at Balliol College, Oxford (B.A., 1898). He began his teaching career at Upper Canada College and St. Andrews College, leaving the latter in 1904 to attend the Université de Paris. From 1906-10 he was Beit lecturer in colonial history at Oxford and from 1910-15 professor of colonial history at Queen's University. After serving with the C.E.F. in the Great War, during which time he attained the rank of major, he became principal of Upper Canada College in 1917, a position he held until his death.

He edited the <u>Voyages of Samuel de Champlain</u> (1907) and edited and translated for the Champlain Society Lescarbots <u>History of New France</u> (3 vols., 1907-14). He was joint editor with H. E. Egerton of <u>Canadian Constitutional Development</u> (1908) and with J. Munro of <u>Acts of the Privy Council, Colonial Series</u> (1907-10). He was the author of The <u>Ontario High School History of Canada</u> (1914); of a biography of his father (1904), written in collaboration with C. F. Hamilton; and of <u>The Tribune of Nova Scotia: A Chronicle of Joseph Howe</u> (1915).

MRS. WILLIAM LAWSON GRANT 1889-1958 6'4"

Mrs. W. L. Grant (1880-1963), the former Maude Erskine Parkin, daughter of Sir George Robert and Lady Parkin, was born in Fredericton. She was educated in Switzerland, at Bishop Strachan School, Toronto, and at McGill University from which she graduated in Arts in 1903. For several years until 1911 she was warden of Ashburne Hall, University of Manchester.

In 1911 she married W. L. Grant, professor of Colonial History at Queen's University, who in 1917 became Headmaster of U.C.C. Following her husband's death in 1935, she was made warden of the Royal Victoria College, McGill University, a post she held from 1937 to 1940.

Until her death in 1963, Mrs. Grant was associated with many welfare and education groups.
