PREFACE

Part II of this finding aid provides a description of the selections pertaining to Newfoundland microfilmed (Reel A-422) in 1959 from the collection of Duckworth Manuscripts in the holdings of the National Maritime Museum, Greenwich, England. The titles of the series and their call numbers are somewhat mysterious, (since we have references to DUC/7, 2 and L which were apparently all in the old DUC/7, and to DUC/16) but they are given here as they appear to be indicated on the film. The collection was reorganized after the selections were microfilmed and the present class marks are indicated in parentheses in this finding aid, but not on the film. There are no page number on the documents, but arbitrary page numbers have been assigned in this finding aid so that the extent and location of items being described or referred to could be shown.

CONTENT

The material included in these selections, like that in Part I, relates mainly to Duckworth's official functions as Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Newfoundland, 1810-1813. The proportion of the material which pertains to his civil function as governor is smaller than in Part I, while that which pertains to his duties as Admiral is correspondingly larger. There are only a very few miscellaneous items of a more personal nature scattered through the collection. With six exceptions, all the papers derive from the years 1810-1812, and the greatest concentration of the material is in the year 1812.

In addition to the routine matters of business for the direction of his squadron, and the civil administration of Newfoundland, there are a number of topics of special interest dealt with. These include the efforts made by David Buchan of H.M.S. ADONIS to contact the Beothuk Indians. (Photocopies of these items are included in the PANL collection described in Part I, and a number of them

have been reproduced in The Beothucks or Red Indians, The Aboriginal Inhabitants of Newfoundland, by James P. Howley, (Cambridge University Press, 1915)). Other topics of interest are Dr. William Carson's plans for the establishment of a whaling industry in Newfoundland, and the War of 1812 as it affected Newfoundland.

ARRANGEMENT AND NOTES

The arrangement of the material on the reel is as follows:

DUC 7 (Now: 1810 - DUC/16; 1811 - DUC/17 and 1812 - DUC/18)

Squadron Papers and Some Official Reports on the Maritime Affairs of Newfoundland, 1810-1812 pp. 1-321

This first section is the one which contains material most similar to the papers in Part I. It includes correspondence, memoranda and memorials, a log of H.M.S. ALERT, and reports from the ships of the Newfoundland squadron. The reader should note that there are a number of miscellaneous items scattered through the section which belong to various series found in Part I, such as receipts, shipping returns, demands and reports of survey, reports of captures, and of the ages, statures, countries and trades of the crews of the ships of the squadron. There are also larger collections of such items, as for example:

The reader should note that these are not in the simple chronological order found in Part I, but are first arranged alphabetically under the names of the ships concerned, and only then chronologically.

DUC 2 (Now: 1810 - DUC/16; 1811 - DUC/17; and 1812 - DUC/18)

Official Papers Received from Ministers of State by Duckworth as Governor of Newfoundland, 1810-1812 pp. 322-450

There is no counterpart to this section in Part I. It consists mainly of official communications from the Secretary and Undersecretary of State for War and Colonies, as well as a few from other officials such as the Home Secretary, the Secretary at War, the Lords of the Admiralty and the Commissary in Chief. Most of the material consists of official circulars and copies of special issues of the London Gazette. There are also a number of sign manual warrants, and a few more personal communications making or answering queries arising out of Duckworth's duties as Governor of Newfoundland.

DUC L (Now: 1810 - DUC/16; 1811 - DUC/17; 1812 - DUC/18; 1813 - 1817 - DUC 19)

Collections of Autographs pp. 451-459

The call number, title and nature of this section of the material is particularly uncertain, but it appears to be a small number of selections from papers arranged under the names of their authors, including Rear-Admiral the Hon. James William King, Duckworth himself, Lord Liverpool, and the Duke of Northumberland. Topics of particular interest are Duckworth's application for a peerage, and his appointment to the command at Plymouth in 1815.

DUC 16 (Now: DUC/30)

Official Letter-Book Relating to Newfoundland, 1812 pp. 460-538

This is a most interesting item, since it is the only considerable body of out letters in the collections of Part I and Part II. It provides a most valuable complement to the in-coming correspondence for 1812

in Part I, and supplement to the register of letters and orders in Duckworth's Admiral's Journals, 1810-1812 (PANL pp. 5516-5841).

There are two series written at the two opposite ends of the letter-book. The first part (pp. 460-495) consists of general correspondence relating to Duckworth's business as Governor, dealing with topics such as the unexpected innovation of deducting the English property tax from the salaries of Newfoundland officials, convoy arrangements, the white lead for painting Government House, the case of Samuel Barnes' murder of James Toole, the payment of the High Sheriff's salary in Newfoundland instead of in England, queries re the law of marriage in Newfoundland, missionaries for Newfoundland, Duckworth's accounts, and a few personal letters. The second part (pp. 496-538) is entirely naval in content. It includes circulars and orders to his squadron, convoy directions, and communications with the Admiralty and Navy Board on subjects ranging from the survey of the coast of Newfoundland to supplies for his flagship.

