MONTREAL SUOMI SOCIETY, Inc. (est. 1927)

Originals, n.d., 1927-1977. 1.75 m. Finding Aid No. 1139.

The great wave of post-World War I immigration from Finland into Canada brought thousands of immigrants to Montreal. Because they had come still fresh with bitter memories of Finland's tragic Civil War of 1918, these newcomers tended to perpetuate the same rift between the "White" and "Red" Finns here that had so deeply divided their old homeland. Consequently, the right-wing element in Montreal's Finnish community chose to establish its own institutions such as the Montrealin Suomalainen Seura (Finnish Society of Montreal). Indeed, this society was founded on 8 December 1927 with the specific purpose of providing the local "White" Finns with a wide range of social and cultural activities and otherwise ministering to their needs.

In 1932, the Society changed its name to Montrealin Suomi-Seura. When it was incorporated on 19 October 1933, it adopted the English translation of that name -- Montreal Suomi Society, Inc. -- as its legal title. From the early 1930's to the early 1960's, the Society also served as a branch of the Central Organization of the Loyal Finns in Canada. As well, its facilities were used as the headquarters of that organization from 1935 to 1957.

The origins of the Central Organization of Loyal Finns in Canada can be traced to 22 February 1931, at which time the representatives of the various Finnish National Societies in Canada formed the Kanadan Kansallismielisten Suomalaisten Keskusjarjesto to act as a co-ordinating headquarters and umbrella-organization for its member societies. The Finnish name of this organization was amended to Kanadan Kansallismielisten Suomalaisten Keskusliitto shortly thereafter. The English version of its name remained the same and, therefore, this organization was incorporated as the Central Organization of Loyal Finns in Canada in 1938. In 1955, the Organization's Finnish name was changed to Lojaalien Suomalaisten Keskusliitto. The fortunes of the Organization began to decline in 1962 and most of its branches, including Montreal's, no longer operate as its affiliates or have ceased operations altogether.

The records of the Montreal Suomi Society have been divided into two principal series to reflect the separation between the records which were created as the result of its operations as an independent local society and those which resulted from its activities as a branch and one-time headquarters of the Central Organization of the Loyal Finns in Canada. Hence, these records have been arranged into the two series as follows:

## INTRODUCTION

The significance of the Montreal Suomi Society, Inc.--and, therefore, of its records--arises from the twofold role it has played in the life of the Finnish Canadian community. On the one hand, it was active as a local society for Montrealers of Finnish origin while, on the other, it was also a leading branch of the Central Organization of the Loyal Finns in Canada. In the first instance, the Society occupied a central position in the establishment and maintenance of a right-wing movement among the Finns in Montreal, the principal port of entry for Finnish immigrants into Canada. In the second, the Society was a major participant in developing a national movement to the right by an important part of the Finnish community across Canada.

### A. MONTREAL SUOMI SOCIETY, Inc.

The wave of post-World War I immigration to Canada from Finland landed thousands of Finnish immigrants in Montreal. The tragic Finnish Civil War of 1918 between the White and Red Guards had deeply divided the nation into two camps, a rift which was perpetuated by the Finnish immigrants. The right-wing element of the community in Montreal soon established St. Michael's Finnish Evangelical Lutheran Congregation (Easter, 1927) and the Finnish Immigrant Home (September, 1927),<sup>1</sup> and as well, on 8 December 1927, founded the Montrealign Suomalainen Seura (Finnish Society of Montreal). In 1932, the latter's name was changed to Montrealign Suomi-Seura. On 19 October 1933, it was incorporated as the Montreal Suomi Society (being the English version of this last name change).

While the announced purpose of the Montreal Suomi Society was to provide aid and social activities for the local Finnish community in general, the Society's romantic-nationalist tendencies soon became evident its house organ, *Torvi* (The Horn). If the more moderate Finns supported its views, the Society was quickly condemned by the extreme right as well as the left. So, the Society initially experienced

a number of organizational difficulties which included the temporary splitting off of a rival nationalist group.<sup>2</sup> The Society, thus, was only able to develop its programme fully in the 1930.s.<sup>3</sup>

Among its activities and services, the Society maintained a library, a sickness fund, a gymnastics and sports society, an orchestra, a mixed choir, a sewing circle, a theatre group and summer camp. The Society also celebrated Finland's national holidays such as Independence Day and Kalevala Day and even observed special *Heimopäivät* or "clan holidays". It also became an active branch of the Central Organization of Loyal Finns in Canada. The Russo-Finnish Winter War of 1939-1940 led the Society to direct all its efforts towards aiding the old homeland, a cause which the membership was to support for many years afterwards.<sup>4</sup> On 19 November 1977, the Society celebrated its 50th anniversary of active involvement in the life of the community.

The Society was first located in the Finnish Immigrant Home, then on Mountain Street, followed by its renting of facilities at 2190 Dorchester Street West, and on 1 May 1932, at 1226 St. Catherine Street West. (From 1935, the headquarters of the Central Organization of Loyal Finns, Inc. was located here also.) In 1951, the Society had to move to smaller premises at 1173 Drummond Street and then, in the spring of 1953, to 1252 Stanley St.

At times it also accommodated the Montreal association of the "White" Finnish Civil War Veterans.<sup>5</sup> In 1961, the Society's premises were gutted by fire, a disaster which was to hamper its operations until September 1966 when it found new quarters on St. Lawrence Boulevard. By 1970, it had become evident that the dwindling Finnish population in Montreal was unable to maintain the same level of financial support for the Society as in the preceding decades. So, the archives and the library were brought to St. Michael's Finnish Evangelical Lutheran Church and the summer camp at L'Epiphanie was sold. Since that time the Society has operated without a place of its own. In 1976, the records of the Montreal Suomi Society were transferred from the Church to the Public Archives with the exception of the Society's minute books. Four minute books of the Society were subsequently donated in 1982 (see Vol. 11). One photograph has been since transferred to the National Photography Collection.

#### B. CENTRAL ORGANIZATION OF LOYAL FINNS IN CANADA, INC.

On 22 February 1931, the representatives of the various Finnish National Societies in Canada formed the Kanadan Kansallismielisten Suomalaisten Keskusjärjestö (literally, the Central Organization of Canada's Nationalistically [or Patriotically]-minded Finns) to act as a coordinating headquarters and as an umbrella organization on behalf of its members. This name was soon changed to Kanadan Kansallismielisten Suomalaisten Keskusliitto by dropping *järjestö* or "organization" in favour of *liitto* or "league" inasmuch as the former term had been too closely associated with the Finnish Canadian "communists" (i.e. Canadian Suomalainen *Järjestö* or Finnish Organization of Canada). No such distinction was made in the official English name, so it

has always been the Central Organization of Loyal Finns in Canada (C.O.L.F.C.).<sup>6</sup>

In 1935, the office of the C.O.L.F.C. was moved from Port Arthur to Montreal, which was designated as its permanent headquarters when the C.O.L.F.C. was incorporated in 1938. The office was kept in Montreal until 1957 when it was moved with most of its records to Sudbury. There the archives of the C.O.L.F.C. were largely lost in a fire, except for those records which had not been sent to Sudbury. Those not transferred there, plus the Montreal Branch records proper, constitute the present holdings of the C.O.L.F.C. in the *Montreal Suomi Society* Collection.

In 1955, the Kanadan Kansallismielisten Suomalaisten Keskusliitto changed its name to Lojailien Suomalaisten Keskusliitto (literally to the Central Organization of Loyal Finns). The activities of the C.O.L.F.C. have been on a decline since 1962.<sup>7</sup> Most of the branches, including Montreal's, have ceased their operations in subsequent years.
