Shadd, Toronto item no. 17 (sister of Mary Ann) to David T. Williamson, original 28 years of age (Watchmaker and Clockmaker) 3 pages of St. Catharines, C.W., whom it appears Amelia C. had met sometime earlier, and was to marry shortly after. The writer was then substituting for her sister Mary Ann as Editor of the Provincial Freeman in Toronto. The rather "Singular" character of Amelia C., to which she herself refers in the letter, is borne out by the prudent and circumspect tone, lightened by a touch of humour, found in the letter itself. March 16, 1856 - From Emeline Shadd, teacher in item no. 18 Caledon Township, Peel County, C.W., to her original sister Mrs. A.C.S. (nee Amelia C. Shadd) 4 pages Williamson at St. Catharines, C.W. The letter largely describes the conditions, manners, mores and diversions of the Scottish settlers of Peel County in the mid-nineteenth century. The mention of Chester "County" (sic) most probably is a reference to Chester County, Pennsylvania, where Emeline and her sisters had lived and received their education
