Ken Gass is a Canadian theatre administrator, director and playwright. In 1969 and 1970, after coming to Toronto from his native British Columbia, he worked with Canadian playwright John Herbert at the Garret Theatre. In May 1970 Gass founded his own theatre, Factory Theatre Lab, devoted to promoting the writing and production of Canadian plays. Ken Gass also organized the Festival of Underground Theatre in Toronto in 1970 and another festival, Renaissance 71, in 1971. Among the plays Gass has written are Boy Bishop, a Chalmers Award finalist in 1976, and Winter Offensive. He has directed many productions at the Garret Theatre, Theatre Passe Muraille and the Factory Theatre Lab. Ken Gass is now on the staff of University Gollege, Toronto.

Acquired in 1973, 1975 and 1978. A portion of the papers were presented by Ken Gass in 1978 and 1980.

Posters, photographs and a tape have been transferred to the appropriate divisions.

Canadian Universities Arts Festival, 1970-1973. 15 cm (vols. 1-2). The Canadian Universities Arts Festival, or Renaissance '71 was held in Toronto 5-14 February 1971. Involving work solicited from students enrolled in universities and technical colleges across Canada in the areas of fine arts, dance, music, drama, cinematography, creative writing, photography and commercial art, it was sponsored by the Students Administrative Council of the students and staff drawn from the University of Toronto, York University and Ryerson Polytechnical Institute. Ken Gass was the executive producer.

Festival of Underground Theatre (1970), 1970. 15 cm (vols. 3-4). The Festival of Underground Theatre (FUT) was a gathering of international experimental theatre companies in Toronto, 19 August - 6 September 1970. The festival included fringe activities such as parades, street theatre, park events and open workshops, as well as evening theatre performances. It was organized by the New Directors Group, including Ken Gass, Paul Thompson, Martin Kinch, Jim Garrard, Henry Tarvainen and John Palmer.

Founded in 1970, Factory Theatre Lab Toronto was one of the first Canadian theatres dedicated exclusively to Canadian works.

In 1973 it presented a festival of plays in London, England, and in the same year it opened a western branch in Calgary, Factory Theatre West, which has since folded.
