The Montreal Soldiers' Wives' League was formed in 1899 by Lady Hutton, wife of the Imperial Officer in Command of Canadian Militia, to assist the relatives of men who had volunteered for service in the Boer War. It was the first time that Canadian Military Units had gone overseas to war, and nothing was being done for the families they had left behind. The stated aim of the Founder was "to bring their wives and other relatives in closer touch and sympathy in time of trouble and distress".

Between the end of the Boer War and the beginning of World War I the League was almost inactive, but in September, 1914 its work was resumed. It was officially recognized as a Charitable Organization by Order-in-Council #1720 of the Province of Quebec, dated November 29th, 1917. After the War another period of inactivity followed until 1939. Then Brigadier L. Armstrong of M.D. 4 requested that the Montreal Soldiers' Wives' League be reorganized to coordinate the work of all the Women's Auxiliaries in the Navy, Army and Air Force units in the Montreal area. A number of committees were active during the war years, of these only the Hospital Visiting Committee was retained after the war ended, and this continues to function on behalf of the veterans of two World Wars.

The Montreal Soldiers' Wives'- League has no revenue. The only money-making projects it undertakes are specifically designated for the Hospital Visiting-Committee, and all money is spent on the veterans in the Ste. Anne de Bellevue Military Hospital and the Queen Mary Veterans' Hospital. Members of the League visit these hospitals once a month making approximately 9,000 individual visits to the patients each year, distributing cigarettes, candy and other small comforts at a cost of approximately \$1,900. This money is raised by one fund-raising event each year and by charitable donations.
