Introduction

This finding aid provides listings of the papers accumulated by members of the King—Stewart and related families in Nova Scotia, 1803-1901. The inventory entry and file list provide general descriptions of the collection. A detailed description of the contents of each individual file is available in the descriptive list.

The papers are arranged by author and recipient, with the exception of some files in Volume 4 where documents have been grouped by generic type. Within each file, documents have been arranged in chronological order.

Further information concerning these papers and the individuals whose names appear in them is available in "The King-Stewart Letters" by Charles S.A. Ritchie. Less detailed biographical sketches are also contained in this finding aid.

Biographical Sketches

The following list provides basic information about the correspondents in this collection which may be helpful in understanding the relationships between members of the King and Stewart families.

Harry King (1807-1865) - barrister; later Judge of the Probate Court for the County of Hants at Windsor, N.S.

Margaret Halliburton Fraser (Halli) (1812-c.1884) fiancée of Harry King; lived in Halifax with her Aunt and Uncle, the Robies.

Harry and Halli were married in 1831 and lived in Windsor, N.S. They subsequently had four daughters.

Simon Bradstreet Robie (1770-1858) - President of the Council of Nova Scotia; uncle of Halli, with whom she and her sister lived after the death of their parents.

Elizabeth Robie (d. 1872) - wife of S.B. Robie; Halli's "Aunt Robie" of the letters; a sister of Halli's mother.

Elizabeth Uniacke (née Fraser) - Halli's sister; married Andrew Uniacke; later lived in London, England.

Amelia King - youngest daughter of Harry and Halli; married Charles James Stewart c.1858, son of the Honourable Alexander Stewart.

Alexander Stewart (1794-1865) - Master of the Rolls in Nova Scotia; also held several other political posts.

Mrs. Sewall - sister of S.B. Robie; lived in Boston.

Reverend William B. King - brother of Harry; headmaster of Windsor Academy and later a university professor.

The King-Stewart Letters

The bulk of this correspondence consists of letters exchanged in the years 1829-1832, between Harry King, first aged 22, a young barrister of Windsor, Nova Scotia, and his fiancée Margaret Halliburton Fraser (always known as Halli; an abbreviation of her second name), first aged 17 and living in Halifax with her uncle and aunt.

Harry King's father, the Reverend William Curtis King, then Rector of Windsor, was an Englishman whose family came from Odiham in Hampshire. After leaving Oxford he had been an English country clergyman previous to his immigration to Nova Scotia. His first wife, Harry's mother, a Miss de Wolf, had died and he had recently remarried.

Halli Fraser's family came from Pictou, Nova Scotia. Her grandfather, an officer in a Highland regiment, had settled there and married Miss Creighton, the daughter of Colonel Creighton, the founder of Lunenburg. Halli's parents both died when she was a child and she and her sister Elizabeth were adopted by their uncle and aunt, the Honourable Simon Bradstreet Robie, then President of the Council of Nova Scotia, his wife (the "Aunt Robie" of the letters) being a sister of the late Mrs. Fraser.

Every day a coach carried the mail to and from Halifax and Windsor, and Halifax was within an easy day's journey of Windsor so that Harry paid fairly frequent visits to his fiancée. His letters give a picture of daily life in the small town, or village, of Windsor which was dominated by King's University, a strictly Anglican institution attended by the sons of most of the "Establishment" figures in the Colony. The University set the tone for a small society which prided itself on its gentility and considered itself somewhat superior to other villages and small towns of Nova Scotia. Harry King was concerned with the affairs of the University which he had so recently quitted as a student, his professional work, the village gossip, and his experiences travelling through the Colony on assizes.

He was interested in local politics, religious of a Low Church persuasion, a reader of everything from sermons to novels, romances and poetry (a great admirer of Byron). These are love letters, in the sense that his passion for Halli comes alive in the letters. He is an engaging correspondent, lively and impulsive, with an eye for the comedy of life.

Halli's letters, in their immaculate copperplate writing, are those of a well brought-up young miss of the period. Owing to her uncle's political and social position in Halifax she was involved in the military balls, bazaars and Government House activities of the capital, but she describes these with a hint of disapproval. Indeed she is, I am sorry to say, something of a prig.

The couple were married in 1831 and there is a further batch of letters exchanged between them as a married couple when separated. Harry King died at the age of 58, but his widow survived him for nearly twenty years. They had four daughters and seem to have been a model of married bliss, Harry pursuing his profession in Windsor. He does not seem to have been very good about money matters and his later years were darkened by financial troubles.

