The series is a composite of several sub-series: petitions for pensions, pardons, appointments and other benefits (largely undated), ca. 1792-1841; registers of petitions received, 1830-1841; addresses of Loyalty to Sir Charles Poulett Thomson, 1839-1840, and replies to the circular on the Union of Upper and Lower Canada, 1839-1840; and Speeches and Messages to the Legislature with Addresses from it, 1796-1840. The arrangement and origin of the series is now obscure.

Related documents can be found in the Submissions to the Executive Council (RG 1, E 3), in the Upper Canada Sundries (RG 5, A 1), in the correspondence of the Lieutenant Governor and his secretaries (RG 7, G 14, G 16 and G 18), and in the Records of Parliament (RG 14, B 1 and B 2). Properly speaking, the various Addresses, Speeches and Messages exchanged by the Lieutenant Governor and the Legislature (volumes 18-28) ought to be transferred to RG 14; the feasibility of such a transfer remains under investigation.

The **arrangement** of the documents within the sub-series is basically chronological, but in several cases the page numbers were applied to the contents of a volume in reverse order. The Shelf List which follows this inventory entry provides an over-view of the pagination, but researchers should consult the Finding Aid for exact page references. Volumes 13-18 (pages 2023-2598), identified as astray from the Provincial Secretary's Numbered Correspondence Files, were reintegrated into RG 5, C 1 in December 1981. One reply to the circular on Union was transferred from RG 5, B 42 to volume 14 of this series in December 1981.

Finding Aid 842, completed in 1981, provides a descriptive list of the documents within the various sub-series and explanatory notes on their arrangement, as well as notes on the material transferred from volumes 13-18 to RG 5, C 1.

NOTES ON THE SERIES AND SUB-SERIES

The petitions and addresses described within RG 5, B 3 from several sub-series, the origin of which is somewhat obscure. Many of the petitions are undated, but the majority of the addresses bear at least partial dates. A significant proportion of the final series is made up of contemporary copies and duplicates, with draft replies. These factors and others have complicated the efforts to provide a finding aid. Much of the work on Parts I through IV was done by Penny MacLaren in the early 1970s and reviewed by Thérèse Lirette in 1980; the description of Part V was prepared by Ronald Kuhnle in 1981.

The documents were paginated before their order was verified, and some pages were not numbered. Letter designations were added to pages previously not numbered (hence 3467, 3467A, 3467B, 3468). This listing attempts to present the documents in a chronological sequence within the sub-series, regardless of page sequence. Some of the addresses listed in Part II are found scattered in volumes 10-11 as well as grouped in volumes 12-14.

The arrangement of the sub-series within RG 5, B3 is far from satisfactory. However, in view of the pagination of the items and the microfilming of two related series (RG 5, A 1 and RG 1, E 3), it was not feasible to consider a major reorganization and reintegration of these documents--with the exception of the files obviously taken from RG 5, C 1. The clues which might have indicated the original order of the documents have long since disappeared and we can only speculate as to which officer(s) filed and preserved the documentation.

NOTES ON THE SERIES AND SUB-SERIES (cont'd)

PART I Petitions to the Lieutenant Governor (volumes 6-12)

Limited efforts to date the petitions have been made; related material may be found in the Upper Canada Sundries (RG 5, A 1, as described in the calendar, Finding Aid 881) and the Submissions to the Executive Council on State Matters (Rg 1, E 3, listed in Finding Aid 901 and indexed in the General Index). Other petitions are to be found in RG 1, E 16. The petitions can be roughly dated by the watermarks in the paper and by the term of the Lieutenant Governor to whom they are addressed. The arrangement is roughly alphabetical by the name of the petitioner (or of the town from which a group petition came) within the administration of each Lieutenant Governor.

The subjects of the petitions include local administration, requests for pensions or pardons, and expressions of loyalty occasioned by a visit from or the departures and arrivals of the Lieutenant Governors.

PART II Loyal Addresses to Sir Charles Poulett Thomson, presented during his tour of 1839-1840, and replies to the circular letter of 24 October 1839 regarding the Union of Upper and Lower Canada (volumes 10-14)

Many of the addresses include long rolls of names; this is generally indicated by the word 'roll' following the page number, to avoid giving a mistaken idea of their length. The circular of 24 October 1839 can be consulted in RG 7, G 16C, vol. 54, p. 226. That copy is found in the Civil Secretary's letterbook, which contains other correspondence relative to the circular (see also, for example, pages 295, 301, 307 and 316).

The reply of Henry Ruttan, Sheriff of the Newcastle District, was moved from RG 5, B42 to B 3, volume 14 in December 1981. The item was identified thanks to the efforts of Carol Wilton-Siegel in

1980. It retains an earlier page numbering sequence.

The possibility that further replies to the circular may be located in the Upper Canada Sundries has not been investigated. There are some Addresses to be found in RG 7, G18, vol. 9.

PART III Loyal Addresses to Lord Elgin regarding the Rebellion Losses Bill and the Montreal riots of 1849 (volumes 13-14)

The addresses all proved to have been endorsed by the Provincial Secretary and numbered as part of his Numbered Correspondence Files (see RG 5, C1). The documents therefore were reintegrated into that series in December 1981.

PART IV Petitions to Sir Edmund Walker Head regarding prohibition and temperance, 1856 (volumes 16-18)

The petitions were originally all filed as No. 251 of 1856 in the Provincial Secretary's Numbered Correspondence Files (RG 5, C1) and in December 1981 were accordingly replaced in that series. A rough list of the petitions transferred is included at the beginning of the file, for ease of reference.

PART V Speeches and Messages from the Lieutenant Governor to the Legislature and Addresses from both Houses, 1799-1840 (volumes 18-28)

The Messages and Addresses are numbered in a most unsatisfactory manner; the listing attempts to present them in chronological order, with the exception of the undated material in volume 28.

Many of the Replies to Addresses are in draft format and undated; some of the Addresses are undated. Associated material may be found in RG 14, series B 1 and B 2. The Messages, Addresses and Replies will be found printed in the Journals of both Houses. The level of description is summary, and an effort has been made to use a number of standard terms to describe the documents. Much of the material follows traditional forms and some archaic terms are used in the documents, the subject of the communication is not always readily apparent when it is seen in isolation from related items.
