The Society of Friends, which originated in seventeenth century England during the Civil War, was established in Canada at the end of the eighteenth and beginning of the nineteenth centuries by Friends who migrated from the U.S.A., largely as a result of the unpopularity which their attitude toward the War of the American Revolution had brought them. They came chiefly from the States of the Atlantic seaboard and settled mainly in the Bay of Quinté (1798), Niagara (1799), and Yonge Street (1804) areas of Upper Canada.

Microfilmed in 1974 by the Ontario Archives, mainly from originals belonging to the Canadian Yearly Meeting of Friends which are on deposit with the University of Western Ontario, London. The P.A.C. received its microfilm copy in 1975 through an exchange agreement.

Relevant sections of the Ontario Archives' shelf list appear at the beginning of each reel and the more precise P.A.C. finding aid No. 20 is also available on reels M-3797 and C-12563. Finding aid No. 20 consists of a descriptive shelf and conversion list with an introduction and index.

The records, arranged in four series, consist chiefly of the minute books of Meetings in Ontario. Series B and D also contain a few items for Meetings in British Columbia, Alberta and Saskatchewan. Other records include treasurer's books; registers of births, marriages, deaths, disownments, removals, etc.; the printed proceedings of Yearly Meetings; pamphlets; periodicals such as the Young Friends' Review and the Canadian Friend; deeds relating to property; papers relating to individuals, families, and Quaker institutions such as Pickering College; photographs (largely unidentified); genealogical studies and notes; historical sketches and articles of various sorts; and newspaper cuttings.

Series A (formerly C for Conservative):

Official records. (reels M-3797 to M-3807).

Proceedings and minutes of Canada Yearly Meeting (Conservative), 1881-1955, and minute books and registers of its subordinate Meetings, 1816-1964. (Note that the registers contain personal information dating back to 1734). The organization is alphabetical by name (i.e. place) of Meeting, chronological by type of Meeting (i.e. Preparative, Monthly, Quarterly, etc.).

Series B (formerly O for Orthodox):

Official records. (reels M-3808 to M-3825)

Proceedings and minutes of Canada Yearly Meeting (Orthodox), 1810-1955, and minute books and registers of its subordinate Meetings, 1798-1970. (Note that the registers contain personal information dating back to 1769). The organization is similar to that of Series A.

Series C (former H for Hicksite):

Official records. (reels M-3826 to M-3845)

Proceedings and minutes of Genesee Yearly Meeting (Hicksite), 1843-1955, and minute books and registers of its subordinate Meetings, (1799-1974). (Note that the registers contain personal information dating back to 1727). The organization is similar to that of Series A.

Series D Miscellaneous papers, 1788-1969

(reels M-3846 to M-3854)

The material in this series pertains to all three branches of the Society without distinction and includes copies of material dating back to 1756. The arrangement is in four sub-series organized as follows:

INTRODUCTION

The original records of the Friends in Canada, available on the 58 reels of microfilm held by the Public Archives of Canada, are derived from the official archives of the Religious Society of Friends. This archives, which is on loan deposit in the library of the University of Western Ontario, is the property of Canadian Yearly Meeting of Friends. Its nucleus was formed by the manuscript material used by a former Professor of History at the University of Western Ontario, Dr. Arthur Garratt Dorland, in writing A History of the Society of Friends (Quakers) in Canada, (Toronto : 1927) and The Quakers in Canada, A History, (Toronto : 1968). When the Canadian Friends Historical Association was founded in 1972, it took an interest in searching for other records of the Society and in pressing for them to be microfilmed. In 1975 the material assembled was microfilmed by the Ontario Archives, and the P.A.C. obtained copies of the reels in the same year.

