BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH OF LOUIS ROSENBERG

Louis Rosenberg, F.R.S.S., F.R. Econ. S., was born in Gonenz, Poland in 1893 and was taken to England by his parents when he was 2 years old. He was educated at the University of Leeds and upon graduation was induced to emigrate to Western Canada in 1915 by a Dominion Emigration Agent visiting the university to promote the immigration of teachers and other professionals.

In 1915, Mr. Rosenberg became principal of the Tiferes Israel School in Lipton, Saskatchewan, a community of Jewish farm colonists. From 1919 until 1940 Mr. Rosenberg was the Western Canadian Director of the Jewish Colonization Association in Winnipeg which had its headquarters in Paris, France. In 1940 he became Executive Director, Western Division of the Canadian Jewish Congress in Winnipeg and shortly after, in 1945, Mr. Rosenberg was appointed National Research Director of the Bureau of Social and Economic Research of the Congress in Montreal, a position from which he retired in June 1968 at the age of 75.

Throughout his long life Mr. Rosenberg took an active part in community affairs: as a scoutmaster in England, as chairman of the Regina Public School Board and of the Regina Public Library, and as an active participant in Jewish community organizations, in particular the Canadian Jewish Congress. A proponent of social democracy, Mr. Rosenberg was one of the founders of the C.C.F. and was one of their pamphleteers and public speakers. Perhaps most noted in this respect was Mr. Rosenberg's series of articles "Who Owns Canada" under the pseudonym "Watt Hugh McCollum". In his research and writing Mr. Rosenberg concentrated on statistics and sociology. As research director at the C.J.C. he published a series of statistical and demographic studies of the Jewish community in Canada which are generally acknowledged to be accurate and perceptive.

Originals, 1829-1975, 6 m. Microfilm, C-13,083 to C-13,098.

The papers were presented by Rosenberg in 1975.

Access to the personal papers is restricted. Please consult the National Ethnic Archives Section for further information.

Photographs transferred to the National Photography Collection, accession number 75-368.

Maps transferred to the National Map Collection, accession numbers 756-9933 and 756-25, 726. Most of these maps were used in demographic research while the remainder are related primarily to pre 1948 Israel. Many of the maps are annotated.

Forty-five volumes of the American Jewish Yearbook (1913-1966) pamphlets and periodicals were transferred to the Public Archives Library.

The Manuscript collection has been arranged into the following series:

PERSONAL PAPERS, 1910-1975. 33 cm., vols. 1-4.

Financial records, personal documents, biographical material and correspondence with friends, family and colleagues. C.C.F. and N.D.P. correspondence is included in this section.

CANADIAN JEWISH CONGRESS, 1914-1974. 29 cm., vols. 4-7.

Rosenberg's copies of interoffice memoranda and Jewish Social and Economic Research Studies memoranda arranged chronologically; as well as reports, briefs and issues of Congress Bulletin and Congress Weekly.

JEWISH COLONIZATION ASSOCIATION, 1891-1950. 155 cm., vols. 7-22.

Carbon copies of correspondence between colonists and the western Canadian office which corresponded with the J.C.A. head office in Paris, France. The Farm Colonists correspondence (vols. 7-II) is arranged alphabetically and relates primarily to the Hirsch, Saskatchewan, colony. Correspondence and subject files (vols. 12-22) relating to the various colonies in Western Canada includes annual reports, statistics and immigration cases.

HISTORY, 1829-1968. 28 cm., vols. 22-25.

Source material compiled or copied by Rosenberg relating to 19th century Jewish life in Canada (vols. 22-24) and collected documents, primarily originals, relating to significant events or individuals in eary Jewish-Canadian history.

ARTICLES, n.d., 1921-1966. 49 cm., vols. 26-28.

Short handwritten or typed articles and portions of a book (vols. 26-27), mostly undated and copies of printed articles and demographic studies prepared by Rosenberg while research director of the C.J.C. (vols. 27-28).

RESEARCH MATERIAL AND SUBJECT FILES, n.d., 1920-1974. 38 cm., vols. 28-

Biographical research cards on Jewish communities, lecture notes on cards, rough notes and sociological articles on various subjects.

DEMOGRAPHIC STUDIES, 1851-1971. 93 cm., vols. 30-34.

Material compiled by Rosenberg while research director of the C.J.C.:

A. Material in a finished form (vols. 30-32) which was embodied in research reports and publications.

B. Printed C.B.S. census material with some annotation (vol. 32).

Working papers (vols. 32-34) which form the basis of the completed version of section A. Files are listed alphabetically by main subject but usually contain numerous cross-tabulations of other variables.

SCRAPBOOKS AND NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS, n.d., 1926-1966. 145 cm., vols. 34-

Material collected by Rosenberg on various subjects, arranged alphabetically. Only the clippings in volumes 34 and 35 are dated and identified by source.

HALF TONES AND POST CARDS, n.d., 21 cm., vol. 42.

A series of cards depictng places and individuals of interest to the Jewish Community, primarily in Israel and Russia.

COMPUTER PRINTOUTS AND STATISTICAL TABLES, n.d., 1915, 1968. 50 cm., vols. 43-50.

Oversize tables of correlation of many demographic variables. computer printouts (vols. 43-46) are derived from the 1961 census while other tables are handwritten or photostats of D.B.S. and C.J.C. studies (vols. 49-50). Included in a land survey of the Lipton Colony, Saskatchewan and a printed social planning study of Montreal.

PUBLICATIONS, n.d. 21 cm., vol. 51.

Articles and publications on a variety of topics relating to Rosenberg's interests and Canadian Jewry.

NOTE CONCERNING THE MICROFILM

Only the first 35 volumes of this collection have been filmed. In the case of several volumes certain files have not been filmed, these files are noted with an asterisk (*). These contain items of a personal nature which are of little relevance to the study of the Jewish community (e.g.: personal financial records in volumes 3 and 4) or which contain chiefly handwritten notes which would be difficult or impossible to decipher or understand on film (usually these files are useful to understand Mr. Rosenberg's research methods rather than to study Canadian Jewry).

The filming of each volume is preceded by a file list for that volume and any files not filmed are noted there. Researchers are also advised to consult the Finding Aid to the Collection which is available on microfiche in many libraries. (See Canada, Public Archives, Manuscript Division, Finding Aid No. 966.)
