

George Arthur Emerson Chapman fonds

Photographic Series: Eight (8) Albums (March 1900 – September 1942)

The albums contain black & white photographs documenting the activities and personnel of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Battalion, East Kent Regiment, the *Buff*s, in the South African War (1900-1902) and Britain, as well as in France during World War I. In addition, the albums include the following: extensive landscape and architectural views taken during family travel in Britain, Europe, North America, and the Middle East; photographs of Sir Sandford Fleming; and activities of the Chapman family and friends around Ottawa, Ontario.

Covering the time period from 1914 to 1917 and relating to Chapman's military service in the Great War, material objects such as letters, newspaper articles, postcards, field maps, drawings & sketches, telegrams, memorabilia, notices, etc. are found on the pages from the middle part of the seventh (7) album.

The photographs in the series are of various sizes and processing techniques. They are in chronological order with the earliest date caption of 29 March 1900 covering the time period to September 1942. Not all photographs are dated, however, all (except a few) photographs have captions.

Each of the first six albums in the series has a removable beige cloth (linen) cover with dark blue edges. An embroidered roman numerical I to VI, corresponding to a single album in the series, is located on the bottom right corner of the top and on the spine portion of the cloth cover. The cover also has 'GC' (George Chapman) embroidered in dark blue on its front side.

All albums are in good condition (for detailed notes, please see the individual album descriptions). The albums have hard grain Morocco red leather binding, except for album no. 8, which has half leather binding with corners. Silk-finished paper is used on the inside of the album covers. The exception is the use of marbled paper for albums no. 4 & 8. All albums have cloth joints and their pages, except those in album no 8, are edge-gilded.

Album 1: (March 1900 - April 1904): George Arthur Emerson Chapman

- The album has a removable beige cloth (linen) cover with dark blue edges; an embroidered roman numerical **I** is found in the bottom right corner of the top cover and on the top portion of the spine; the top cover has `GC` (George Emerson) embroidered

in dark blue; the cloth cover has a water damage stain or discolouration; the album pages are edge-gilded; the album has a hard grain Morocco red leather binding underneath the cloth cover; silk-finished paper is used on the inside of the album covers; the album has cloth joints.

- The album contains photographs documenting the activities and personnel of the 2nd (occasionally also 3rd) Battalion, the *Bufs*, East Kent Regiment, in the South African War and Britain (located in Dover), as well as views of the former places, including some in France during family travels; Chapman himself is depicted throughout the album as *Self*; all (except a few) photographs have captions; the album also includes various and interesting depictions of Kaffir people in South Africa.

- The photographs are of various sizes and processing techniques; some are numbered (likely those taken by Chapman himself); they are in chronological order with the earliest date caption of 29 March 1900 covering the time period to April 1904; not all photographs are dated.

- There are 68 pages in the album; pages are not numbered.

- There are 761 photographs (some are 2- and 3-part panoramas).

- The album is the continuation from the first Chapman album and is in very good condition.
- The album has a removable beige cloth (linen) cover with dark blue edges; an embroidered roman numerical **II** is found in the bottom right corner of the top cover and on the spine portion; the top cover has `GC` (George Chapman) embroidered in dark blue; the album pages are edge-gilded; the album has a hard grain Morocco red leather binding; silk-finished paper is used on the inside of the album covers; the album has cloth joints.
- The album contains photographs (also postcards) documenting the activities and personnel of the 2nd (occasionally also 1st) Battalion, the *Buffs*, East Kent Regiment, in Britain (Dover), as well as views of the former and its vicinity. In addition, the album contains an extensive visual travel imagery consisting of

photographs of various places in Britain, France, Switzerland, and Italy; the majority of the travel images date after the marriage of George Chapman and Ethel Fleming on 24 May 1905.

- Chapman himself is depicted throughout the album as *Self*, Ethel is captured as *EJC* (Ethel Jean Chapman); all (except a few) photographs have captions.
- The photographs are of various sizes and processing techniques; some are numbered (likely those taken by Chapman himself); they are in chronological order with the earliest date caption of April 1904 covering the time period up to November 1905; not all photographs are dated.

In addition, the album contains an extensive visual travel imagery consisting of photographs depicting Ethel & George Chapman's travels in Britain, France and Italy, as well as their third

trip to Egypt. Images of Ontario and Quebec end this album as the Chapman family moves to Canada in August 1925.

Album 8: (August 1931 - September 1942): George Arthur Emerson Chapman

- The album, the last in the series, is the continuation from the seventh Chapman album and is in very good condition.
- This album, in contrast to the first six albums, also does not have a removable beige cloth (linen) cover with dark blue edges -hence, neither roman numerical or initials `GC` (George Chapman) are found on the spine or the cover of the album; the album pages, in contrast to all previous albums, are not edge-gilded; the album binding also differs from the rest of the series: it is half leather with corners and the marble paper is used on the inside of the album covers; the album, as the whole series, has cloth joints.
- The album contains photographs that document selected activities and personal life of George Chapman and his family & friends around Ottawa, Ontario. In addition, the album includes a variety of travel images consisting of photographs taken by Chapman and depicting places in Canada, Britain, and Bermuda. Various seasonal depictions of *Appledore* -the house of the Chapman family in Rockcliffe, Ontario- are found in this album.