Origin of the Society of Friends

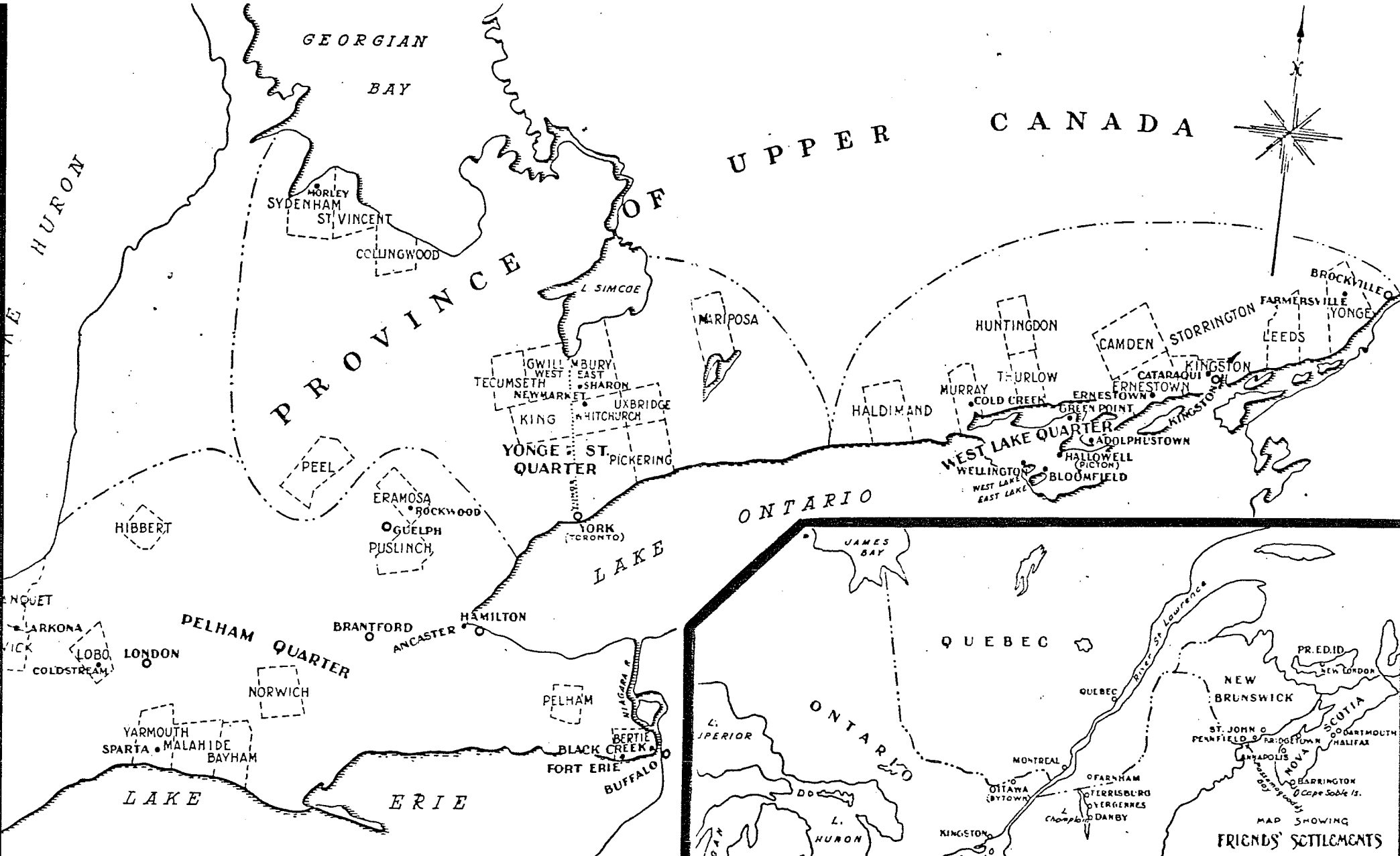
The Religious Society of Friends, popularly called Quakers, originated in England in the middle of the seventeenth century at a time of great religious and political turmoil during the Civil War. The established religion of the period was notable for its formalism and deadness, and that of the Puritan opposition

was not appreciably more vital. In consequence, there were many who craved a real personal experience of God, and who found in the unrest of the times encouragement to seek for it outside the recognized ecclesiastical structures. Many of these formed groups of "seekers", who sometimes established small and often very strange sects of Independents, Baptists, Diggers, Levellers, Ranters, etc.; many others, however, remained unattached, questing individuals. One of these latter was George Fox (1624-1691), who is usually regarded as the founder of the Society of Friends, in so far as it can be said to have had a founder.

