General Henry Dives Townshend (1795-1882) served in Canada with the 41st Regiment as an ensign in the War of 1812-14. During the rebellions in Canada in 1837 and 1838 he was entrusted with the command of the 24th Regiment stationed at Carillon, L.C., where his troops took part in several engagements including those at St. Denis and St. Benoit. In 1838 he was stationed at Amherstburg, a centre of operations along the Niagara Frontier and the Windsor-Detroit area during the Navy Island incident of that year. Townshend returned to Great Britain in 1839, serving as depot commander of the 25th Regiment stationed at Templemore, Ireland, attaining the rank of general on the 31 December 1871.

The Townshend Papers are arranged in four series, chronologically within each series: correspondence of Henry Dives Townshend (pp. 1-732), correspondence of Mrs. Sidney Lee (pp. 733-830), undated correspondence (pp. 831-906), and estate papers of the Townshend family (pp. 907-96).

The correspondence of General Henry Dives Townshend which forms the bulk of the collection, relates to his commands in Canada (1836-1840) and his commands in Ireland and Great Britain (1840-1877).

Included are many references to military actions and the condition of his troops and militia in the area north of Montreal and the vicinity of Amherstburg during the critical months of the rebellions. There are also scattered references to such events as the Maine boundary dispute and its effects on

the cooperation between Canadian and United States authorities in suppressing the rebels.

The correspondence of Mrs. Sidney Lee consists of letters concerning the settlement of an unidentified estate in 1785 and correspondence of 1782-86 regarding her brother Major-General Charles Lee, a veteran of the United States Continental Army.

The undated correspondence relates chiefly to General Townshend. The estate papers include indentures, wills, and marriage settlements of the Townshend family, most of which are fair copies engrossed on parchment.

Every attempt has been made to adhere to the usages of the authors in regard to their signatures. When an addition such as the rank of the sender has been deemed of use to the researcher it has been enclosed in square brackets. Interpretations of illegible signatures are similarly enclosed.
