Born in Norway, Henry A. Larsen went to sea at the age of 15. He made one trip to the Canadian Arctic, wintering there, 1924-1925. In 1928 he joined the R.C.M.P. and was sent on the first voyage of the schooner ST. ROCH on Arctic patrol that year. During the voyage he became master of the ship. He was with the ST. ROCH until 1949, making many trips to the Arctic and crossing the northwest passage in both directions, 1940-1944. In 1949 Larsen became commander of G Division of the R.C.M.P. which controlled police work in all northern Ontario. He retired in 1961.

HENRY LARSEN - DATES

- 1899 Born near Oslo Fiord, Norway.
- 1914-19 Merchant seaman on sailing ships.
- 1920 Graduated from Norwegian State Navigation School, Oslo.
- Navigator on Christian Klengenberg's MAID OF ORLEANS bound for the Arctic (18 months).
- 1927 Became a Canadian citizen.
- 1928 Enlisted in the R.C.M.P. Served as Seaman, First Mate and then Captain of the ST. ROCH.

 Left Vancouver for Arctic patrol.
- 1929 Promoted to Corporal. Returned to Vancouver.
- 1930-34 Arctic Patrol
- 1935 Married Mary Hargreaves, February 7.
 Left on Arctic patrol in June
- 1937 Returned to Vancouver
- 1938 Left on Arctic patrol.
- 1940 Canadian Police College, Ottawa.
- 1940-42 ST. ROCH became the first ship to sail the Northwest Passage from West to East.
- ST. ROCH returned to Vancouver through the Northwest Passage in 86 days.

 Larsen received Patron's Medal of the Royal Geographic Society.

 Visited Director J. Edgar Hoover of the F.B.I.

 Promoted to Inspector.
- 1945-46 Arctic Patrol.
- 1947-48 ST. ROCH's last Arctic patrol.
- 1949-61 Commanding Officer "G" Division, H.Q., Ottawa.
- 1953 Promoted to Superintendent
- 1957 Canadian representative at Sverdrup ceremony in Norway.
- 1960 Received Royal Canadian Geographical Society's Massey Medal.
- 1961 Retirement.
- 1964 Henry Larsen died 29 October in Vancouver.