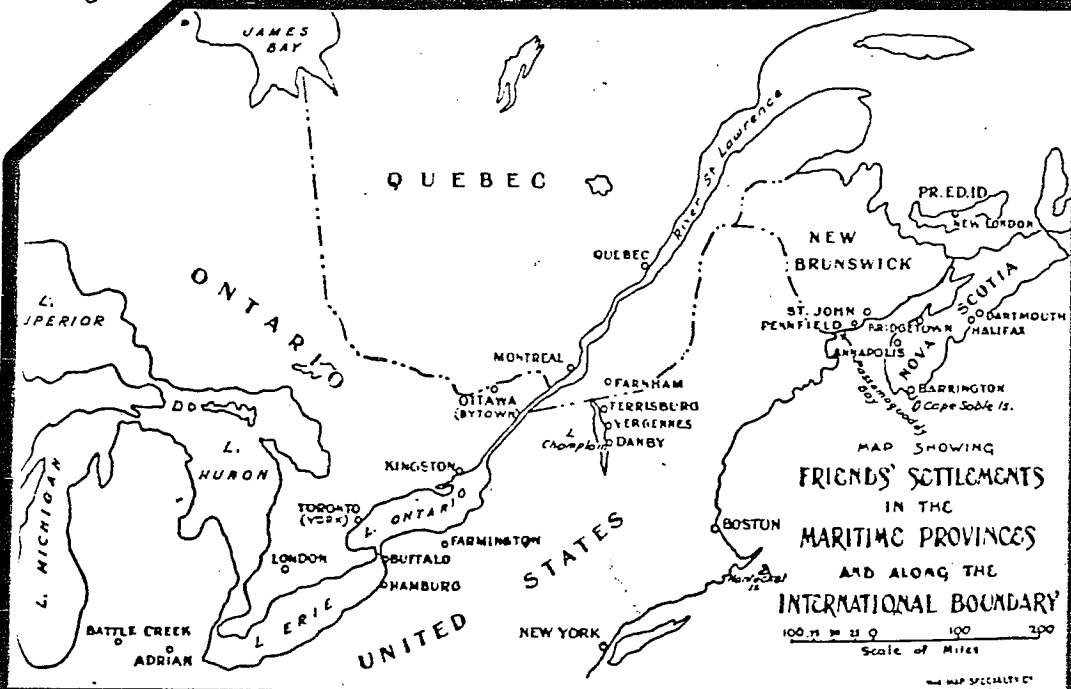
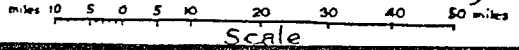
Fox was the son of a Leicestershire weaver, who left home at the age of 19, tormented by his own inner struggle with spiritual darkness. After several years of vainly trying to obtain help from both Anglican and Puritan clergy, he finally resorted to the Bible alone and sought a cure for his spiritual disease directly from God by giving his attention to the inward leading which came to be called the "inner Light." Having at last succeeded in resolving his personal spiritual crisis by this means, he came to believe that reliance on merely outward things in religion was useless. In 1647 he began "declaring Truth", challenging the lifeless forms of "outward religion" which he encountered, and making preaching expeditions to share with others his own spiritual discoveries. His emphasis on the importance of repentance, of personal striving after truth, and of the need for receiving this at first not second hand, spoke to the condition of many of his hearers, so that he began to attract a number of followers. Small groups of people with similar attitudes in Westmoreland and north Lancashire came under his influence, and little associations of "Friends" were formed. The zeal of the Friends led many to tour the country "publishing Truth" and adding to the number of Friends in the process.

