EYRE PAPERS, 1841-1859 Major-General Sir William Eyre, 1805-1859

William Eyre, the younger son of vice-admiral Sir George Eyre, was born at Hatfield, England, on 21 October, 1805. He entered the army in 1823, as an ensign in the 6th regiment of foot, and rose to the rank of lieutenant-colonel commanding the 73rd in 1847. He served with distinction in the Kaffir wars of 1847 and 1851, and as a reward for his services was promoted to colonel, created a Commander of the Bath, and appointed an Aide de Camp to the Queen in 1853.

Following the outbreak of the Crimean War, Eyre commanded the second brigade of the 3rd division under Lord Cathcart, and was present at the battles of Alma and Inkerman. He succeeded to the command of the third division, with the rank of major-general, in December, 1854, and remained in the Crimea until the conclusion of the war. On the 5 July, 1855, Eyre was created a Knight Commander of the Bath, and on 3 June, 1856, with the local rank of lieutenant-general, he was appointed to the command of the forces in Canada. Eyre served as Commander-in-Chief in Canada for three years, and during the absence of the Governor General, Sir Edmund Head, he administered the country from the 20 June to the 2 November, 1857. The privations and hardships of the Crimean winter having destroyed his health, Eyre resigned his command in July, 1859 and returned to England where he died on the 18th of September of that year.

The Eyre Papers, consisting of the military and private papers, journals, letter books and order books of Major-General Sir William Eyre, K.C.B.; the Venerable John Eyre, Archdeacon of Nottingham; Colonel Henry Eyre; and Dr. C.R.B. Eyre are on deposit in the Public Record Office, London. In 1955 the Public

Archives of Canada microfilmed only those records of Major-General Sir William Eyre relating to Canada. Of the whole series (P.R.O. 30/46) containing twenty boxes, some twelve boxes, or 2479 folios. were filmed and a transcript of the P.R.O. Catalogue relating to these items is here appended.
