The Reverend James Wilson, M.A. (1828-1905) was a native of Aberdeenshire, Scotland, and was probably educated at Marischal College, Aberdeen. He was ordained to the ministry of the Presbyterian Church in 1856 and served for three years as a missionary under the Colonial Committee in Nova Scotia. After his return to Scotland, he was for a short while minister of Maxwelton Chapel in Dumfries. He emigrated to Canada and officiated briefly in St. Joseph Street, Montreal. In June 1862 he succeeded the Reverend Thomas Fraser as minister of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Lanark, Ontario. He was pastor there for thirty years and afterwards pastor emeritus. After his retirement in 1892, his grateful congregation allowed him to buy the manse for \$450. He died on 30 August 1905 at the age of 77. In 1908, his widow sold the manse to the Roman Catholic parish of the Sacred Heart.

All the material in this unit came either directly or indirectly from the daughter of the Rev. James Wilson, Miss Hilda Wilson (1903-1978) of Ottawa. The greater part of the material was acquired by the Public Archives of Canada in 1972. It was originally catalogued as the Wilson Family Papers (MG 24, I 162) and various photographs, postcards and books acquired at the same time were transferred to the Photography, Picture and Library Divisions of the Archives. In 1986 a few miscellaneous items which the National Museum of Man had received from Hilda Wilson were transferred to the Public Archives of Canada. Once again, some items were transferred to the Photography, Picture and Library Divisions but five additions to the collection were retained in the Manuscript Division. At that time the unit was retitled and catalogued in its present location.

Finding Aid No. 866 provides a descriptive list of the documents.

The collection includes four sermons (one in Latin) and business papers, such as land deeds and stock certificates, relating mainly to the affairs of the Rev. James Wilson (1828-1905). Of particular interest are the records of Wilson's investments in land in Manitoba, which include a letter of advice from J.B. McLaren, 3 February 1882. Other material which relates to St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Lanark, Ontario, includes land documents, subscription lists for special church expenses, a printed statement of accounts for 1891, and kirk session minutes, 1871, regarding the disciplining of Janet Gemmill for false accusations that Daniel and Elizabeth McCurdy had milked cows not their own. Some newspaper clippings relating to the Rev. James Wilson, to St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, and to the early history of Lanark, etc., are also included.