It was not the intention of the early Friends to establish a separate sect, and any form of external organization was in fact difficult to reconcile with their main emphasis on the importance of individual reliance on the guidance of the inner Light. Concern to oversee the spiritual welfare of one another, however, and a number of other practical considerations, led eventually to the development of a distinct Society of Friends which gradually became quite strictly organized. As A.N. Brayshaw* has pointed out, however, it exhibited a "form of Christianity widely divergent from the prevalent

types, being a religious fellowship which has no formulated creed demanding definite subscription, and no liturgy, priesthood or outward sacrament, and which gives to women an equal place with men in church organization." This unique character should be kept in mind at all times when dealing with Quaker records, in order that misunderstandings based on invalid comparisons with other denominations should not arise. It needs to be appreciated that, again in Brayshaw's words, "Quakerism is an atmosphere, a manner of life, a method of approaching questions, a habit and attitude of mind", rather than a faith or a church in the senses usually implied by those words.

Canadian Friends

The growth of the Society of Friends in what is now Canada, was almost entirely the result of immigration from the Atlantic colonies. The earliest settlements, by New England fishermen, began in the maritimes in 1762 at Barrington and Dartmouth, in Nova Scotia, and at Pennfield in New Brunswick. These did not survive and their records are not found in the present collection.

The main settlements, in modern Ontario, resulted from rather later migrations into Upper Canada, which occurred partly because of the westward pioneering spirit of the times, and partly because of the hostility from patriot neighbours experienced by many Friends during and after the American Revolution, because of their unpopular attitude toward that war. As shown in the accompanying map, there were three areas of concentration : the Bay of Quinté district, where the first meeting was held in Adolphustown in 1798; the Niagara district, where Pelham and Black Creek were settled in 1799; and the Yonge Street settlement established by Timothy Rogers in 1804. Friends in these three areas were eventually organized as West Lake, Pelham and Yonge Street Quarterly Meetings respectively, by the authority of New York Yearly Meeting. It is the records of the Meetings in these areas which form the bulk of the present collection.

It was not until the end of the nineteenth century and the beginning of the twentieth that Friends began to move into the West and establish Meetings there. Most of these are still too young to have accumulated much archival material, and those that have, have been inclined to think that their records would be better deposited locally in such repositories as the library of Calgary University, or the Provincial Archives of British Columbia. A few of the records for British Columbia, Alberta and Saskatchewan are included with those for Ontario in the section devoted to the Orthodox branch of the Society, but apart from these the archives of Friends in the West are not represented in this collection.

The Records

In 1973 Edward Phelps, the Special Collections Librarian at the University of Western Ontario, made a preliminary arrangement and inventory of the Quaker material under his care. He divided it into three main sections in accordance with the divisions among the Canadian Friends which had occurred in the course of the nineteenth century as a result of schisms in the American parent meetings to which the Canadian meetings were at that time subordinate. The first separation occurred in 1828 as the result of a controversy which arose between those Friends who were influenced by the evangelical movement of the period and felt the need of an increased emphasis on doctrine, and other Friends who supported Elias Hicks (1748-1830) in opposing what they considered a novel attempt at imposing doctrinal formulations upon Friends. The two sides in the disagreement came to be described as Orthodox and Hicksite Friends, as a means of identification although the Hicksites in particular did not care for such names. The second separation, which reached Canada in 1881, occurred in the Orthodox part of the Society over matters of practice, and resulted in two sections which were distinguished by the appellations Orthodox and Conservative. As a consequence of these divisions, there came to be two, and later three, distinct branches of the Society of Friends in Canada, with parallel organizations, existing side by side in what

were essentially the same localities, and having much the same names. Accordingly, the need to maintain the records in three carefully distinguished series was considered desirable, and these were established and denominated C (for Conservative), O (for Orthodox), and H (for Hicksite), respectively.

When the Ontario Archives undertook the microfilming of the collection in 1975, this same basic division was retained (although the C, O, and H series were lettered A, B, and C respectively). The internal order of the subseries was, however, somewhat altered. In this finding aid the original call numbers are noted in a column on the left of the shelf list, and the researcher may in fact find it more helpful at times to follow the old sequence indicated by these numbers than the new one. The new numbers on the right, however, are the ones which determine the sequence of the material on the microfilm, and they should be used in all citations of the documents. It should be noted that the printed minutes and the material in the fourth or D Series of miscellaneous material do not have old numbers, and neither do a few items which were specially borrowed for filming from sources other than the Archives at the University of Western Ontario.

