John Morgan Gray was born in Toronto and educated at Lakefield College School, Upper Canada College and the University of Toronto. After a period of living abroad, 1928-1929, while freelance writing in London and playing professional hockey with the British National Hockey Team, and a teaching stint at Lakefield College School, Gray began his publishing career with the Macmillan Company of Canada Ltd. in 1930, as an educational representative. After the war, in which Gray served with the Toronto Scottish and Canadian Intelligence Corps, he took over as managing director of Macmillan's 1946-1955. In 1956 he was named president and in 1969, Chairman of the Board, retiring from this position in 1973. Gray was the author of an adventure story, The One-Eyed Trapper, the biography Lord Selkirk of Red River, and his memoirs Fun Tomorrow, as well as other works. Throughout his career Gray received a number of honorary degrees from Canadian universities and the Order of Canada in 1975.


