JENKINS, Frank Maurice Stinson (1859-1930) and Annie (1866-1952). Musicians.

Frank M.S. Jenkins founded, and conducted, the Ottawa Amateur Orchestral Society in 1894, as well as the Ottawa Schubert Club, which later became the Ottawa Choral Society. He was organist at several Ottawa churches before beginning a career as a public servant, after which he became less involved in the music affairs of Ottawa.

Annie Lampman Jenkins was the sister of the poet Archibald Lampman. After studying piano in Leipzig, 1887-1889, with Martin Krause, she taught voice and piano in Ottawa, first at the Krause School of Pianoforte Playing and Singing and later at the Canadian Conservatory. She was organist and choirmaster at St. George's Church, Ottawa, for more than 20 years. She was a charter member of the Ottawa Morning Music Club and the founder, 1921, of the Palestrina Choir.

F.M.S. Jenkins and Annie Lampman married in 1892. They had 3 daughters: Dorothy, Ruth, and Marjorie. Dorothy became a musician, as well, and as a contralto was often accompanied by her mother at song recitals. She was also a championship figure skater. She married H.O. McCurry of the National Gallery. Ruth became a missionary with the Anglican Mission in China, 1920-1927. She married H.G. Watts, also a missionary.

Presented between 1974 and 1983 by Margot Johnston, Kingsmere, Quebec. Photographs have been transferred to the National Photography Collection and one map to the National Map Collection in the Public Archives.