Within each of the three Series A, B, and C mentioned above, the arrangement of the material (which consists mainly of minute books and registers) attempts to follow the pattern of Meetings for Discipline or Business by which the Society is organized. There was a Yearly Meeting of each branch : Canada Yearly Meeting (Conservative); Canada Yearly Meeting (Orthodox); and Genesee Yearly Meeting (Hicksite). The minutes of these Yearly Meetings were made the first of the subseries within each of the three main series. Ideally, the subseries which followed were intended to be the records of all the subordinate meetings (Half Yearly or Quarterly Meetings, Monthly Meetings, Preparative Meetings) arranged alphabetically by the names of the places which gave them their official titles. These were to be further broken down by type, that is by meetings of men and women Friends and of ministers and elders, etc ., and then arranged chronologically. This scheme of arrangement was, however, easier to decide upon than to implement. There were four basic characteristics of the material which led to a considerable number of anomalies in the listing, that the researcher is urged to keep in mind when using this finding aid.

The first obstacle encountered in carrying this plan of arrangement into effect was that the neat separation of the three sets of records was practically impossible. In all the meetings there was no regularity in the pattern of which side of the division kept the original minute book and which began a new one at the time of the separations. Similarly, at the time of reunion, although organic union of the three branches was not achieved until 1955, the Yearly Meetings of the Orthodox and Hicksite Friends began to meet together in 1928, and to appoint one Clerk in 1941, while the Conservative Friends joined the others in the same informal way in 1944 and united in the appointment of Clerks from 1946. Thus, the clear lines of demarcation between the records of the three branches of the Society tend to be somewhat blurred at all levels of the organization.

The second problem arose in connection with the alphabetical arrangement of the subordinate Meetings, since the official name of a Meeting might change over time, sometimes more than once in a single minute book. This meant that any careful listing of all the names appearing in the subseries inevitably destroyed the obviously alphabetical basis of the arrangement and made it appear to have little discernible order. Moreover, in instances where such name changes were not noticed at the time of arrangement, as in the case of the Pelham/Norwich Meetings of the Conservative branch of Friends, they could also result in the creation of two subseries where there should only be one.

A third difficulty of the same sort occurred in connection with the arrangement by the type of meeting. A Meeting might begin as a Half Yearly Meeting and become a Quarterly Meeting, for example, or change from a Preparative to a Monthly Meeting, and perhaps back again to a Preparative Meeting, within the same minute book, so that an appearance of incoherence in the listing of the records was unavoidable.

A fourth and even greater complication attended the separate listing of the Meetings of men and women Friends, since again the practice was not constant. In early times the custom was for the men and women to meet separately and keep separate records but, towards the end of the nineteenth century, meetings in joint sessions of men and women Friends became the norm. Even in early times, however, where a group of Friends was small, joint sessions might be customary until the growth of the community led to a

decision to establish separate meetings. Usually when a separate Meeting of women began, they started a new minute book, and when they joined with the men their book would be closed and their minutes continued in the men's book. This meant that the continuation of the women's minutes are often, though not always, found in preceding volumes, following as they do in the sequence of the men's Meetings. In some cases, however, probably when there was more space left in the women's book than in the men's, it was the men's minutes which were continued in the women's book, often many volumes away.

All these variations within the material itself have led to some rather disconcerting irregularities in the sequence and chronology of the books as they appear in the listing. If the material is to be used to the best advantage, the researcher needs to keep all these anomalies constantly in mind. Moreover, although an attempt has been made to provide a fairly precise listing of the actual minute books, the reader should be warned that some of the changes within the books may have been overlooked, and that no attempt has been made to list the loose items which were frequently stuffed into the back, and sometimes the front, covers of the books. These often include rough minutes, letters, bills, notes, printed items, and other miscellaneous papers, which may occasionally belong to much earlier or even much later dates.

