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WARD, Howard Hyland
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Biographical Notes

A. Brief outline of career:

Ward, Howard Hyland (1884-1974)

Born at Arkona, Lambton County, Ontario.

Moved to Stratford, Ontario with his family in the spring of 1887.

Educated at public schools and the Central Business College at Stratford.

Active in the Stratford Y.M.C.A. Participated in gymnastics, baseball, hockey, track and field.

- 1903-1909 Clerk-stenographer and later chief clerk in the office of Trainmaster, Grand Trunk Railway at Stratford, Ontario.
- 1909-1910 Private secretary to the manager of Manitoba Branch of Massey-Harris Co. at Winnipeg, Manitoba.
- 1911-1923 Chief clerk and assistant in the office of the Chief Operating Officer of the Board of Railway Commissioners for Canada, in Ottawa.
- 1923-1934 Deputy Minister of Labour for Canada. Retired due to ill health 1 January, 1934.
- In 1925 Ward served as Chief Delegate to the International Labour Conference at Geneva, Switzerland.

B. Chief interests

1. Y.M.C.A. - Ward was quite active in the Y.M.C.A., first as an athlete at Stratford and later as a member of the Leaders corps at Winnipeg and Ottawa. In 1923 he was elected president of Y.M.C.A. National Leaders' Corps.

Also, during the period 1922-23, Ward aided in the establishment of the Christie Lake Boys Club, and worked at the Golden Lake Boys Camp, both in Ontario.

2. Ottawa Joint Church Committee for Western Relief 1936-37.

Ward acted as chairman for this committee which was organized to assist in the sending of railway car loads of food-stuffs to the drought stricken areas of Western Canada, particularly Saskatchewan.

3. Curling

Ottawa Curling Club 1935-1974.

Ward joined the Ottawa Curling Club in 1935 and remained active as both a player and club official (in various capacities) for the rest of his life.

- Secretary of Club Match Committee 1937-1940.
- Chairman of Club Trophies Committee 1950-51.
- Member of Board of Directors 1950-1959.
- Appointed Ottawa Club Historian 1951

As historian he was responsible for the production of the club's Centenary History 1851-1951.

Also as historian he compiled and maintained club match records.

- Assistant manager of Central Canada Bonspiel (later called City of Ottawa Bonspiel) from 1940 to 1952.

He was responsible for the trophies and the recording of final results.

Canadian Branch, Royal Caledonian Curling Club.

The Ottawa Club has been a member of the Canadian Branch since the Branch's founding in 1852. As a member of the Ottawa Club Ward soon became involved in Branch activities.

- Representative of Ottawa Club to Annual Meetings of the Branch from 1941-1955.

- Member of executive committee of Branch for Ottawa Club 1950-1956.
- Secretary of Canadian Branch War Blanket Fund, 1942-43.
- Member of Branch Rules Revision Committee 1954-55.
- Appointed Branch Historian in 1954.

In his capacity as historian he not only compiled the records of the various Branch trophy competitions, but also aided in the production of Branch Annual Reports.

He also compiled histories of various Branch trophies, and researched the history of the Branch itself, various member clubs and the game of curling in Canada.

2. Curling Association of Ottawa: file 51; volume 4. (1 cm)
- Ward was instrumental in the formation of this association in 1940-41 and served as its secretary and later chairman during 1942-1944.

3. Ottawa Valley Curling Association: files 52-54; volume 4. (6 cm)
- This association superceded the Curling Association of Ottawa in 1959.

- Ward was appointed historian of this body in 1967.
- file 52 - contains a compilation of winners of the various trophies of the association and its predecessors, 1918-1974.
- 2 cm (lists, notes, newspaper clippings, correspondence; c. 1955-1973)
- files 53-54 - Minutes and financial statements of the association as well as information on the more recent bonspiels.
- 4 cm (minutes, financial statements, correspondence, notes, newspaper clippings, c. 1946-1974)
4. Central Canada Bonspiel and City of Ottawa Bonspiel: files 55-76; volumes 4-6. (26 cm)

The bonspiel is supposed to have begun about 1875. In 1956 the name was changed from the Central Canada, to the City of Ottawa Bonspiel.

Ward has managed to compile lists of the bonspiel winners (with gaps) from 1897 (file 55).

He also compiled files documenting the bonspiel each year from 1943-1970. (files 56-76)

An interesting feature of the early files 1943-1951 is that Ward has preserved the actual draw-sheets which established the schedule of games for each bonspiel.

B. Curling - Provincial

I. Ontario, Quebec Bonspiels: files 77-109; volumes 6-7. (27 cm)

Note: The three main bodies responsible for curling in Ontario and Quebec are the Province of Quebec Curling Association the Ontario Curling Association and the Canadian Branch, Royal Caledonian Curling Club.