RELATIONSHIP WITH PART I

Because of the appreciable differences in the material of Parts I and II, and their mode of arrangement, the researcher is advised to make careful use of the Table of Contents for their correlation, and to use the indexes of the two parts in close combination. A number of cross references have also been supplied in the descriptions of the material and in the notes to the series in Part I. These should afford a considerable amount of assistance, but the reader is warned that they are by no means exhaustive.

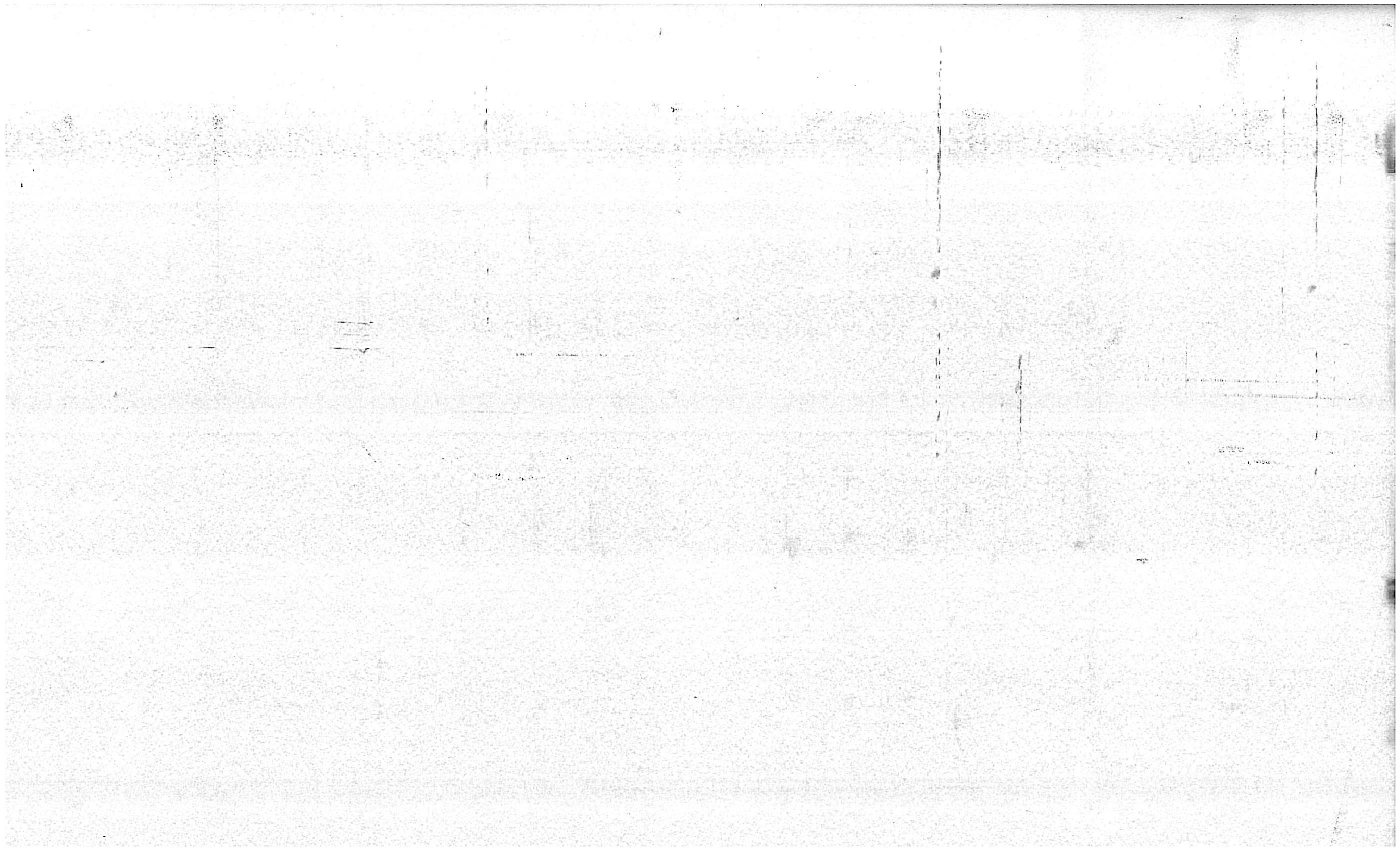