Lastly, a few words should be said about the fourth or D Series. This contains miscellaneous documents to which no original numbers were assigned in the preliminary inventory of the University of Western Ontario, where they were listed merely by the numbers of the boxes in which they were located. These have been subdivided into four subseries:

- D-1 Material Relating to Places (Alphabetically arranged).
- D-2 Material Relating to Individuals and Families (Alphabetically arranged).
- D-3 Photographs (Persons, Meetings, Buildings).
- D-4 Publications (Books, Pamphlets, Periodicals).

In this section the branches of the Society to which these documents pertain have seldom been identified, and the onus of making such attributions is left to the researcher. It should also be noted that the material relating to Pickering College (D-1-12) is extremely miscellaneous, and that the listing in this finding aid gives only a very partial account of the documents which it includes.

Information Useful to Non-Friends

Each small local community of Friends held a Meeting for Worship.

Notes on Organization

The co-operation and coherence of all the meetings for worship was obtained by the organization of Meetings for Discipline (business meetings) according to a pattern established in the seventeenth century, which is essentially that still followed by the Society. During the period covered by the majority of the records in this collection, the pattern was generally as follows:

Preparative Meeting

Friends Meeting for Worship soon established a Preparative Meeting. This Preparative Meeting handled all the purely local business of the congregation, such as the discipline of its members, arrangement of worship meetings, care of the meeting house and cemetery, etc. It held its sittings monthly preceding the Monthly Meeting to which it belonged.

Monthly Meeting

A Monthly Meeting consisted of one or more Preparative Meetings. This was the Meeting in which a Friend's membership was held, consequently the membership registers and registers of births, deaths,

marriages, disownments, transfers, etc., which are of special interest to genealogical researchers, are always to be found in the records of the Monthly Meetings. It was the Monthly Meeting which appointed Overseers, as well as Overseers of the Poor, for each of its Preparative Meetings. It was also responsible for legal matters such as trusteeship of property and funds belonging to the Meetings.

Quarterly Meeting or Half Yearly Meeting (in the case of the Hicksite Friends)

A Quarterly or Half Yearly Meeting consisted of two or more Monthly Meetings. It handled business considered too difficult for the Monthly Meeting to manage on its own authority, and exercised a disciplinary supervision over its subordinate meetings.

Yearly Meetings

Associated Quarterly Meetings formed a Yearly Meeting. To some extent these would correspond with a geographical area, but it should be noted that although place names were often used as designations, no Meeting was ever identifiable with a political constituency. (For example, there are several Yearly Meetings in what is now the U.S.A. and London Yearly Meeting has had component Meetings as far afield as Australia.) The Yearly Meeting exercised a disciplinary supervision over all its subordinate meetings, and was in fact responsible for the establishment and modification of the official Book of Discipline by which they were all regulated. The annual Epistles which were sent out to all the other Yearly Meetings with which a Yearly Meeting was in correspondence (fellowship) went out over the signature of the appointed Correspondent of the Yearly Meeting.

Representative Meeting (or Meeting for Sufferings)

The Representative Meeting was a standing committee of the Yearly Meeting which conducted the business of the Yearly Meeting during the year intervening between annual sessions of the full body. It was composed of representatives of the Quarterly Meetings and all recorded ministers and elders.

Women's Meetings for Discipline

As mentioned above, it was customary for the women Friends to hold their meetings for discipline separately from the men until the latter part of the nineteenth century. Their organization was very similar, except that their Monthly Meetings did not disown, transfer or receive members without the concurrence of the men's Meeting.

