## WILLIAM LYON MACKENZIE

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William Lyon Mackenzie (1795-1861) was the chief organizer of the Rebellion of 1837 in Upper Canada. He fled to the United States until pardoned in 1849. From 1826 to 1831 and 1851 to 1858 he served as a member of the Legislative Assembly; after 1831 he was elected five times only to be expelled. In 1858 he retired to private life.

The collection contains correspondence to and from Mackenzie and members of his family: speeches, articles and pamphlets published by Mackenzie; and papers of the Robert Randall Estate. Robert Randall (1766-1834) came to Canada in 1798 and settled at Niagara Falls. In Canada he built a saw and flour mill, and a foundry for the manufacture of the first bar and cast iron made in Upper Canada. He acquired several lands. In 1809, he was arrested and imprisoned for debts. Many irregularities in the disposal of his properties gave him ground to fight his case in courts. His political involvement as an elected member to the Legislative Assembly of Upper Canada brought him in contact with William Lyon Mackenzie. His case was used by Mackenzie as a political issue against the "Family Compact". At his death, Mackenzie was named his executor.

The collection consists mainly of original documents but it also contains photocopies, transcripts and a microfilm reel and it is also a composite of papers acquired from various sources. The arrangement of the papers presents some obvious inconsistencies as a result of the numerous additions. Frequent overlapping between volumes occurs. Nevertheless, this arrangement was kept in order to keep the papers from various sources together especially the William Lyon Mackenzie King Collection. Finding Aid No. 911 provides a descriptive list of volume contents for the complete collection with indication of sources and location of originals if known.