In order to follow the contents of the letters it may be useful to identify some of the characters mentioned in them. In Harry's letters there are references - none too enthusiastic - to his step-mother, and also to his baby half-brother Benjamin. In addition he had two brothers - Otis, a farmer near Windsor, and the Reverend William B. King, then headmaster of the Windsor Academy, a school for boys associated with the University, and later University professor. His letters contain references to a row created by his brother William who had succeeded in enraging the Bishop of Nova Scotia, Bishop Inglis, and the Chief Justice, Sir Brenton Halliburton (whose daughter was married to Bishop Inglis), by his punishment of Dr. Inglis' son Charles, then attending the school, for "disobedience, obstinacy and insolence". The incident was finally forgotten, however, after witnesses swore that the fifty stripes on the hand were not cruelly administered; not an attractive sidelight on the personality of the Reverend Mr. King.

Harry King had two aunts living in Windsor who crop up in the letters - Aunt Thomas and Aunt MacKay. His cousins, through his grandmother who was a Miss Otis of Loyalist descent, were the Haliburtons (not to be confused with the Halliburtons of Halifax). The most prominent member of this family who appears in the letters was Judge T.C. Haliburton, author of "Sam Slick". Other family friends included a fellow lawyer, Lewis Wilkins, and the Fraser family of Gerrish Halli, the house which in the letters Harry wished that he could buy for himself and Halli. One of his greatest friends was Wray, a young Anglo-Irishman and an officer of the small British garrison in Windsor. Another, a friend from university days, was a fellow barrister, John Ritchie, the "John" of these letters. John Ritchie was also in love with Halli Fraser. By arrangement between the two young men, or by the toss of a coin, John Ritchie proposed to her first and was refused.

Halli's eldest sister Elizabeth, who appears so frequently in these letters, married Andrew Mitchell Uniacke, the youngest son of the Attorney General of Nova Scotia, the Honourable Richard John Uniacke of Mount Uniacke. She seems to have been of a more worldly disposition than Halli and, as her later letters reveal, a considerable snob.

Another batch of letters are those of Simon Robie and his wife (Uncle and Aunt Robie). These include a spirited account of a shipwreck while they were enroute to England, and a description of their stay in that country in 1824.

Another packet contains letters written in the 1850s and 1860s from London from Elizabeth Uniacke to her widowed sister Halli King in Nova Scotia. These letters give a picture of London social life as seen by an expatriate Colonial. The Uniackes had settled in London and Elizabeth recounts all the gossip she can collect about her English (preferably titled) friends and the doings of visitors from Nova Scotia. The abundant references to the Collins family are accounted for by the fact that her daughter had married Brenton Collins, the son of the Nova Scotia millionaire Enos Collins, and had settled at a house called Dunorlan, an elaborate mansion in the neighbourhood of Tunbridge Wells. Elizabeth's son, the Reverend Fitz Uniacke, also comes in for a good deal of honourable mention.

The youngest daughter of Harry and Halli King, Amelia King, married Charles James Stewart, the only son of the Honourable Alexander Stewart, C.B.E., Master of the Rolls in Nova Scotia. Alexander Stewart had had a varied political career in Nova Scotia (see Canadian Dictionary of National Biography). One package of letters contains correspondence addressed to him by various Lieutenant-Governors of Nova Scotia, including Lord Falkland, Lord Normanby, Sir Colin Campbell and Sir Fenwick Williams. With these is included a letter from John Inglis, the first Bishop of Nova Scotia.

Harry King (1807-1865) was the son of the Reverend William Curtis King who emigrated from Oxford, England during the 1790's and settled in Horton, Hants County, Nova Scotia, and of Miss De Wolf. Harry King attended King's College and became a barrister at Windsor, N.S. In 1832 he married Margaret Halliburton (Halli) Fraser (1812-c.1884), the niece of Simon Bradstreet Robie (1770-1858) of Halifax. The Kings subsequently had four daughters, the youngest of whom, Amelia (Minnie), married Charles James Stewart circa 1858, the son of the Honourable Alexander Stewart (1794-1865).

Further biographical information about members of the King-Stewart family is available in the introduction to the finding aid, "The King-Stewart Letters" by Charles S. A. Ritchie.

Both the papers and F.A. 577 were microfilmed in 1983 and are also available on reel C-10337.

Correspondence, 1803-1878, exchanged between members of the King-Stewart and related families. The majority of this correspondence is between Harry King and his fiancée, Halli Fraser, 1829-1831 (volumes 1-3). While these letters are of a personal nature, they also provide commentary on events and activities of individuals in Halifax and Windsor, N.S. Other correspondents include Halli Fraser's sister Elizabeth and her husband Andrew Uniacke, the King's daughter Amelia (Minnie) and her husband Charles James Stewart, the Honourable Alexander Stewart, Simon Bradstreet Robie, his wife Elizabeth and his sisters Hannah Robie and Mrs. Sewell of Boston (volumes 3-4).