Meetings of Ministers and Elders

Friends did not ordain ministers in the manner of other Christian denominations. They regarded the selection of a minister as the function of the Spirit of God. When it seemed to other ministers and elders that a person appeared to be thus appointed by God, the Preparative Meeting of Ministers and Elders proposed his or her name to the Monthly Meeting. If the Monthly Meeting concurred in their opinion, that Friend was duly acknowledged as a minister of that Monthly Meeting. He or she was not appointed as a minister to any other meeting, though if such a minister felt a concern to go on a religious visit and minister to Friends elsewhere, he or she might apply for and receive an authorizing minute from his or her Monthly Meeting. If one desired to pay such a visit outside the limits of the Quarterly Meeting, authorization had to be sought from the Yearly Meeting, with the approbation of various other meetings, such as the Quarterly Meeting and various meetings of Ministers and Elders. Ministers were not paid, though the expenses of their religious visits might be met by the meetings which authorized or received them. The appointment of elders followed the same procedure as that for ministers, and again both men and women Friends were appointed. Ministers and elders met together regularly in Yearly, Quarterly, and Preparative Meetings of Ministers and Elders. It should be noted that the Preparative Meeting of Ministers and Elders was not, as might be supposed, a meeting of the ministers and elders of a Preparative Meeting of Friends, but rather of the ministers and elders of a Monthly Meeting of Friends. It met every three months and was in reality a meeting preparative to the Quarterly Meeting, not to the Monthly Meeting. It should be noted that in the later records alternative names for the Meetings of Ministers and Elders are found, such as the Meeting of Ministry and Oversight, or of Ministry, Counsel and Oversight, etc.

Representatives

It was usual for each Preparative Meeting to appoint two representatives to attend the Monthly Meeting and to present the business entrusted to them to the superior meeting. Similarly, Monthly Meetings appointed representatives to attend the Quarterly Meeting, and Quarterly Meetings appointed representatives to the Yearly Meeting. It should be stressed, however, that these representatives were only appointed to ensure minimum representation and to act as spokesmen responsible for the proper presentation of their Meeting's business.. All Friends were entitled to attend all Meetings of Friends, within the Yearly Meeting of which their Meeting was a part, and were encouraged to do so. Similarly all ministers and elders were entitled and encouraged to attend the Meetings of Ministers and Elders.

Mode of Conducting Business

Each Meeting appointed a Clerk who acted as the officer responsible for making the record of the Meeting inscribed in the Minute Book. Decisions were not made on the basis of a majority of votes; it was the task of the Clerk to "take the sense of the meeting" and state it in the form of a minute, which he or she would alter until there was no member of the Meeting who raised objections to it. If no agreement could be reached, the matter would either be "laid over" to a subsequent Meeting or dropped.

Minutes

The minutes were the administrative instruments by which the Society's business was done. When a Preparative Meeting was set up or "laid down" (discontinued) it was done by a minute of the Monthly Meeting. Similarly Monthly Meetings were set up and laid down by the Quarterly Meeting, and Quarterly Meetings by the Yearly Meeting. A new Yearly Meeting was "set off" (separated from another) by a Minute of the parent Yearly Meeting. Copies of such minutes appear at the beginning of the minute books of new meetings, as their authority for existing. Copies of such minutes also constituted the authority of a travelling Minister to make a religious visit.

Queries

The Book of Discipline adopted by a Yearly Meeting included a list of Queries on the conduct of all Friends which had to be answered by the Preparative Meeting regularly and sent to the Monthly Meeting, which summarized the answers and submitted them to the Quarterly Meeting which in turn considered them and passed them on to the Yearly Meeting. A rather shorter list of Queries was similarly asked of the Preparative Meeting of Ministers and Elders.

Testimonies

A number of customs which were peculiar to the Friends were carefully adhered to by all members as a witness to others. These "testimonies" included:

- 1) Plainness of speech (avoidance of the use of the second person plural in addressing individuals, and of the polite use of the prefixes "Master", "Mistress", etc. to those who did not actually stand in that relation to them.)
- 2) Plainness of dress (avoidance of colours, elaborate hairstyles, hats, etc.)
- 3) Use of numbers to designate the days of the week and months of the year, instead of the names associated with pagan deities.
- 4) Refusal to bear arms.
- 5) Refusal to swear oaths.
- 6) Refusal to own slaves.

Disownment

Friends who disregarded the testimonies or whose conduct was unrepentantly unsatisfactory, were disowned (excluded from membership). For a time, one of the commonest reasons for disownment was "marrying out" (marrying a non-Friend) or attending a marriage celebrated by a priest, contrary to the principles of marriage followed by the Friends, who regarded the parties to a marriage as its only ministers before God and those who attended merely as witnesses.