The jurisdiction of the Quebec association is limited by the boundaries of the province, and the same is the case with the Ontario Association. However, the Canadian Branch controls many clubs in Quebec, and eastern Ontario.

The reason for this overlap in jurisdictions is because the Canadian Branch was founded in 1852 as the sole governing body for curling in the old province of Canada. However in the decades after Confederation, for various reasons, autonomous associations were founded in both Ontario and Quebec, but the Canadian Branch has remained and still controls many clubs in both provinces.

files 77- 109 - these files chronologically arranged by year, 1942-1973 contain information on bonspiels in Ontario and Quebec that were not part of the Canadian Branch schedule. The early files only document miscellaneous bonspiels, but beginning in the early 1950's the files try to cover the main provincial competitions held by the Ontario Curling Association and the Province of Quebec Curling Association.

The bulk of the material is newspaper clippings.

27 cm (newspaper clippings, notes, correspondence, lists, circulars; 1942-1973.)

2. Canadian Branch, Royal Caledonian Curling Club: files 110-223; volumes 7-14. (135 cm)

In as much as Ward's curling club, the Ottawa Curling Club, was a member of the Canadian Branch, he quickly became involved in Branch activities.

Ward exhibited such an interest in the administrative side of curling, particularly serving as a representative of the Ottawa club, and was so engrossed in researching curling history, that he was regularly called upon to aid Branch officials.

In 1954 he was appointed Branch historian.

Just as the Ottawa Club files represent Ward's research as Ottawa Club historian, so these files represent his work as Branch historian.

* In almost all cases the original memoranda written by Ward were forwarded to his superiors at Branch headquarters. These files then, represent his personal copies. Ward's files on the Branch tend to complement and expand the archives' own collection of Branch records in MG 28 I 229.

files 110-125	contain Branch minutes and annual reports (heavily annotated by Ward) covering the period 1952-1973. One file of financial data dates from 1939.
29 cm	(booklets, notes, lists; 1939-1973)
files 126-127	document the "Blanket Fund", one of the Branch's patriotic endeavours during World War Two. Ward was secretary of this fund and preserved his files.
3 cm	(correspondence, notes, lists financial statements; 1942-1945)
files 128-153	contain information compiled by Ward concerning the history of the Branch, it's past presidents and its various trophies.
26 cm	(lists, booklets, notes, typescripts correspondence, memoranda; 1888-1974)
files 154-191	these files contain historical information compiled by Ward on various curling clubs in Ontario and Quebec. Most of these clubs are members of the Canadian Branch.
9 cm	(correspondence, notes, newspaper clippings, booklets; 1909, 1949-1974)
files 192-223	yearly files, compiled by Ward, documenting the results of the competitions for the various trophies of the Canadian Branch from 1942-43 to 1973-74. The data compiled by Ward from these files was forwarded to Branch headquarters each year for inclusion in the annual reports

Here again, as in some of the Central Canada Bospiel files (55-76), Ward has preserved some of the actual draw sheets for many bonspiels of the 1940's and 1950's.

C. Curling - National, International: files 224-338; volumes 14-16. (36 cm)

file 224 - contains an accordion binder of lists, notes, newspaper clippings and correspondence, briefly outlining the relevant facts about the Canadian Championships and the major international championships. Lists of winners are included. Outside dates of material c. 1948-1973.

files 225-338 files arranged chronologically by year and containing information on the various Canadian Curling Championships, 1946, 1948-1974. Also files on United States Championships 1956, 1965 1967-70, World Championships, 1959-1974, and Olympic curling, 1924, 1932.

* Note: Canadian Curling Championships for men have been held annually since 1927. The World Championship began in 1959.

These files are composed almost entirely of newspaper clippings.

D. Curling - General: files 339-428; volumes 16-17. (11 cm)

1. Subject files 339-367, Volume 16.

- files concerning various aspects of the game of curling - eg: artificial ice, types of curling stones, terminology.

Also files of correspondence and notes concerning the broad history and origins of the game. (file 349 contains material relating to the publication Curling in Ontario 1846-1946. Ward wrote a chapter for this book)

Included in this series are files concerning the exchange visits of Canadian and foreign curling teams. Ward has some interesting correspondence and notes concerning the visits of the Scottish teams in 1903 and 1938, as well as the Canadian tour of Scotland in 1909 (files 354-359)

2. Biographical files 368-409; volume 17. (10 cm)

Files containing information on famous regional and provincial curlers. In some cases there are actual letters from the individuals, in other cases Ward has preserved newspaper clippings and composed notes and memoranda concerning their curling careers.
