Tom Hendry was born in Winnipeg and studied at the University of Manitoba before becoming a chartered accountant. He was a co-founder, with director John Hirsch, of Theatre 77 in 1957 and of the Manitoba Theatre Centre in 1958. He was manager and producer for Rainbow Stage in Winnipeg 1959-1961. After moving to Toronto Hendry became Secretary-General of the Canadian Theatre Centre in 1964. He was literary manager at Stratford Festival 1969-1970 and was a co-founder of Toronto Free Theatre in 1971. He was co-founder of Playwrights Co-op (later Playwrights Canada) in 1971 as well and was director of the Banff Playwrights Colony 1974-1976. During the 1980's Hendry helped to establish the Toronto Arts Council and led a federal task force reporting on the role of the National Arts Centre in Ottawa. Hendry is the author of numerous plays for the stage, radio and television, including Satyricon produced at Stratford Festival in 1969 and Dr. Selavy's Magic Theatre produced off-Broadway in 1971. Other works include Fifteen Miles of Broken Glass, How Are Things With the Walking Wounded and Hogtown. For his contributions to Canadian theatre, Hendry has been awarded a Centennial Medal, Lieutenant-Governor's Medal. Queen Elizabeth's Silver Jubilee Medal, Toronto Drama Bench Award and an ACTRA award for best dramatic writer-television.
